HABERMAN AND BUNETA SHINE IN CHORAL CONTEST

Harmonium Choral Society is excited to announce the winners of the 28th Annual High School Composition Contest. Gabriel Tarrow from Columbia High School, Maplewood, won first prize. His composition Buscándote will be sung at Harmonium's Dreamers concerts Saturday, June 7 at 7:30 p.m. and Sunday, June 8 at 3:00 p.m., at the Morristown United Methodist Church. The second prize winners are Ryan Haberman and Aidan Buneta, who composed Dreams together; they are seniors at Hanover Park Regional High School.

Artistic Director Dr. Anne Matlack says, "I am in awe of the talent of our student composers and thrilled to be supporting them for 28 years. I am especially happy that we received permission from noted poet Oscar Gonzalez to offer his poem Centroamérica en el corazón to the composers and that it is the winning piece.

MORE ABOUT THE STUDENT COMPOSERS:

First prize winner Gabriel Tarrow is a junior at Columbia High School in Maplewood. He has been playing the piano for more than eleven years and composing for ten. He loves choir and choral music and has attended several summer music camps. He draws inspiration from Baroque and modern choral music. Gabriel's sponsor is choral teacher Nicholas Diaz.

This is Gabe's third time winning the contest. He won as a freshman with Wind using text by Harlem Renaissance poet Gwendolyn Bennett. Last year he was runner-up and set a text by Morristown High School poet Hanna Cochran. This time he used text in Spanish by poet Oscar Gonzalez. Gabriel's piece is entitled Buscándote and will be performed by the full chorus at this concert.

The second place winning piece was a collaborative effort by Ryan Haberman and Aidan Buneta who worked on it during their AP Music Theory class. They thank their teacher Mr. Hine for his valuable guidance throughout this project.

Ryan began his musical career in the third-grade symphonic band and currently plays in several ensembles including the Golden Hornet jazz band, indoor drumline, the NJAB wind ensemble, the New Jersey regional symphonic band, and the marching band where he is a two-time section leader for the drumline.

Aidan Buneta has been an active member of the Hanover Park Choir and Chamber Singers for four years. He has also been involved in the theater department, performing in both fall and spring productions throughout his high school career. He is a new member of the school's marching and concert bands and has been studying voice for four years. He plans to pursue a degree in musical theater in the fall in college.

This June concert will feature composer Melissa Dunphy's American DREAMers, a cantata on texts from five young Americans who were brought to America as children, woven into a multi-movement work that honors their story and inspires hope, empathy, and action. 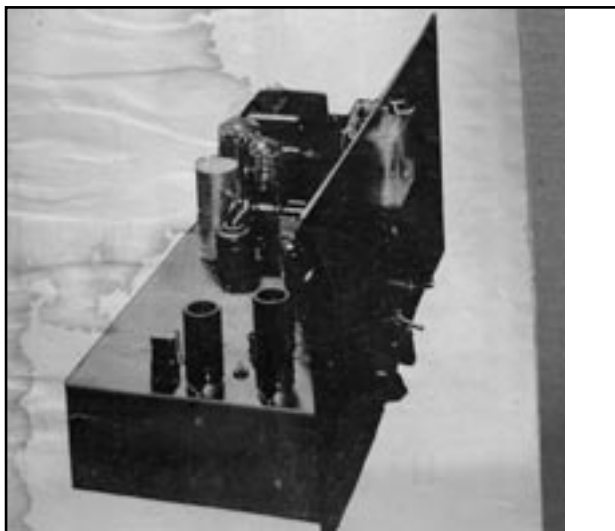
We do all kinds of Ham Radio Activities. We take part in contests and exercises to practice our communications skills. We work with local kids, at school and at summer camps

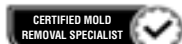

Celebrating four decades of “bringing music to people and people to music,” the renowned Hanover Wind Symphony presented a gala 40th Anniversary Concert on Sunday, April 27, at Morristown High School. Roughly half the members of the all-volunteer HWS are music educators; the other half range from engineers and physical therapists, to IT business analysts, speech/language pathologists, even probation officers. All bring their musical talents, plus their other life experiences, to the music they love to play. The group was founded in 1985 by Peter Boor, former band director at Whippany Park High School, who saw the need for an adult ensemble which could perform music of the highest caliber. At the premiere performance there were 30 musicians. Now in its 40th season, the Hanover Wind Symphony has a membership of over 85. MEMORIAL DAY: A TIME FOR REFLECTION AND ACTION

Every Memorial Day, millions of Americans attend parades, fire up their grills, and host large backyard BBQs for friends and family. As a veteran, I look forward to marching in a parade and attending a BBQ. However, before the festivities begin, I make it a point to check in on fellow veterans and ensure they are in a good place. For some veterans, Memorial Day is a difficult day, and they could use some reassurance from a friend or comrade.

For too long, our military members and veterans have been facing a heartbreaking crisis. A new study suggests that 44 veterans and servicemembers take their lives every day. This has become a nationwide epidemic, and countless families are struggling with this issue alone. Fortunately, there are many organizations working tirelessly to help our uniformed heroes get through these difficult times.

In 2017, the New Jersey Veterans Network (501(c)3) was created with a focus on the well-being of military members, veterans, and their families. The NJVN is a volunteer-driven mobile outreach team that actively seeks out veterans in need, providing them with free, life-saving resources and services. As a grassroots organization, we have a unique perspective on the needs of our uniformed heroes.

Our approach, combined with the ability to

collaborate with other organizations that share our mission, has allowed us to save lives and help veterans live a better quality of life. Recently, the NJVN has ramped up our mentorship and peer support programs. However, our recreational therapy events and functions have produced the most impactful results.

The NJVN has had great success hosting social events such as: movie nights, group hiking, paintball, professional sporting games, fishing trips, hunting, and other outdoor activities. Additionally, every year, the NJVN sends veterans to Camp Patriot (a PTSD retreat) for a week of healing.

Each week, the NJVN provides veterans with food, clothing, housing assistance, VA benefits information, and mental health support. By partnering with numerous other groups and organizations, we can offer our uniformed heroes a better way of life.

We are always looking for volunteers that can both assist with upcoming events and help mentor veterans so they can live better productive lives. Volunteers are the most important NJVN resource, and we would love to have more people help us save lives.
