EMILY LITZ RECOGNIZED BY STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION

Scotch Plains-Fanwood Public Schools

Emily Litz, a fifth-grade teacher at Nettingham Middle School, continues to bring pride to Scotch Plains-Fanwood Public Schools. On May 7, she was formally recognized by the New Jersey State Board of Education (NJSBE) for winning the Milken Educator Award, often referred to as the 'Oscar's of Teaching'.

"We recognize you. We value you and we thank you," said NJSBE Division of Teaching and Learning Services Assistant Commissioner Dr. Jorden Schiff.

Other NJSBE members also spoke about how Litz is a dedicated teacher who worked hard to earn this recognition and how she is a "bright light" in the teaching profession.

The Milken Family Foundation honors 45 teachers nationwide every year, and in 2024 Litz was the sole winner in New Jersey. Recipients of the award receive a \$25,000 cash prize and have access to mentorship and networking opportunities through the Milken Family Foundation.

"Mrs. Litz continues to make Scotch Plains-Fanwood Public Schools proud," said Superintendent Dr. Joan Mast. "She continues to lead not only our students, but the teachers around her, to make our schools the best they can possibly be."

Technical Schools are making a meaningful mark on their community through their growing involvement with GlamourGals—a nonprofit dedicated to ending senior isolation through teenled makeovers and intergenerational connection.

Since launching their chapter, these students have brightened the days of local seniors through complimentary manicures, heartfelt conversations, and simple moments of shared joy.

Their very first event laid the foundation for something much bigger: a movement of compassion and connection. For Ivy L., now attending her second GlamourGals visit, the experience has been deeply personal. "We connected over our childhood memories of painting our nails—she used to do her own all the time, and I talked about how my mom would paint pictures and designs on mine," Ivy recalled. 'Today's visit was another beautiful, memorable experience. I already can't wait for the next one."

For fellow volunteer Gayatri S., each visit is a Students at Union County Vocational reminder of the deeper mission behind the glitter and polish. "When I think about why we do this, I'm reminded that GlamourGals exists to fight senior isolation," she said. "Hearing her story helped me realize how much joy and comfort our presence brings. MEMORIAL DAY: A TIME FOR REFLECTION AND ACTION

Every Memorial Day, millions of Americans attend parades, fire up their grills, and host large backyard BBQs for friends and family. Each week, the NJVN provides veterans with food, clothing, housing assistance, VA benefits information, and mental health support. By partnering with numerous other groups and organizations, we can offer our uniformed heroes a better way of life.



SEA SCOUT OPEN HOUSE – JUNE 21

Patriots' Path Council will host their annual open house at the Carteret Marina, located in the Carteret Waterfront Park, 200 Middlesex Avenue, Carteret, NJ, on Saturday, June 21, 2025, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

The open house will include tours of our primary training vessel, the Sea Dart II, an introduction to the Sea Scout program, and nautical activities. Our members are from across Northern New Jersey; historically from as far as Warren, Sussex, and Ocean counties.

The Sea Scouting program is open to male and female youth ages 14 to 21. The crews operate a fleet of vessels that include the Sea Dart II, sailboats, powerboats, and paddle craft out of the Liberty Nautical Education Center (libertynautical.org) on the Rahway River in Linden, NJ. Aboard the vessels, young men and women learn nautical skills, including navigation and engine room maintenance, while visiting

Do you have bikes or sewing machines needlessly taking up room in your home or garage? Give them a new home by bringing them to Faith Lutheran Church's bike and sewing machine collection for Pedals for Progress (P4P) and Sewing Peace on Saturday, June 7th from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

Adult and children's bicycles in rideable or repairable condition will be shipped overseas by P4P and distributed to those who rely on them for transportation to jobs, markets, medical care, and schools. Donations of working sewing machines also provide income opportunities for those living in developing countries.

If you are unable to drop by on June 7th, you may still leave your bicycle(s) in Faith Lutheran's lower lot next to the utility shed. If you are donating a sewing machine, please leave it underneath the sheltered alcove by the red doors at the bottom of the parking lot. Faith will make sure these items get to P4P for this collection or will hold them until the next one. Please note that "bikes for parts" or disassembled bicycles will not be accepted.

On average, it costs \$52 to collect, process, and ship each bicycle. A donation toward shipping costs is necessary for P4P's continued success and \$20 is suggested per bike and sewing machine. All monetary donations (cash or check) and material donations are fully deductible, and a receipt will be provided on site on June 7th. Donations can also be made directly via p4p.org.

To date, Pedals for Progress has shipped over 167,000 bicycles and 6,300 sewing machines to partner agencies in Central America, Africa, and Eastern Europe.




