
She also worked for 7 years acting as administrator of the Community School at St. John's. And volunteered many years at the Reeves/Reed Arboretum.



MEMORIAL DAY: A TIME FOR REFLECTION AND ACTION

Every Memorial Day, millions of Americans attend parades, fire up their grills, and host large backyard BBQs for friends and family. As a veteran, I look forward to marching in a parade and attending a BBQ. However, before the festivities begin, I make it a point to check in on fellow veterans and ensure they are in a good place. For some veterans, Memorial Day is a difficult day, and they could use some reassurance from a friend or comrade.

For too long, our military members and veterans have been facing a heartbreaking crisis. A new study suggests that 44 veterans and servicemembers take their lives every day. This has become a nationwide epidemic, and countless families are struggling with this issue alone. Fortunately, there are many organizations working tirelessly to help our uniformed heroes get through these difficult times.

In 2017, the New Jersey Veterans Network (501(c)3) was created with a focus on the wellbeing of military members, veterans, and their families. The NJVN is a volunteer-driven mobile outreach team that actively seeks out veterans in need, providing them with free, life-saving resources and services. As a grassroots organization, we have a unique perspective on the needs of our uniformed heroes.

Our approach, combined with the ability to

our mission, has allowed us to save lives and help veterans live a better quality of life. Recently, the NJVN has ramped up our mentorship and peer support programs. However, our recreational therapy events and functions have produced the most impactful results.

The NJVN has had great success hosting social events such as: movie nights, group hiking, paintball, professional sporting games, fishing trips, hunting, and other outdoor activities. Additionally, every year, the NJVN sends veterans to Camp Patriot (a PTSD retreat) for a week of healing.

Each week, the NJVN provides veterans with



JUNE 3RD - MITCH ERICKSON

You will be shocked by the "no good deed goes unpunished" climax of the story in which she reveals her reward for spearheading the movement to save "The Showplace of the Nation.

JUNE 17TH - STEVE VILLAS

On June 17th, Steve Villas will delve into the intricacies of world oil and gas trading. After receiving a degree in engineering and an MBA from Wharton, Steve spent the next forty-five years in the petroleum industry working for Exxon, Standard Oil of Ohio, British Petroleum, and the Hess Corp. He has experience in Chemical Plant design, advertising and promotion, supply and logistics, government affairs, commodities trading, financial hedging, oil and gas marketing, and more. He will address current topics of interest in the world oil markets

JUNE 24TH - MIKE MCTERNAN

Finally, on June 24th, Mike McTernan will tell us how he transitioned from a successful career in finance into a totally different career in education, all the while engaging in community service. Mike is currently teaching history at Ridge High School and is also serving as President of the Summit Common Council. He previously spent almost 30 years working in corporate finance and banking. He will address current issues facing secondary education including his subjects of Global History and AP Government and Politics. questions concerning local government issues as









BRIGHT YOUTH'S "INCLUSIVE TRAIL" RETURNS

Bright Youth's Inclusive Trail - Hiking with Special Hearts program, which provides outdoor experiences for children with special needs. After a winter hiatus, the program resumed on March 29, 2025, with eight Bright Youth members: Allison Guo, Jason Guo, Alex Jiang, William Jiang, Ryan Ng, Keela Wang, Angela Yang, and Arik Zhang—guiding seven children with disabilities, including Down syndrome and autism, along with their families, on a scenic hike through Great Swamp in Chatham, NJ. Following the approximately two-mile trek, the volunteers and children enjoyed an exciting Easter Egg Hunt. Dividing into three teams, they searched the woods and grassy areas for nearly 150 eggs, which had been carefully hidden in advance and filled with Hershey's Kisses chocolates. The event was a joyful and heartwarming kickoff to the spring season, bringing smiles to both the children and volunteers.

The Inclusive Trail – Hiking with Special Hearts program was launched by Bright Youth's high school volunteers in June 2024, with the goal of providing children with special needs a welcoming and supportive environment to engage in outdoor activities. The program promotes physical activity, social interaction, and a sense of belonging, while also offering families an opportunity to connect and share experiences.

From June to November last year, Bright Youth organized seven monthly light-hiking trips across central New Jersey, including locations such as Watchung Reservation in Union County and South Mountain Reservation in Essex County. Each hike featured engaging activities tailored for young participants, such as ball passing, Rubik's Cube solving, and magic tricks. In total, these hikes spanned nearly 15 miles over the course of the year.

"Hiking with special needs children is a great way to spend a weekend afternoon," said Allison Guo, co-founder of Bright Youth and a sophomore at Summit High School. "It feels like we're on a glorious quest for a lost artifact. The children run, play, and explore—it's a truly magical experience." The program has welcomed families from Union, Essex, Bergen, Morris, and Somerset counties, fostering meaningful connections between children, peers, and older mentors.

Bright Youth, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit led by high school volunteers, strives to create inclusive experiences through various initiatives. "Bright Youth is the quintessential place to foster a strong sense of community and explore passions," said Arik Zhang, a junior at Millburn High School and an enthusiastic Bright Youth member. "Whether through arts and crafts or outdoor adventures, Bright Youth's offerings are the perfect source to foster creativity and show love for ourselves and others. We welcome many others to join our program and continue honoring this culture of belonging."
