JAYCEES ROAD RACE HAD A RECORD 2,058 PARTICIPANTS

Thousands gathered on the Fourth of July for the 46th annual Cranford Jaycees Firecracker Road Race and Fun Run. The races have more than doubled in size over the last decade with a record 2,216 participants competing, with hundreds more cheering them on under sunny skies at Nomahegan Park and around town.

The top male finisher in the four-miler was Ben Fleischer of Scotch Plains with a time of 19:10, while the top female finisher was Denise Grohn of Branchburg with a time of 23:18.

Sean Swift was the top Cranford finisher, placing 3rd overall with a time of 20:49.

Cranford residents dominated the Fun Run with Patrick McComb, age 15, leading the boys with a time of 5:48 and Alexa Saleh, age 12, leading the girls at 7:10. Full results are available online at cranfordjaycees.org/road-race.

BECOME A LITERACY NJ VOLUNTEER TUTOR

Literacy New Jersey-Union and Middlesex Counties announces its Tutor Training Program. There will be a information session on Wednesday August 6 at 6 p.m. If you are need to have any teaching experience and you do interested in registering for tutor training, you must attend one of the information session.

Tuesday August 19th and will provide tutor trainees with the tools and strategies necessary for working with adult students in one of four categories: English As A Second Language, High School Equivalency, Basic Skills or Job Skill/Digital Literacy.

via Zoom. The five required training sessions will take place on August 19, 26, Sept. 2, 9, 16 from 6 pm to 8 pm.

After completing the training sessions, tutors are matched with a small group of adult students from the growing waiting list of students who need to improve their literacy skills. Tutors meet with their students online for 2 hours per week. After meeting your students, tutor trainees may be matched with a tutor mentor to guide them through their first lesson plans. New tutor volunteers are asked to make a commitment of at least 50 hours of instruction with students.

Literacy New Jersey provides ongoing supervision and support to tutors in the form of free Professional Development workshops on specific topics such as Health Literacy, ESL Conversation, Small Group Instruction and Job Readiness.

To volunteer, you must be at least 18 years old, able to speak English and willing to tutor in Union County or Middlesex County. You do not not need to speak a foreign language. The training will provide volunteers with techniques The Tutor Training Program will begin on and strategies for working with adult learners, as well as sample instructional materials and activities. There is a \$25 registration fee to cover the cost of books and materials. Literacy New Jersey is a non-profit organization.

GOLD STAR FAMILY MEMBERS VISIT CRANFORD ON MEMORIAL DAY

In the history of our town, there were 86 men who made the ultimate sacrifice while answering our country's call to wartime military service. The mission of the Cranford 86 Project is to document their lives, service and untimely deaths. Locating and collaborating with family members or good friends of each of these brave men is one of the most important parts of our research and writing process. Family and friends provide us with anecdotes, documents, precious photos and memories which add a special, personal touch to their serviceman's narrative. In some cases we are introducing the families to a "long lost" relative who they never knew. Each year, after we write and preserve the stories of four of our fallen, those four are highlighted at Cranford's Memorial Day ceremony. Having the family and friends of our honorees in attendance brings so much more meaning into this already special observance.

When we work with family and friends of one of Cranford's 86, a lot of emotion is shared and sometimes tears are shed. As the weeks go by, a relationship is built and when Memorial Day is over, we are reluctant to let them go! This is what sparked the idea for a new group in our 104-yearold Memorial Day Parade, "Gold Star Family Members of Cranford's 86 Fallen Military". Family members of previous years' honorees were formally invited back to Cranford to participate in the parade and ceremony, and they responded, traveling from near and far to be with us. Highlighting the presence of these families helps to remind everyone that, although these servicemen were lost so long ago, there are still people today who feel the hurt of that loss and continue to hold these men dear in their hearts and minds. The new group, with each marcher carrying the flag and/or wearing a button with a photo of their serviceman, was well received along the parade route. Many spectators removed their hats, held a hand over their heart or gave an extra round of applause, all of which were much appreciated. For those who observed these subtle gestures, it was a touching Memorial Day moment. One of our Cranford 86 Facebook followers, Kait Gonzales, expressed the following in regards to the Gold Star families being in attendance, "My kiddos are young and it is a great conversation starter for what Memorial Day is all about, and connecting it to real families who have sacrificed so much right here in our own town".

The new family members who joined us this year included over a dozen members of the Schnorr family who traveled from Maryland and





year-old WWII B-29 bombardier. Located by using Ancestry.com, the Schnorr family was "all in" with our plans to honor Lt. Tuttle from our first contact with them, throughout their enthusiastic participation on Memorial Day. From Rachel Schnorr, regarding her family's experience, "What an honor to be able to march in the parade in Robert's memory, carry his flag, and especially to be recognized in the ceremony. You all do amazing work, and I can't imagine there is much in any town in the U.S. that rivals it! This should be getting national news attention!" The Schnorrs left town thinking as we do, that we have some special things going on here in Cranford.

The niece of WWII flight engineer James Lascelles, Katherine Steers Cirrinicione of New York City, joined us with her husband and son. Her uncle's B-24, lost in the Pacific in 1943, was recovered in 2002. Katherine's father, Edward Steers, provided a DNA sample which allowed his brother's remains to finally be identified and buried in Arlington National Cemetery. Of Cranford's parade and ceremony, Katherine said, "It was such an amazing event. Such a gift. My family is grateful to you and your wonderful town. The parade and ceremony has changed how I think about Memorial Day forever". We were so pleased to have Katherine's son Matthew carrying his great-uncle's flag in the parade.

To every person on Memorial Day who came out as a spectator on the parade route, marched in the parade, attended or participated in the ceremony or worked behind the scenes, thank you! As well as honoring all of America's fallen military, your involvement provided a show of support and hospitality for the 40 plus family members of our Cranford 86, who chose our town in which to spend their Memorial Day.

A few guests that joined us this year are worthy of a special mention, Friend Burton, William Lee IV and Kevin Chieff. Friend Burton, is the namesake of his uncle, a Navy Seaman who served on a destroyer in WWII. Friend was instrumental to us in the research and writing of his uncle's story. Due to the Covid-19 lockdown, Friend was not able to attend the ceremony that honored his uncle, but he is a great supporter of the Cranford 86 Project and he traveled from

Virginia to honor their uncle, Robert Tuttle, a 21- Long Island to be with us on Memorial Day this

William Lee IV, also a namesake, is the greatgrandson of Cranford's WWII fallen hero, SGT William Lee. SGT Lee was honored on Memorial Day several years ago. William IV came all the way from Atlanta, Georgia with his wife Alisha to visit the hometown of his great-grandfather. His father, William Lee III, is a pastor in Georgia and has been a supporter and resource for the Cranford 86 Project since its beginning. We welcomed William IV and Alisha as the first members of the Lee family to visit us since the start of our project, and we hope that there will be many more!

Kevin Chieff, an alumni of Cranford High School's class of 1967, traveled from Monmouth County to carry the flag of his classmate and childhood friend, Joe Minnock. Joe Minnock was the first Cranford resident to lose his life in Vietnam and Kevin played a big part in the writing and research of his friend's tribute story.

In the 10 years since our journey began, the Cranford 86 Project has told the stories of 48 of our town's fallen heroes, and identified the faces of 79. Our small team of amateur historians will continue to work throughout the year on our mission, to never allow these men to become "just names" on a plaque.

This year we again professionally published two spiral-bound tribute books that contain the detailed stories of our fallen heroes. This year's 36-page Volume 8, includes a collection of 65 full color photos, some of which were digitally restored to replicate how our heroes looked during the time when they lived here in Cranford. Our complete 265-page book Volume 1-8 was also produced this year, and it is truly a historical Cranford keepsake. Both can be purchased on our website at Cranford86.org or at The Curious Heart Shop at 11 N. Union Ave in Cranford, for those who may like to thumb through the books before purchase. The Curious Heart Shop is a new business in town centered around holistic items and services. The store is stocked with natural body care, crystals, custom essential oils, handmade art and jewelry, clothing and more. The shop is helping us to distribute our books with all donations going directly back to the Cranford 86 Project. If you stop in for a tribute book or a self-care item, let them know you saw it in the Cranford Monthly.



RABBI PAUL KERBEL TO LEAD NEW JERSEY CONSERVATIVE RABBIS

The Rabbinical Assembly New Jersey Region

The New Jersey Region of the Rabbinical Assembly, the organization of Conservative/ Masorti Rabbis of the Conservative Movement of Judaism, has tapped Rabbi Paul Kerbel, Rabbi of Temple Beth El Mekor Chayim of Cranford to lead the New Jersey Region for the next two years. Rabbi Kerbel will be joined by Cecilia Beyer of Bridgewater as Vice-President and Matthew Nover of East Windsor Secretary/Treasurer. Rabbi Jay Kornsgold, the International President of the Rabbinical Assembly and Rabbi of Beth El Synagogue, East Windsor, installed Rabbi Kerbel. Rabbi Sheryl Katzman, Chief Engagement Officer of the Rabbinical Assembly, shared a meaningful Torah

In his Installation remarks, Rabbi Kornsgold, noted Rabbi Kerbel's many contributions to The Rabbinical Assembly over his forty years in the Rabbinate serving on the national body's Convention and Derech Eretz Committees and his appointment to the Social Justice Commission, currently serving on its Food Insecurity Sub-committee. "Rabbi Kerbel provides wise counsel to the Rabbinical Assembly with valuable advice and suggestions on how the Rabbinical Assembly can serve its rabbis and congregations and brief its members on many of the issues of the day."

In addition, Rabbi Kerbel serves on the Israel Allocations Committee of the Jewish Federation of MetroWest, NJ and as Chair of the newly formed Rabbinic Advisory Council of the New York/New Jersey Region of the Anti-Defamation League. Rabbi Kerbel works very closely with the clergy of Union County where the Conservative and Reform communities sponsor an annual Shabbat in the Park at the JCC of Central New Jersey (this year on July 25th) and its annual joint Selichot Service ushering in the High Holy Days (this year on September 13th).

Rabbi Kerbel succeeds Rabbi Esther Reed, the Chief Experience Officer of Rutgers Hillel. Under Rabbi Reed's leadership, the Region emerged from the pandemic to return to several in-person meetings: at Rutgers Hillel to discuss the rise of antisemitism and anti-Israel activity on the college campus and how to respond to it,

Rabbi Reed and Rabbi Kerbel hosted a High Holy Day seminar for colleagues to discuss themes of sermons for the High Holy Days and how to navigate the many issues relating to the aftermath of October 7th in our rabbinic messages. OFFICER NICOLETTE TUFANO RECEIVES "TOP COP" AWARD FROM MADD

Cranford Police Officer Nicolette Tufano was recently recognized for her outstanding work in impaired driving enforcement. Officer Tufano was awarded the 2024 "Top Cop" award by Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD) in recognition of her continued efforts in detecting and arresting drunk and impaired drivers. MADD presents one "Top Cop" award per county.

Officer Tufano earned the award after leading all Union County police officers with 11 impaired driving arrests. A two-year veteran of the Cranford Police Department, she is currently assigned to the Patrol Division. In total, the Cranford Police Department reported 60 impaired driving arrests in 2024. "Every day, about 37 people in the United States die in drunk driving crashes — that's one person every 39 minutes," according to MADD.

Cranford Police Chief Matthew Nazzaro stated, "The Cranford Police Department continuously strives to improve vehicle and pedestrian safety by removing impaired drivers from our roadways. This is a small note of gratitude for the efforts that all of our officers put forth each day to make our community safer."

Each year, MADD honors law enforcement officers for the number of impaired driving arrests made, along with recognizing other law enforcement professionals and MADD volunteers for their life-saving efforts. Every impaired driver removed from the road represents a potential life

MADD's core mission is to end drunk and drugged driving, support the victims of these

violent crimes, and prevent underage drinking and drug use. The organization pursues these goals through a multi-pronged approach that includes advocating for stronger laws, promoting anti-impaired driving technology, leading prevention efforts, and providing support services to victims and survivors.

One night, police were called after Jayden was found alone and barefoot at a gas station. He was removed from his parents and is now living in foster care. A judge assigned a Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) volunteer to Jayden and now he has someone who listens, shows up, and stands up for him.

Jayden is one of more than 500 children removed from home in Union and Passaic counties due to abuse and neglect. Living in foster care and separated from all they've known, each child needs a caring, consistent adult in their corner to protect their best interests while in care. Is that you?

Fall training to become a CASA volunteer starts mid-September and will be held at the Linden Library. The first step is to attend an information session. Register now casapassaicunion.org/info-session for one of the following: Friday, August 1 and Wednesday, August 6, both at 12 pm at the Child Focus office in Elizabeth, 1143 East Jersey Street, 2nd Floor;

Wednesday, August 6 at 5:30 pm at the Linden Library; Monday, August 11 at 5:30 pm, Rahway Library; Wednesday, August 13 at 12 pm at the Child Focus office in Elizabeth, 1143 East Jersey Street, 2nd Floor; Wednesday, August 13 at 5:30 pm at the Plainfield Library; Monday, August 18 at 12 pm at the Child Focus office in Elizabeth, 1143 East Jersey Street, 2nd Floor; Monday, August 18 at 5:30 pm at the Colleen Fraser Building in Westfield; and Wednesday, August 20 at 5 pm, Mountainside Library.

CASA volunteers are trained advocates who visit the child monthly and have court-ordered access to all parties in the case. Supported by CASA staff, advocates make fact-based observations about outstanding needs or concerns and make recommendations to the court. The CASA volunteer is often the only consistent person in the child's life. Applicants must be at least 21, be able to communicate effectively both orally and in writing, have computer skills, pass a background check, and complete the 36-hour training. CASA of Passaic and Union Counties is a program of Child Focus, which prioritizes the needs and well-being of infants, children, and teens impacted by, or at risk of, abuse or neglect. LANDSCAPE WITH BIRDS IN MIND

The Raptor Trust

How many Eastern Screech Owls do we currently have at The Raptor Trust? Apparently ALL of them! Most of these owlets were displaced after the trees that held their nests were cut down.

Cutting down trees and landscaping especially during nesting season - can destroy active nests, scare off parents, and even injure adult birds during a critical time.

Most birds nest between March and August. Even small projects - like pruning shrubs or pulling out vines - can have a devastating result on a nest.

Here's how you can help:

- Delay major trimming until fall
- Check for nests before cutting or clearing
- Leave a few brush piles

- Avoid pesticides and non-native plants

These small steps can make all the difference for birds trying to raise their families nearby—or young birds in the first days of their lives.

The Raptor Trust is a 501(c)(3) not for profit organization which provides free medical care to thousands of orphaned or injured birds each year. Our infirmary staff is available seven days a week during daylight hours to admit injured birds, but we must rely on the people who find them to bring them to us for care.
