FRIENDS OF LAFAYETTE PARADE - JULY 13

The American Friends of Lafayette is sponsoring a 13-month long reenactment of General Lafayette's 1824-1825 Farewell Tour as America's "National Guest." It began in August 2024 in New York City and follows the General's itinerary with programming throughout 24 states. In July 2025, the General will return to Morristown - the Military Capital of the Revolution. In 1825, Lafayette visited Morristown on July 14, Bastille Day, and now 200 years later he will return to Morristown on July 13, 2025 and July 14, 2025. Activities planned include a Parade and a celebration at the Morristown Green.

The plans include having local businesses, historical and lineage societies, and non-profits on the Morristown Green concurrently with the parade and celebration on Sunday July 13, 2025.

Local and French dignitaries will be on hand, and our goal is to have 1,000 spectators actively participating on the Green.

Says Matthew Paterno of Parsippany, HWS musical director and conductor, "The Hanover Wind Symphony invites you to celebrate America and experience the music that represents her. Enjoy both patriotic and original works that speak to the majesty and resilience of our country."

Conductor Ayden Khan of Wayne, is currently the director of bands at Soehl Middle School in Linden. He was previously director of bands at Neptune High School since 2017. He received his master's in percussion performance, as well as his bachelor's in music education, from Montclair State University. He regularly performs in New Jersey, New York City, and Philadelphia. Additionally, Khan has taught master classes and coached percussion ensembles and drum lines in several different schools in New Jersey. He was the first recipient of the merit-based Centanni Percussion Scholarship for showing excellence in artistic performance, advanced methods, and demonstrating high academic achievement. Among his numerous accomplishments, the guest conductor was honored with the opportunity to perform as the principal timpanist at Carnegie Hall, and on tour in Spain and Argentina with the Grammy Award-winning New York Youth Symphony.

Conductor and trumpeter Rich Barrieres of Stockholm is the former director of bands at Jefferson Township High School in Oak Ridge. In his position at Jefferson, Barrieres taught symphonic band, two levels of music theory, and directed many co-curricular ensembles, including Wind Ensemble, Jazz Band, Marching Band, and chamber ensembles. He currently teaches instrumental music at Pope John Middle School,

The current conductor of the Sussex County Youth Orchestra in Sparta, he has served as interim conductor with the New Sussex Symphony Orchestra, also in Sparta. Complementing his work as a director and teacher, the guest conductor is an active freelance trumpeter and plays with the New Sussex Symphony and Brass Dynamics Brass Quintet. He also plays euphonium with the Hanover Wind Symphony.

For four decades, the Hanover Wind Symphony (HWS), now celebrating its grand 40th anniversary, has played to enthusiastic audiences. HWS members are volunteers who share a love for music and a passion for enriching the cultural fabric of the community with the thrill of live wind band performances.
