We are excited to announce Florham Park's 68th Annual Fourth of July Parade. It is reported to be the longest continuously running 4th of July Parade in New Jersey. This year, our theme is "Winter Wonderland". Join us for an exciting day of events!

The Florham Park 4th of July Celebration Committee will host its traditional full-day schedule of activities on Friday, July 4, 2025. The day starts with a ceremony at Fire Company 1 at 9:00 a.m., immediately followed by the parade kicking off around 9:30 a.m., with the parade ending on the grounds of the Florham Park Municipal Complex.

This year, Edward Franko will lead the way as Grand Marshal at the front of the 2025 Florham Park 4th of July Parade. Ed's presence at the front of the parade will be a welcome sight, reflecting his longstanding commitment to the Florham Park community.

"The Florham Park Fourth of July committee is proud to honor Ed Franko who has served the community in a multitude of ways," says Florham Park Fourth of July Committee member, Suzanne Herold. "Ed's contributions extend beyond the borough's boundaries, and we are grateful for his service to our nation."

Ed and his family moved to Florham Park almost 30 years ago in 1996. He is most notably known for holding the position of Principal at the local Hanover Park Regional High School. As high school principal, he was more than just an administrator—he was a familiar face throughout town, someone who had quietly become part of the fabric of the community. Known for his steady presence, fair leadership, and genuine care for students, he earned the respect of generations who passed through his halls. As those students grew up and became adults themselves, they continued to look up to him—not just as a former principal, but as a role model whose influence helped shape the kind of people they became.

Upon retiring as principal, Ed joined the

Florham Park Memorial First Aid Squad. As a driver for seven years, he served as Vice President for one year, and President for two years. During his off hours, he spent much of his free time upgrading the facilities of the squad house. As Mr. Franko continues to give back to the community, he serves as a reminder of the strength of local involvement.


Aside from his impact in our community, Ed proudly served our country in the U.S. Army, stationed in Vietnam from January 1970 to March 1971. He was assigned to the 9th Division in the Mekong Delta, and then transferred to the 101st Airborne Division operating at the DMZ until the 9th Div. was transferred back to the United States. He then achieved the rank of Sergeant E-5 and was awarded a Bronze Star, Army Commendation Medal, and Air Medal for over 50 combat insertions.

At the conclusion of the parade, join us for a Family Picnic and Social Garden. This late morning-early afternoon fundraising event includes rides, food, ice cream, and a Social Garden for those aged 21 and older (ID verification required). The day concludes with fireworks at the rear of the municipal complex near Emmett Field starting at dusk.

The parade will march on rain or shine. The afternoon events are weather dependent. In case of inclement weather, the Social Garden and the fireworks will be rescheduled for Saturday, July







He regularly performs in New Jersey, New York City, and Philadelphia. Additionally, Khan has taught master classes and coached percussion ensembles and drum lines in several different schools in New Jersey. He was the first recipient of the merit-based Centanni Percussion Scholarship for showing excellence in artistic performance, advanced methods, and demonstrating high academic achievement. Among his numerous accomplishments, the guest conductor was honored with the opportunity to perform as the principal timpanist at Carnegie Hall, and on tour in Spain and Argentina with the Grammy Award-winning New York Youth Symphony.

In his position at Jefferson, Barrieres taught symphonic band, two levels of music theory, and directed many co-curricular ensembles, including Wind Ensemble, Jazz Band, Marching Band, and chamber ensembles. He currently teaches instrumental music at Pope John Middle School,

Barrieres also teaches private lessons on trumpet and euphonium at his studio in Stockholm. The current conductor of the Sussex County Youth Orchestra in Sparta, he has served as interim conductor with the New Sussex Symphony Orchestra, also in Sparta. Complementing his work as a director and teacher, the guest conductor is an active freelance trumpeter and plays with the New Sussex Symphony and Brass Dynamics Brass Quintet. He also plays euphonium with the Hanover Wind Symphony.

For four decades, the Hanover Wind Symphony (HWS), now celebrating its grand 40th anniversary, has played to enthusiastic audiences. HWS members are volunteers who share a love for music and a passion for enriching the cultural fabric of the community with the thrill of live wind band performances.

#### MCVSD OPENS CAREER TRAINING CENTER ON CCM CAMPUS

**County of Morris** 

More than 100 people gathered on Friday, May 30, 2025, at the County College of Morris (CCM) to celebrate the official opening of the Morris County Career Training Center, a new facility of the Morris County Vocational School District (MCVSD) on the college campus in Randolph.

The ribbon-cutting ceremony marked the completion of a 46,350-square-foot, two-story building that will expand MCVSD's capacity by hundreds of high school students starting with about 150 in the fall 2025 semester. The center will offer share-time programs focused on career and college readiness in fields ranging from medical and dental assisting to artificial intelligence, renewable energy and supply chain management.

The \$26.8 million project was funded through \$18.6 million from the Securing Our Children's Future Bond Act and \$8.2 million in county support. The building is located adjacent to CCM's Advanced Manufacturing Engineering Center and the future Entrepreneurship and Culinary Science Center, which is currently under construction, forming a hub of career and technical education in the county.

Programs offered at the center will provide students with hands-on experience, industry-recognized credentials and the opportunity to earn up to 18 college credits. The share-time model allows students to attend specialized technical training for half the school day as part of their junior and senior year high school programs.

"This building does not feel like a high school. It feels like a high-tech, innovative space, and I know students will love learning here. They will know they are in special space," said MCVSD Acting Superintendent Shari Castelli, who emceed the event.

"This event is not just about the opening of a new building. It's about opening the doors to our students, where they will be able to cultivate their dreams, hopes and aspirations. They will have a safe and inspiring environment where they can explore the many possibilities and opportunities that will be available to them to discover their own individual talents," said MCVSD Board of Education President Barbara Dawson.

"The Morris County Vocational School District Career Training Center is the result of a unique and innovative partnership. It's a shining example of what can be achieved when educators, with the support of county and state leaders, come together with a shared mission to empower the next generation of young people,

explore the many possibilities and opportunities and ultimately strengthen our community," said that will be available to them to discover their Paul Licitra, chair of the CCM Board of Trustees.

The project was made possible through collaboration among CCM and its Trustees, MCVSD and its Board of Education members, federal and state legislators, Morris County and the Board of County Commissioners, and the Township of Randolph and Councilmembers. During the event, the contributions of former MCVSD Superintendent Scott Moffitt were also recognized.
