LANDSCAPE WITH BIRDS IN MIND

The Raptor Trust

How many Eastern Screech Owls do we currently have at The Raptor Trust? Apparently ALL of them! Most of these owlets were displaced after the trees that held their nests were cut down.

Cutting down trees and landscaping - especially during nesting season - can destroy active nests, scare off parents, and even injure adult birds during a critical time.

Most birds nest between March and August. Even small projects - like pruning shrubs or pulling out vines - can have a devastating result on a nest.

Here's how you can help:


- Delay major trimming until fall
- Check for nests before cutting or clearing

- Leave a few brush piles
- birds and critters love them
- Avoid pesticides and non-native plants

These small steps can make all the difference for birds trying to raise their families nearby—or young birds in the first days of their lives.

The Raptor Trust is a 501(c)(3) not for profit organization which provides free medical care to thousands of orphaned or injured birds each year. Our infirmary staff is available seven days a week during daylight hours to admit injured birds, but we must rely on the people who find them to bring them to us for care.

BECOME A LITERACY NEW JERSEY VOLUNTEER TUTOR

Literacy New Jersey-Union and Middlesex Counties announces its Tutor Training Program. There will be a information session on Wednesday August 6 at 6 p.m. If you are interested in registering for tutor training, you must attend one of the information session.

The Tutor Training Program will begin on Tuesday August 19th and will provide tutor trainees with the tools and strategies necessary for working with adult students in one of four categories: English As A Second Language, High School Equivalency, Basic Skills or Job Skill/Digital Literacy.

All training sessions will be conducted online via Zoom. The five required training sessions will take place on August 19, 26, Sept. 2, 9, 16 from 6 pm to 8 pm.

After completing the training sessions, tutors are matched with a small group of adult students from the growing waiting list of students who need to improve their literacy skills. Tutors meet with their students online for 2 hours per week. After meeting your students, tutor trainees may be matched with a tutor mentor to guide them through their first lesson plans. New tutor volunteers are asked to make a commitment of at least 50 hours of instruction with students.

Literacy New Jersey provides ongoing

supervision and support to tutors in the form of free Professional Development workshops on specific topics such as Health Literacy, ESL Conversation, Small Group Instruction and Job Readiness.

To volunteer, you must be at least 18 years old, able to speak English and willing to tutor in Union County or Middlesex County. You do not need to have any teaching experience and you do not need to speak a foreign language. The

training will provide volunteers with techniques and strategies for working with adult learners, as well as sample instructional materials and activities. There is a \$25 registration fee to cover the cost of books and materials. Literacy New Jersey is a non-profit organization.

KENILWORTH'S DISAPPEARING HILLS - PART II

Tin Kettle Hill, 186 feet above sea level (ASL), the subject of Part I, is gone. But a good portion of the second highest point in town at 166 feet ASL, is what many refer to as Water Tower Hill. This hill, too, has played a significant role in the town's history. Much, however, was excavated away in the 1940s creating a deep gap at the end of N. 21st St. at Ok St.

When Upsala College came to Kenilworth (then known as New Orange) in 1898, it first headquartered in the old Benedict farmhouse near the NE corner of the Boulevard and N. 20th St., about the site of today's Charlie's Hot Dogs. In 1899 it moved to a new campus on a hill located on at the very end of N. 21st St. It was dubbed College Hill.

Today, what's left of College Hill people call Water Tower Hill. Some in error, call it Tin Kettle Hill. The last of Tin Kettle Hill was hauled away in 1906 as noted in Part I of this series.

When the college moved to East Orange in 1924, the hill with its 14 acres of land, was acquired by the Ku Klux Klan. The hill and its buildings were used for Klan headquarters, meetings, picnics (some open to the public), rallies with cross burnings and fireworks, openair concerts (often open to the public), and other events. The Borough seized ownership of the hill and surrounding property in the 1930s when the Klan failed to pay the property taxes. The former college gymnasium became a tavern - the Sycamore. When the owner tried to keep operating the tavern there the town turned him down. The business relocated to the rear of the old Kramer-Ring Building at the NE corner of the Boulevard and N. 21st St. and became the Sycamore Bar and Grill, owned for years by resident Nick Caruso. Today it's Ava's Kitchen and Bar.

In the late 1930s, about 6.5 acres, including College Hill, were acquired by the Plainfield Union Water Co. – now owned by the American Water Co. The remaining land was in the hands of the Borough and some parts became an area

Tin Kettle Hill, 186 feet above sea level of Union County's Black Brook Park. There was aSL), the subject of Part I, is gone. But a good a time when the Tuscan Dairy of Union used some of the land for cow grazing.

In 1940, the water company erected a 105-foot tank at the hill's top. The tank's top was at 271 ft. ASL. Then, N. 21st St. was one continuous unpaved road to the top of the hill. Trucks and workers got to the top of the hill up that road. Originally painted black, the tower is a light blue in an effort to blend in with the sky. In the late 1940s an excavation project took place that left an expansive gap at the end N. 21st St. No longer was there a road to the top of the hill.

The earth moving also resulted in hollowing out a vast area at the ends of N. 17th to N. 19th streets down to Shallcross Pond. This created an amphitheater of sorts where the Black Brook Park ball field and soccer field are now located. Where did the dirt go? Some have suggested it was used to help build the Garden State Parkway.

In the early 1950s some of the land at the end of N. 18th and 19th streets were set aside by the town for the local Girl Scouts. There they established Camp Wild Cherry and eventually built "The Girl Scout Cabin." Both existed for well over 50 years. Now they are gone

Some "lower land" at the end of N. 21st St. off N. Michigan Ave. was acquired in the 1960s by brothers Ralph and Fred Vitale. They erected 15 homes on new streets they created: Upsala Ct. and Via Vitale. They called their development College Estates.
