COMPUTER SCIENCE FAMILY NIGHT

East Hanover Public Schools

Families, students, and volunteers came together on April 24th at East Hanover Township Public Schools for a memorable evening of exploration, learning, and community connection during the 3rd Annual K-5 Computer Science and STEM Family Night. Organized by the East Hanover Board of Education and coordinated by Ms. Dana Aagaard, Supervisor of Curriculum and Instruction; Ms. Melissa Falcone, Principal of Central School; and Mr. Matthew Tuorto, Principal of Frank J. Smith Elementary School, this year's event welcomed a record-breaking turnout.

First launched three years ago as an initiative by Jismi Mathew, a student in the Computer & Information Sciences Academy at Morris County School of Technology (MCST), the Family Night has grown into a signature event for the district. The event has always been held at Central School and, during its first year, was open only to Central School students in grades 3 through 5. Beginning in the second year, the event expanded to include all students from kindergarten through fifth grade, welcoming both Frank J. Smith Elementary School and Central School students. With expanded activities and growing participation each year, the Family Night continues to offer exciting hands-on STEM and computer science experiences for young learners across the district.

Due to the increased number of activities and attendees, the event this year was held across both the auditorium and cafeteria at Central School. Families rotated through multiple hands-on computer science and STEM stations, where 20 high school volunteers helped guide students through coding challenges, engineering projects, and creative science experiments. To add to the excitement, raffle prizes were awarded to students from each grade level.

"It's hard to believe we're celebrating this event for the third year," said Jismi Mathew. "What started as a simple email to Principal Falcone has grown into an annual tradition for our schools and community. It's amazing to see how much it has expanded and how many students and families it now brings together."



Celebrating four decades of "bringing music to people and people to music," the renowned Hanover Wind Symphony presented a gala 40th Anniversary Concert on Sunday, April 27, at Morristown High School. Roughly half the members of the all-volunteer HWS are music educators; the other half range from engineers and physical therapists, to IT business analysts, speech/language pathologists, even probation officers. All bring their musical talents, plus their other life experiences, to the music they love to play. The group was founded in 1985 by Peter Boor, former band director at Whippany Park High School, who saw the need for an adult ensemble which could perform music of the highest caliber. STUDENTS ACCEPT NASA CODING CHALLENGE

Students from the Academy for Computer & multiday culminating event at Johnson. Information Sciences, located at the Morris County School of Technology in Denville, within the Morris County Vocational School District (MCVSD), embarked on a Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) journey this school year by participating in NASA's App Development Challenge (ADC). The ADC, one of eight Artemis Student Challenges, is a coding challenge presenting students with technical problems seeking their contributions to deep space exploration missions.

The ADC is a part of the NASA Office of STEM Engagement Next Gen STEM Project and is led out of Johnson Space Center in Houston. This year's challenge asked student teams to research and design a computer application to visualize Artemis II, the first crewed mission on NASA's path to establishing a long-term presence at the Moon for science and exploration through Artemis. The challenge is created in collaboration with NASA's Space Communication and Navigation (SCaN) team to support upcoming mission planning and training activities.

SCaN serves as the program office for all of Proceeds from this event fund the East NASA's space communications activities, presently enabling the success of more than 100 NASA and non-NASA missions. SCaN manages the Near Space Network (NSN) and the Deep Space Network (DSN), ensuring the availability and allocation of the radiofrequency spectrum for all NASA programs. Additionally, SCaN supports the research and development of cutting-edge space communications technologies, such as optical and quantum communications, and is responsible for developing an integrated space communications and navigation architecture to support science and human exploration programs through 2040.

> Throughout the 10-week challenge, which occurred Oct. 2-Dec. 11, 2024, students had the opportunity to engage with NASA coders and engineers through four live virtual events and weekly office hours. NASA scientists and engineers reviewed student video submissions and interviewed selected teams. Following interviews, top teams will be selected for a














RUNNING CLUB WELCOMES ALL FOR SATURDAY RUNS




