
NEW HOME FOR THE ARTS COUNCIL OF LIVINGSTON



BIKE AND SEWING MACHINE COLLECTION FOR P4P - JUNE 7

Faith Lutheran Church

Do you have bikes or sewing machines needlessly taking up room in your home or garage? Give them a new home by bringing them to Faith Lutheran Church's bike and sewing machine collection for Pedals for Progress (P4P) and Sewing Peace on Saturday, June 7th from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

Adult and children's bicycles in rideable or repairable condition will be shipped overseas by P4P and distributed to those who rely on them for transportation to jobs, markets, medical care, and schools. Donations of working sewing machines also provide income opportunities for those living in developing countries.

If you are unable to drop by on June 7th, you may still leave your bicycle(s) in Faith Lutheran's lower lot next to the utility shed. If you are donating a sewing machine, please leave it underneath the sheltered alcove by the red doors at the bottom of the parking lot. Faith will make sure these items get to P4P for this collection or will hold them until the next one. Please note that "bikes for parts" or disassembled bicycles will not be accepted.

On average, it costs \$52 to collect, process, and ship each bicycle. A donation toward shipping costs is necessary for P4P's continued success and \$20 is suggested per bike and sewing machine. All monetary donations (cash or check) and material donations are fully deductible, and a receipt will be provided on site on June 7th. Donations can also be made directly via p4p.org.

To date, Pedals for Progress has shipped over 167,000 bicycles and 6,300 sewing machines to partner agencies in Central America, Africa, and Eastern Europe.





BARBECUE SEASON SAFETY TIPS

Livingston Fire Department

The official start of barbecue season is here. We think of barbecue season as a series of enjoyable times spent outside with family and friends, but outdoor cooking is still serious business and there are significant dangers associated with outdoor cooking.

Before firing up the grill, there are important safety concerns to consider when dealing with fuels like propane, natural gas, and charcoal. Avoid creating a recipe for disaster by taking some simple safety precautions.

LOCATION

Barbecue grills are designed for outdoor use only. Never barbecue in a trailer, tent, house, garage, or any enclosed area because of the danger of carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning. CO is a colorless, odorless gas that can accumulate to toxic levels in closed environments due to the lack of proper ventilation. Make sure the grill is placed in a clear area, away from buildings (15' minimum), trees, dry leaves, or brush. Choose a location that is away from high traffic areas, children playing nearby, and pets. Always be sure to place the grill on a stable surface so that it can't accidentally be tipped over.

BARBECUE SAFETY

Periodically inspect gas-fired barbecue grills. Check for a buildup of spider webs, which can inhibit the flow of gas to controls or for rodent nests in the area of the hoses and controls. Bugs and other "critters" can climb into small places, causing gas to flow where it shouldn't. This can cause propane to leak and ignite when the grill is lit

It is important to check grill hoses for cracking, brittleness, holes, and leaks before using them. Make sure there are no sharp bends in the hose or tubing that will restrict the flow of gas and cause the unit to malfunction.

PROPANE SAFETY

Store propane bottles and tanks away from potential sources of heat or flame, such as a furnace, water heater, or any appliance with a pilot light. Keep them in a well-ventilated shed away from the house or any habitable structure. Always keep propane gas bottles and tanks upright and in a cool area away from direct sunlight. Exposure to heat will cause the internal gas pressure to increase, which may open the relief valve and allow gas to escape.

Be careful to not store a propane tank in an area that is susceptible to vehicle traffic, such as on a garage floor. A vehicle coming into contact with a propane tank could cause a leak in the tank or an explosion. Keep gas supply lines as far away as possible from hot surfaces and dripping hot grease. Never start a gas grill with the lid

closed, as gas can accumulate inside and, when ignited, could blow the lid off, causing injury.

CHARCOAL SAFETY

Always use approved starter fluid when using a charcoal grill. Never use other flammables, like gasoline, as a starter fluid or accelerant, as this could cause an explosive fire. Since burning charcoal produces carbon monoxide (CO), never put away the grill until you are sure that the coals are no longer hot or burning.

Dispose of hot coals properly by dousing them with plenty of water and stirring the coals to make sure that the fire is out. Store coals in a metal container only — never place coals in plastic, paper, or wooden containers. As a safe practice, store used coal a minimum of 15' from any structure.

GREASE

Whether gas or charcoal, a clean grill is a safe grill. Grease build-up can lead to a fire in the grill—as the grill heats up, the excess grease simply ignites. Grease can build up quickly, leaving several pounds of grease at the bottom of the grill after only a few cookouts. Place a container or "grease-trap" beneath your grill to collect the grease run-off, and replace the container periodically to prevent a grease fire.

SAFETY FIRST

Avoid loose clothing while grilling — especially things like long sleeves or apron strings. Use flame-retardant mitts when adjusting hot vents, and use barbecue utensils with long handles (forks, tongs, etc.) to avoid burns and splatters. Keep a fire extinguisher close in case of emergencies, and never leave the grill when it is lit. Always have one person in charge of the grill to avoid any accidents or injuries.

At the first sign of trouble, turn off the gas supply at the controls if they're not involved in the fire. If the controls are on fire, turn off the gas (if you can do this without risking injury) at the supply (propane tank, or gas supply valve from residence if a natural gas grill). Call 9-1-1 to report the incident, and the Fire Department will respond to ensure that the fire is out and the gas is properly turned off.

Gas grills can produce a great deal of heat which can turn deadly, so it is important to make sure a grill is operating properly before using it. When using a grill, always assume everything is hot and take appropriate precautions. Never attempt to change the location of a hot grill, as there is a high risk of serious burns due to stumbling or dropping the hot grill.

The Livingston Health Department, in free Electronics Recycling and Paper Shredding conjunction with Jamie Price, PA-C from Event on Sunday, June 8, 2025, from 9:00 a.m. to Advanced Dermatology, will offer a free skin 2:00 p.m. at the Livingston Senior/Community Center, 204 Hillside Avenue.

GLASS OR SHARP EDGES

Volunteers will be stationed on site to guide residents to the correct location in the rear and side parking lots, depending upon the types of items to be recycled. Residents are reminded to drive slowly through the parking lot and follow the directions of any volunteer wearing a safety vest. Volunteers will also remove electronic items from each resident's vehicle; residents are asked to remain inside their cars for safety reasons.

Electronic items will be accepted whether they are working or not. However, for safety reasons, TV screens or monitors with broken glass or other sharp edges will not be accepted. Bring those items to one of Essex County's Household Hazardous Waste Disposal days; visit ecuanj.com for more information.

EARLY DROP OFF

Early drop off for electronics only (no papers to be shredded) will be available on Friday, June 6 and Saturday, June 7 from 8:30 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. at the Livingston Senior/Community Center, 204 Hillside Avenue, on the lower level in Craft Room 1.

LIGHTBULBS

Unbroken fluorescent "swirl" bulbs and tubes up to 4' in length are accepted at the township's Electronics Recycling Events. Regular "Edison" — incandescent — bulbs are not accepted; dispose of those with regular household garbage.

PAPER SHREDDING

All types of confidential paper documents will be accepted for shredding. These personal paper documents will be shredded and recycled on site during Livingston's event. Shredding is available for Livingston residents only, and there is a limit of five boxes of papers per household. Homebased businesses or institutions are not eligible to use this service.

Residents are reminded that the following will not be accepted: hard-cover books, three-ring binders, paper clips, CDs, computer disks, pendaflex-type folders, other fastened documents

The shredding trucks fill up quickly, so Livingston residents are reminded to bring their documents to the site in a container that can be easily emptied. Residents are reminded to remove pages from plastic binders and bring only sensitive documents for shredding.

Newspapers, magazines, and books should always be recycled with regular bi-weekly paper pickup. Residents who want to watch as their papers are shredded must park their cars in the spaces to the right, beyond the shredding truck; this will allow traffic to continue to flow steadily.

FUTURE E-RECYCLING DATES
