EVENT CELEBRATES LIFESAVING EQUIPMENT DONATION

The Aliver Foundation

On June 6, The Aliver Foundation, Cranford Public Schools, Cranford Fire Department, and Cranford Police Department held a family friendly community event at Memorial Field in honor of PAL volunteers, to celebrate the donation of a lifesaving equipment bundle consisting of a CE TEK 4000 Outdoor AED Enclosure along with a Heartsine Samaritan 350P AED.

The evening took place during CPR & AED Awareness Week and featured an interactive CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) and AED (automated external defibrillator) demonstration by Cranford Fire Department Lieutenant John Dillon who is also a First Responder Committee member with The Aliver Foundation, and a stethoscope craft for children.

Cranford Police Chief Matthew R. Nazzaro said. "Time saves lives and having an AED at this location 24 hours a day, 7 days a week is a tremendous addition to the public safety needs of Cranford – especially our kids."

Each year, nearly 360,000 people in the United States will experience an out-of-hospital cardiac arrest and fewer than 10% will survive. The best outcomes occur when CPR is

started immediately and an AED is used within the first few minutes. For every minute defibrillation is delayed, the chance of survival drops by about 10%.

The hope is that nobody will ever have to use this equipment but knowing it is there and can remain outside and accessible no matter the weather is so important. **ABOUT THE ALIVER FOUNDATION**

Founded in January 2024, The Aliver Foundation's mission is to raise awareness and funds to install all weather AEDs in outdoor recreation spaces while also providing crucial resources and educational opportunities to individuals and communities.

The goal is simple – to save lives and help hearts by:

- 1) Increasing the number of all weather, climate controlled AEDs that are in outdoor recreation spaces
- 2) Creating access to educational opportunities like CPR and AED training
- 3) Providing resources and support to sudden cardiac arrest survivors and their loved ones






