A SPLIT SECOND ON WHITE OAK RIDGE ROAD

Parents in our town are likely familiar with incessant requests from their teens for an e-bike. The arguments go: "You won't have to drive me," "You want me to be more independent," "It's way more environmentally friendly." Let's face it—the appeal is real. The freedom to explore, the exhilaration of acceleration, the thrill of cruising on a Super 73, riding with a friend.

What's not to love about riding! The magic of seeing a small child peddling away, or a grown man peeling the dust sheet off his Ducati, roaring it to life. Add the zip of e-bikes, hoverboards, and scooters, and just like that, summer's arrived.


But this is an article written by an EMT, so you know where it's headed. One sunny afternoon, a dedicated off-duty EMT, witnesses the exact moment a kid on an e-bike, going too fast and without a helmet, loses control. The bike slides out from under him.

We see it: kids blazing past, helmet straps dangling, phone in hand, earbuds in, all gratification centers lit up. We get it. My 83-year-old fatherin-law once asked to take a spin on my son's e-bike. Skeptical, we let him. Priceless—he wore that grin all day.

In New Jersey, Class 3 e-bike riders must be 15, licensed, and stay under 28mph. Class 1 and 2 are limited to 20mph with no age minimum, but helmets are required under 17. E-scooters follow the same rules. Speed-modifying kits make e-bikes illegal and riskier. Even untampered models can be dangerously fast. Nationwide, e-bike injuries—especially head trauma—are rising.

Back to our story, the EMT stabilizes the boy's spine, tends to his head injury, fractured wrist and grazed knees. In no time, he is loaded into the ambulance and transported to hospital. How to avoid scenes like this? Lead by example, wear a helmet, follow traffic rules - kids mimic behavior. Practice with them in safe areas so they can build skills. And for teens, have the "e-bike speed talk". Share real stories. Set clear rules. In our house, helmet, no phone, reflective jacket, lights on. That's the deal.





PRESBY MEMORIAL IRIS GARDENS THE RAINBOW ON THE HILL

98th year of blooming. It is located at 474 Upper Mountain Avenue, Upper Montclair. Walk through a garden blooming with more than 100,000 iris flowers.

Everyone is welcome to visit Presby and enjoy our spectacular collection of irises. This will be our 98th year of blooming. A suggested donation of \$10 per person is greatly appreciated.

Located at the base of the 7 1/2-acre Mountainside Park (474 Upper Mountain Ave., Upper Montclair), the Presby Memorial Iris Gardens contain over 14,000 irises of approximately 3,000 varieties and produce over 100,000 blooms over the course of the season. The annual spring Bloom Season is typically mid-May through the first week of June. Certain beds will bloom in October. Visitors can see by the arching slope of the garden beds is why Presby is often referred to as the "rainbow on the hill".

A recent addition is the PresBee Sanctuary which currently supports 10 active hives with well over 100,000 Italian honeybees.

This park contains a segment of the 36-mile Lenape Trail, a unique urban/suburban trail connecting 18 parks and 11 municipalities in Essex County. 





After a year of injuries, he was able to compete at the 2025 National Championships in Salt Lake City, his only competition this year. He earned 4 medals in Salt Lake City: Vault, Rings, Parallel Bars and All Around.






Blue Envelope Program

The Millburn Police Department is proud to announce a new program to help people with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) during a traffic stop.

The goal of this program is to avoid any misunderstandings between officers and individuals with ASD. If someone with ASD gets pulled over, the driver shows the blue envelope. The driver will keep a copy of their driver's license, registration card, current insurance card, and an emergency contact list inside. The outside of the blue envelope contains instructions for the driver, like keeping hands on the wheel and a warning about the flashing lights and noises. On the reverse side of the envelope, it tells the officers what to do, like simplifying requests. A checked off box will also indicate whether the driver is verbal or nonverbal.




