THREE 8TH GRADERS COMPETE IN VEX ROBOTICS WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP

Three outstanding 8th grade students from and collaboration. Lawton C. Johnson Summit Middle School were part of a middle school robotics team, 4611D that competed in the VEX Robotics World Championship held in Dallas, Texas from May 9–11.

VEX Robotics World Championship is the largest Robotics Competition in the World. Each year, VEX holds the world championship that selects the best teams from each VEX Robotics city to compete in the world stage. This year's event featured 483 teams from 33 countries across six competitive divisions. The Summit's own Team #4611D unofficially known as the Delta Donuts,, was one of just five teams selected from the entire state to compete at this prestigious event. They earned their ticket to Worlds by excelling through a series of rigorous local and regional competitions in New Jersey. Their remarkable talent in robot building, game strategy, coding, and teamwork helped them stand out among hundreds of teams.

During the intense three-day event, the students demonstrated not only technical excellence but also exceptional communication skills - networked relentlessly with other teams to build trust and form alliances for the competition. They advanced to the elimination round of their division as a rookie team, proving their ability to thrive under a highpressure competition and maintain composure

The team's journey has been a true testament Rithvik Kona, Donald Lee, and Justin Shen to their dedication, creativity, and mutual trust. From planning strategies to overcoming mechanical and programming challenges under extreme time constraints, their teamwork and

friendship fueled their success on a global stage. The event also provided a great opportunity to network with teams from around the world.



The City of Summit Department of Community Programs is announcing the schedule for summer movies and concerts on the Village Green, located at 356 Broad Street in Summit.



Lile Hall in Christ Church, Summit, was filled on Sunday afternoon, June 8, 2025, when the Summit College Club Foundation awarded scholarships to each of seven accomplished high school senior women from Summit and surrounding towns. The scholarships, a testament to the Summit College Club's mission to advance equity for women and girls, will significantly aid the students in pursuing their college dreams. The annual ceremony in which the club awards scholarships is a high point of the organization's year. Since its inception in 1920, the Summit College Club has given away more than \$1.1 million in scholarship funds, which has helped hundreds of women to attend the college of their choice and make a positive impact in their communities.

While a few of the awards have more specific requirements, all of them seek a senior young woman from a local town (Summit, Berkeley Heights, Chatham, Millburn, Mountainside, New Providence, or Springfield) who is graduating from one of eight high schools and who has "achieved academic excellence and demonstrated leadership potential."

Each recipient, then, has a stellar academic record, but that's just the starting point of her achievements. As a group, these young women have mastered second (or third) languages, conducted scientific research at the university level, founded nonprofits, captained winning sports teams, volunteered with local, national,

and international organizations, and exercised leadership in school clubs, committees, and extracurricular activities. They exemplify intellectual curiosity and rigor, drive and resourcefulness, compassion and collaboration, as well as resilience. They've used personal challenges as a springboard for growth, achievement, and giving back. Both literally and figuratively, these young women have climbed mountains. The Summit College Club is proud to honor them with scholarships and looks forward to following their careers in the years ahead.

The awards ceremony commenced with Summit College Club President Lynne Rogerson warmly welcoming everyone. She gave a brief history of the Summit College Club and its activities over the past year, highlighting its role in the local community and its connection to the American Association of University Women, a national organization.

Dr. Audrey Fisch, professor of English at New Jersey City University and founder and president of the nonprofit, More Than Bootstraps, then spoke about the crucial importance of every young person having access to and support for success in higher education. She spoke directly to the scholarship recipients about the transition from high school to college and strategies that would help them thrive. More Than Bootstraps helps build a community of first-generation students who empower each other to access and

and international organizations, and exercised succeed in higher education through peer leadership in school clubs, committees, and mentorship, and parental engagement.

Next, Tanya Dev, a 2024 recipient newly returned from her freshman year at Tufts University, spoke about the importance of curiosity and the fun of being in a new, diverse environment.

The Summit College Club sponsored a 2023 scholarship recipient, Eden Levkov, in her attendance at AAUW's National Conference for College Women Student Leaders. Eden spoke about how much she had learned from participating in the workshops and activities designed to enhance her leadership skills—and about meeting college students from all over the country.

After these speeches, the seven scholarship recipients were honored with a certificate, a rose, and, most importantly, a scholarship check. Following the awards ceremony, the scholarship recipients, their families, and Summit College Club members stayed to enjoy refreshments, to meet one another, and to celebrate the remarkable accomplishments of the awardees.
