Kenilworth's Historic Nitschke House

On Sat., June 7, 2025, The Kenilworth Historical Society will present a colorful, enlightening program celebrating African American culture and the significance of the which Juneteenth holiday, annually commemorates the emancipation of enslaved African Americans. It will feature an inspiring interactive visit with notable African American female Buffalo soldier Cathay Williams (1844-1893), as portrayed by acclaimed actress and historical interpreter Dr. Daisy Nelson Century.

The planned Juneteenth program and celebration will take place at the historic Oswald J. Nitschke House (49 South 21 Street, Kenilworth), starting at 1 p.m. Traditional Juneteenth foods will be served. Admission is \$10 for adults and \$5 for children. Advance registration is requested, as seating is limited. The Nitschke House has an elevator and is fully

accessible. For information and reservations, please call 908-709-0434.

Participants in the program, which has universal value for all cultures and age groups, will have the opportunity to learn about Cathay Williams as well as the historical significance of the Juneteenth holiday, which annually on June 19 commemorates the emancipation of enslaved African Americans. Acclaimed actress, educator, author and historical interpreter Dr. Daisy Nelson Century, will highlight the life and experiences of Cathay Williams, the first female to enlist and the only documented woman to serve in the U.S. Army while posing as a male Buffalo Soldier (William Cathay) in the American Frontier Wars.

Proceeds will benefit the Kenilworth Historical Society's Oswald J. Nitschke House (c. 1880) "living history" museum and cultural arts center by helping defray operating and programming costs.

## WHAT HAPPENED TO THE TREE IN THE MIDDLE OF THE ROAD?

Can you believe it? A big old tree growing right in the middle of the road in Kenilworth as far back as New Orange Days in the late 1890s and early 1900s. No living Keniworth resident is around anymore who saw it and talked about it. But there are some of us, such as myself, old enough to have heard about it firsthand from those long-gone, old-time witnesses. There are even a couple of rare photos that show it standing stately in the road.

Horse-drawn wagons and horseback riders in our earliest days skirted around it. Then not too long after when "Tin Lizzy" automobiles hit the road, they too, had to maneuver around the big tree. So, where was this tree, what kind of tree was it, what happened to it, and what's there now?

Well, first of all, the tree wasn't always on the middle of the road. Before 1900 when Kenilworth was almost entirely farms, there was an historic diagonal road that cut across today's Kenilworth from the southeast to the northwest. The road started on S. Michigan Ave. just north of Colfax Ave. and ran behind the Delta Gas Station of today. We know the road as Faitoute Ave. It ran northwest and is now blocked by the Parkway near Fairfield Ave. Faitoute Ave. picks up again on the other side of the Parkway near Bloomingdale. It next came out at about Newark Ave. and S. 21st St. It then would have continued northwestwardly going past the back of the today's VFW Hall next cut across what is today the Boulevard at No. 20th St. by the Star of India Restaurant. Back in the 1800s, that big tree was not in the road but on the east side of the road. The road next emerged at today's Washington Ave. by the Rescue Squad building. The diagonal road at that point is now known as Cross St. It continued northwest and linked up with Springfield Rd. near what is the end of N. 15th at the little parking lot for Black Brook Park.

No, the tree never jumped into the road. The road came to the tree?


In the 1890s, the pattern of Kenilworth's streets was laid out in a crisscrossed pattern of rectangular street blocks. This shifted the right-of-way for the diagonal road at the Blvd and N. 20th St. location eastward with the big tree no longer alongside of the old road, but as a result ended up in the street at the Boulevard and N. 20th St.

In 1903 to the left of the old tree was the original Kenilworth Inn. To the right of the tree at the time was the old Benedict farmhouse that was used by Upsala College in 1898 until 1899 while it built a new campus at the top of N. 20th St. at what was known as College Hill in those days. What's left is now Water Tower Hill.

The tree remained a local landmark. So, what happened to the tree?


In 1926 a major construction project to extend the Boulevard from N. 20th St., west past the Rahway River into Cranford. Construction required improvements at the N. 20th St. So, the big old tree had to come down. How was it taken down and by whom?

In 1969 I interviewed two old timers. One was

Fred Hiller (1885-1977) who came here with his parents in the 1890s. The other was Luciano "Old Louie" Vitale (1880-1972) who arrived in Kenilworth in 1901. He was one of the contractors. When he inquired about what to do about the tree in the road and others he said he was told to "Blow 'em up!" with dynamite. He said it came down with a huge blast of 3 sticks of dynamite. The two spoke of their memories of the giant tree

which they agreed to be hundreds of years old. Old Louie stated, "It was a chestnut tree." Fred Hiller said, "Yes it was. Not there now. Guess that's progress."

## **MEMORIAL DAY: A TIME FOR REFLECTION AND ACTION**

Every Memorial Day, millions of Americans attend parades, fire up their grills, and host large backyard BBQs for friends and family. As a veteran, I look forward to marching in a parade and attending a BBQ. However, before the festivities begin, I make it a point to check in on fellow veterans and ensure they are in a good place. For some veterans, Memorial Day is a difficult day, and they could use some reassurance from a friend or comrade.

For too long, our military members and veterans have been facing a heartbreaking crisis. A new study suggests that 44 veterans and servicemembers take their lives every day. This has become a nationwide epidemic, and countless families are struggling with this issue alone. Fortunately, there are many organizations working tirelessly to help our uniformed heroes get through these difficult times.

In 2017, the New Jersey Veterans Network (501(c)3) was created with a focus on the well-being of military members, veterans, and their families. The NJVN is a volunteer-driven mobile outreach team that actively seeks out veterans in need, providing them with free, life-saving resources and services. As a grassroots organization, we have a unique perspective on the needs of our uniformed heroes.

Our approach, combined with the ability to

collaborate with other organizations that share our mission, has allowed us to save lives and help veterans live a better quality of life. Recently, the NJVN has ramped up our mentorship and peer support programs. However, our recreational therapy events and functions have produced the most impactful results.

The NJVN has had great success hosting social events such as: movie nights, group hiking, paintball, professional sporting games, fishing trips, hunting, and other outdoor activities. Additionally, every year, the NJVN sends veterans to Camp Patriot (a PTSD retreat) for a week of healing.

Each week, the NJVN provides veterans with

food, clothing, housing assistance, VA benefits information, and mental health support. By partnering with numerous other groups and organizations, we can offer our uniformed heroes a better way of life.

We are always looking for volunteers that can both assist with upcoming events and help mentor veterans so they can live better productive lives. Volunteers are the most important NJVN resource, and we would love to have more people help us save lives. 


