INAUGURAL MULTICULTURAL MUSIC FESTIVAL - SEPT 27

The Multicultural and Heritage Music Festival will bring a wide range of ethnic entertainment to Roselle Park on Saturday, September 27. Presented by the Borough of Roselle Park, Diversity and Inclusion Committee and Greg Johnson Civic Association, the festival will run from noon to 5 pm at Michael Mauri Park on Chestnut Street. It will feature food trucks, a CPR information station, local displays including an exhibit highlighting Roselle Park's historic railroad system and performers celebrating diverse styles of music from around the world.

FEATURED ENTERTAINMENT AT THE FESTIVAL WILL INCLUDE:

3:45 PM -- Afro Dominicano. Headlining the festival is a Latin fusion band performing what is called AfroCaribbean soul. Its traditional folkloric roots music from the Dominican Republic incorporates Afro beats, reggae, calypso, samba, funk, punk rock and other Caribbean rhythms. In addition to original songs, they include covers such as Bill Withers' Just the Two of Us and Amy Winehouse's Valerie. The band, acclaimed worldwide, features vocal, guitar, bass, accordion, drum, conga, guira and tambora.

2:20 PM – Verdict. If you like to dance and love reggae and soca music, Verdict is the band for you. Verdict is fronted by vocalist and keyboardist Roland from Monserrat, whose enthusiasm is infectious as he leads the audience to dance along with him as he plays. Guitarist Raga comes from Trinidad-Tobago and bassist Marcellino from Panama. Johnny Youth is the band leader and drummer. Their story continues as does their unending quest to play the transcendent jam, to create the perfect moment, to revel in shared experience with their fans.

1:00 PM - Pradhanica. A contemporary Kathak dance production, Pradhanica, which means "female leader," is led by Kathak dancer, choreographer and percussionist Jin Won. Its compositions use Indian rhythms for the African djembe, Spanish cajon, with Indian sitar and tabla. Exploring emotions of anger, joy, compassion and peace, Pradhanica shows the pure rhythmic aspect and emotional resonance of the dance form.

12:00 PM – Chris Bolger and the Jamesons Gang. This North Jerseybased quartet has been bringing Gaelic-flavored rock, folk and ballads to pubs, festivals and other events in New York and New Jersey for many years. In addition to guitar, bass and drums, they incorporate Irish music staples such as the bouzouki, mandolin and banjo to provide a crowdpleasing mix of traditional and modern tunes.

Another highlight of the festival will be an exhibit showcasing the three railroads that nurtured Roselle Park's growth into a vibrant community. The Tristate Railway Historical Society is the curator of this display.

KENILWORTH'S DISAPPEARING HILLS - PART III - "CAMEL BACK" HILLS

Ever hear of the "camel back" hills in Kenilfact, it was a term coined by old timers who lived in the New Orange Park section of Kenilworth in the early 1900s. That's the area of Kenilworth consisting of the older portions of Newark and Passaic avenues; and S. 23rd and S. 25th streets; and Arthur Ter.

I discovered the term "camel back" some years (1917-2018) of Arthur Ter., and Lillian "Lillie" Gaughan Greim (1908-2008), who at one time something I never knew.

Connie mentioned two hills. One was at the worth? It's a very old and rarely used term. In top of Newark Ave. and one on the Boulevard at S. 24th St. Looking slightly northwest from the top of the Newark Ave. hill (aka Water Works Hill) one could see a hill on the Boulevard near S. 24th St. It's no longer there. "As kids," she chuckled, "We called them 'camel back' hills because they looked like camel humps." Some months later I had occasion to speak with Lillie. ago when I spoke with Connie Arthur Davis Lillie said, "Sure, that's what it was – two humps – just like looking at a camel." She giggled, too. In the 1930s two old-time families – the Rus-

lived on Newark Ave. These centurions taught me cansky's and the von Ohlen's – lived almost across the street from the hill on the Boulevard.

Their homes no longer stand. Bill von Ohlen, Jr. (1923-2010) gave me a photo showing the hill in the 1930s with him and a friend in a wagon.

Research has not determined when the hill was excavated away. It appears that it may have been in the late 1930s or early 1940s as the site was used for an aviation spotters' tower during WWII. Not only was the earth of the hill carted away but between S. 23rd and S. 24th streets there was a large hole until 1960 where the municipal building now stands suggesting it was scooped out as part of the same earth removal project.

Water Works Hill – the other hump of the camel's back – was the name for the Newark

Ave. hill in New Orange Park. The hilltop is 108 feet above level (ASL). James Arthur (1866-1931) began developing the New Orange Park enclave of over 80 homes in the early 1900s. The first was occupied in 1906. At the top of the hill Arthur erected a 60 ft. tall water tower (aka a standpipe) to provide well water to the residents of his development. That's how the hill got its nickname. The tower top was 168 ft. ASL and was in the back yard of his 7,000 sq. ft., 27-room mansion into which he, his wife Mary, and 8 of their 11 children moved into in 1910.

Arthur also constructed on the downside of the hill towards Michigan Ave. a power house to provide electricity to those homes. It stood at about 633 Newark Ave.

All of four of those landmarks are gone – the hill on the Boulevard, the mansion, the water tower, and the power house. But one of the camel back humps remains – the Newark Ave. Hill, aka Water Works Hill.
