OVER \$185,000 IN SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED LOCALLY

The Summit Foundation is proud to announce the awarding of over \$185,000 in scholarships to more than 60 students in said Martha Sayre, Scholarship Committee Chair, "but even the Summit, NJ area this year, empowering them to pursue higher education.

Every year, the Foundation partners with generous donors to provide financial support that helps students cover not only tuition but the many other costs of college life, such as books, dorm supplies, and living expenses. This support allows students to attend schools of their choice, to live on campus, and to take on fewer student loans.

"Before I even applied to colleges, I remember how afraid I was of not being able to afford an education after high school," shared April Sanchez, a rising senior at Gettysburg College and recipient of the Elevating Summit Students Scholarship. "Never did I imagine how many resources there were for people like me. With pride I say today that because of foundations like these, I have traded my fears for hope and gratitude... Not only am I a better friend, daughter, student, employee, and overall person, but I am also an even more hopeful and driven person than I was before."

This year also marks the launch of a new scholarship: Red and Terry Ahern Scholarship, created by the Ahern family to honor the legacy of two longtime Summit residents who were deeply committed to education. The endowment, established after a conversation between the Ahern family and The Summit Foundation, provides long-term support for students pursuing careers in education.

"It's been a joy to support these well-deserving students," more so, it's amazing to see them grow during their college years as they come back to check in." She added: "It's inspiring to see how determined these students are to go to college and how the scholarships can really change the direction of their lives. One student received a full-ride scholarship in real time, just as we were on the phone preparing to accept admission to his second-choice school. Moments like that stay with you."

BUSY YEAR SO FAR FOR 1ST AID SQUAD

Summit Volunteer First Aid Squad

The Summit Volunteer First Aid Squad (SVFAS) had an exceptionally active and community-focused start to 2025, responding to nearly 1,200 emergency calls and providing vital services and outreach throughout the city.

Between January 1 and June 30, SVFAS volunteers answered 1,196 emergency patient calls, delivering prompt, professional medical care to residents and visitors alike. From medical emergencies and accidents to mutual aid in surrounding towns, the all-volunteer team remained on call 24/7—365 days a year—without ever billing a patient.

In addition to emergency response, the squad was a visible and vital presence at numerous special events in Summit, providing standby crews to ensure public safety. These events included the Summit High School graduation ceremony, the Memorial Day parade, 4th of July celebrations and fireworks and various community festivals and athletic events.

Beyond its emergency services, SVFAS continued its commitment to community

wellness and education. The squad offered two free glucose and blood pressure screening events, providing residents with important preventative health information. SVFAS also hosted several local Brownie and Girl Scout troops, helping young scouts earn their first aid badges through hands-on demonstrations and educational tours of the squad building and ambulances.

"This has been a busy and rewarding six months," said SVFAS Chief Laura Benevento. "Our volunteers have gone above and beyond to serve the community—not just in emergencies, but through education, outreach, and event support. We're proud to be a trusted and dependable part of Summit."

All services provided by the Summit Volunteer First Aid Squad are funded entirely by donations and grants. The organization receives no taxpayer funding and relies on the generosity of residents and local businesses to sustain its life-saving mission.

How many Eastern Screech Owls do we currently have at The Raptor Trust? Apparently ALL of them! Most of these owlets were displaced after the trees that held their nests were cut down.

Cutting down trees and landscaping - especially during nesting season - can destroy active nests, scare off parents, and even injure adult birds during a critical time.

Most birds nest between March and August. Even small projects - like pruning shrubs or pulling out vines - can have a devastating result on a nest.

Here's how you can help:

- Delay major trimming until fall
- Check for nests before cutting or clearing

- Leave a few brush piles
- birds and critters love them
- Avoid pesticides and non-native plants

These small steps can make all the difference for birds trying to raise their families nearby—or young birds in the first days of their lives.

The Raptor Trust is a 501(c)(3) not for profit organization which provides free medical care to thousands of orphaned or injured birds each year. Our infirmary staff is available seven days a week during daylight hours to admit injured birds, but we must rely on the people who find them to bring them to us for care.
