

AMERICAN LEGION POST 433 WILL CONDUCT FLAG RETIREMENT CEREMONY – JUNE 14

New Providence American Legion Post 433 will conduct this year's Flag Retirement Ceremony on Flag Day, Saturday, June 14, 2025, at 7 p.m. The Public is invited to attend this important event which will be held at the Legion Hall, 357 Elkwood Avenue, in New Providence, next to the Veterans Memorial Library. American flags which have become faded, frayed, soiled or otherwise unserviceable will be retired by destroying with full respect and honor. These rites include burning on an appropriate pyre. The Legion expects to retire approximately 3,000 unserviceable flags this year.

Anyone desiring to retire an unserviceable flag in this ceremony is asked to place it in the flag receptacle in front of the Legion Hall or drop it off at the American Legion Post by 5:00 p.m. on June 13th.

"Every citizen should recognize the flag's importance and understand how it should be displayed while in service and when it should be retired from service," said American Legion Post 433 officer Gerald Gross.

Since 1946, American Legion Post 433 has served veterans of New Providence, Summit and Berkeley Heights. In addition to conducting the Flag Retirement Ceremony, Post 433 annually sponsors New Providence's Memorial Day

parade. Post 433 is active throughout the year by hosting patriotic services, sponsoring day trips to military and historic sites and providing a voice for area veterans.



MEMORIAL DAY: A TIME FOR REFLECTION AND ACTION

Every Memorial Day, millions of Americans attend parades, fire up their grills, and host large backyard BBQs for friends and family. As a veteran, I look forward to marching in a parade and attending a BBQ. However, before the festivities begin, I make it a point to check in on fellow veterans and ensure they are in a good place. For some veterans, Memorial Day is a difficult day, and they could use some reassurance from a friend or comrade.

For too long, our military members and veterans have been facing a heartbreaking crisis. A new study suggests that 44 veterans and servicemembers take their lives every day. This has become a nationwide epidemic, and countless families are struggling with this issue alone. Fortunately, there are many organizations working tirelessly to help our uniformed heroes get through these difficult times.

In 2017, the New Jersey Veterans Network (501(c)3) was created with a focus on the wellbeing of military members, veterans, and their families. The NJVN is a volunteer-driven mobile outreach team that actively seeks out veterans in need, providing them with free, life-saving resources and services. As a grassroots organization, we have a unique perspective on the needs of our uniformed heroes.

Our approach, combined with the ability to

collaborate with other organizations that share food, clothing, housing assistance, VA benefits our mission, has allowed us to save lives and help veterans live a better quality of life. Recently, the NJVN has ramped up our mentorship and peer support programs. However, our recreational therapy events and functions have produced the most impactful results.

The NJVN has had great success hosting social events such as: movie nights, group hiking, paintball, professional sporting games, fishing trips, hunting, and other outdoor activities. Additionally, every year, the NJVN sends veterans to Camp Patriot (a PTSD retreat) for a week of healing.

Rosie will review the story of how she organized the gargantuan effort in the spring of 1978 to save including oil and gas contracts trading. Radio City. You will be shocked by the "no good deed goes unpunished" climax of the story in which she reveals her reward for spearheading the movement to save "The Showplace of the Nation.

JUNE 17TH - STEVE VILLAS

On June 17th, Steve Villas will delve into the intricacies of world oil and gas trading. After receiving a degree in engineering and an MBA from Wharton, Steve spent the next forty-five years in the petroleum industry working for Exxon, Standard Oil of Ohio, British Petroleum, and the Hess Corp. He has experience in Chemical Plant design, advertising and promotion, supply and logistics, government affairs, commodities trading, financial hedging, oil and gas marketing, and more. He will address current topics of interest in the world oil markets

JUNE 24TH - MIKE MCTERNAN

Finally, on June 24th, Mike McTernan will tell us how he transitioned from a successful career in finance into a totally different career in education, all the while engaging in community service. Mike is currently teaching history at Ridge High School and is also serving as President of the Summit Common Council. He previously spent almost 30 years working in corporate finance and banking. He will address current issues facing secondary education including his subjects of Global History and AP Government and Politics. He will also describe the challenges of a mid-career transition which required him to attain a EdD from Seton Hall University. He will be happy to entertain questions concerning local government issues as well.





EXCEL BASKETBALL CAMP BEGINS 45TH SEASON THIS SUMMER

Excel in Basketball, one of the longest running camps in America, was founded in 1981 by Coach Frank Allocco, Sr. Frank Allocco was born and raised in New Providence where he was an All-State performer in football, basketball, and baseball.

Frank went on to the University of Notre Dame where he competed on the Varsity Football

team as a quarterback on the 1973 National Championship Team under the tutelage of legendary coach Ara. Frank was set to be the starting quarterback on the 1975 squad before a shoulder separation curtailed his career, opening the door for a young Joe Montana to eventually take his place! In addition to his football exploits for the Irish, he was a point guard on the Varsity Basketball Team under the direction of Digger Phelps.

Upon graduation, Frank moved to California as the Regional Manager for Barnell Loft Publications. He maintained his connection to New Jersey by creating Excel in Basketball as a way to give back to a community that gave him





Do you have bikes or sewing machines needlessly taking up room in your home or garage? Give them a new home by bringing them to Faith Lutheran Church's bike and sewing machine collection for Pedals for Progress (P4P) and Sewing Peace on Saturday, June 7th from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

Adult and children's bicycles in rideable or repairable condition will be shipped overseas by P4P and distributed to those who rely on them for transportation to jobs, markets, medical care, and schools. Donations of working sewing machines also provide income opportunities for those living in developing countries.

If you are unable to drop by on June 7th, you may still leave your bicycle(s) in Faith Lutheran's lower lot next to the utility shed. If you are donating a sewing machine, please leave it underneath the sheltered alcove by the red doors at the bottom of the parking lot. Faith will make sure these items get to P4P for this collection or will hold them until the next one. Please note that "bikes for parts" or disassembled bicycles will not be accepted.

On average, it costs \$52 to collect, process, and ship each bicycle. A donation toward shipping costs is necessary for P4P's continued success and \$20 is suggested per bike and sewing machine. All monetary donations (cash or check) and material donations are fully deductible, and a receipt will be provided on site on June 7th. Donations can also be made directly via p4p.org.

To date, Pedals for Progress has shipped over 167,000 bicycles and 6,300 sewing machines to partner agencies in Central America, Africa, and Eastern Europe.




