OFFICER MILLER RECEIVES OUTPOURING OF SUPPORT AFTER ACCIDENT

Borough of Roseland

On Friday, June 20th, Roseland Police Officer Mark Miller was on duty, stationed at the intersection of Livingston Avenue and Becker Farm Road. Unfortunately, at approximately 4 p.m., a routine shift would take a dramatic turn and turned into anything but an average day on the job.

Another vehicle slammed into the driver's side of the police car where Officer Miller was sitting, and after emergency personnel responded, it was determined he needed to be airlifted to University Hospital in Newark.

An initial surgery was successful immediately following the incident, and as of this writing several more surgeries have taken place since then will likely be needed in the days, weeks, and maybe even months ahead. We are pleased to

report that Officer Miller has feeling in his hands and legs, which given the way the accident transpired, is truly remarkable and encouraging.

Co-workers of Officer Miller have created a GoFundMe page to raise funds to help pay for his medical bills, mental health counseling, offset any loss of income, and support his family, including his two year old daughter. You can

SEARCHING FOR BESSIE BOSWORTH’S PORTRAIT

The Sons of the American Legion Squadron 140 in Millburn has launched a public search to locate and reunite two historically significant portraits, those of siblings Guy R. Bosworth and Bessie Bosworth, whose service spanned both World War I, and World War II.

Guy R. Bosworth, a Millburn resident, pharmacist, and member of the Army Hospital Corps, was the first New Jersey serviceman to lose his life in World War I when the troop transport S.S. Antilles was sunk by a German submarine on October 17, 1917. The Millburn American Legion Hall proudly bears his name in recognition of his sacrifice.

His sister, Bessie Bosworth, served as a U.S. Army Nurse during World War II and went on to become Millburn’s first full-time health officer in 1948, reflecting the vital roles local women played in the war effort and in post-war civic life.

Recently, both portraits were part of the

Bosworth family estate sale. The Squadron successfully purchased Guy’s uniformed photograph, but Bessie’s had already been sold before they could secure it. The group now seeks the community’s help to locate Bessie’s portrait so the two can be reunited and displayed side-by-side in the Millburn American Legion Hall.

“Reuniting these portraits is about more than just finding a photograph,” said Squadron

Commander Daniel Cannon. “It’s about restoring a piece of Millburn’s history and honoring a family whose service and sacrifice spanned two world wars. Guy and Bessie’s legacy deserves to be remembered together.”

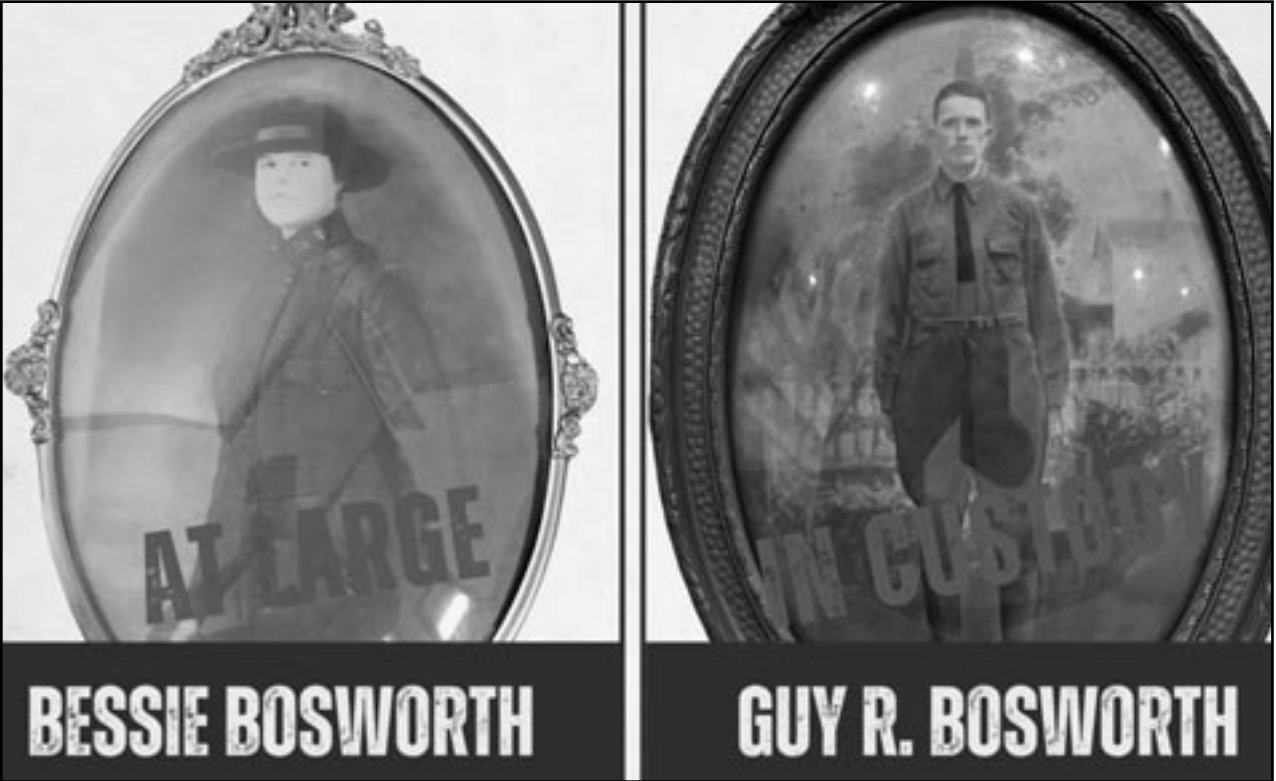

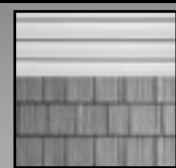

DRIVERS: BE PREPARED WHEN SHARING THE ROAD WITH SCHOOL BUSES

Livingston Police Department
The beginning of the school year brings not only school buses, but pedestrians, bicycles, and new drivers. The Livingston Police Department reminds residents that when school is in session, more school buses are on the roads.

Captain Russell Mueller of the Livingston Police Department reminds residents, “Even if you don’t see any students, never pass a stopped school bus or ignore the flashing red lights. It’s against the law and doing so could result in tragedy.”

Speed limit reductions are posted in school zones, but it’s up to drivers to be alert when approaching any school bus. The Livingston Police Department reminds residents of the following when driving near a school bus:

Focus: Pay close attention to the school bus and other traffic; follow traffic rules and be prepared to slow down or stop.

Flashing Yellow Lights: When a school bus has yellow lights flashing, slow down and prepare to stop. This is true whether you’re behind the school bus or approaching from the opposite direction. Never speed up or pass a bus once the yellow lights are flashing.

Flashing Red Lights: If you’re approaching a school bus that has flashing red lights – from either direction – you must stop at least 25 feet away from the bus.

Extended Stop Arm: Stop; do not pass a bus in either direction on a roadway without a median when the Stop Arm is extended.

On roadways with a center median or grass

median, such as Route 10 or Northfield Road:
Slow Down: Drivers approaching a school bus from the opposite direction on a roadway with a center or grass median – such as on Route 10 or Northfield Road – must slow down to 10 m.p.h., but are not required to stop.

“We ask all our residents to exercise additional caution and be patient with school buses on the road and students crossing the street,” continued

Mueller. “The beginning of the school year can be challenging for everyone as we adjust to the school traffic, but safety comes first.”
In New Jersey, a driver convicted of improperly passing a school bus will receive 5 points and may have to pay a fine, may lose their license for 30 days, and may be sentenced to up to 15 days in jail or 15 days of community service.

The Livingston Police Department is pleased to announce its Second Annual Community Block Party, happening on Sunday, September 21st, from 1:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. at the Oval. This year’s event promises to be even bigger and better, by once again bringing together three long-standing community traditions.

The Police Department is teaming up with Youth Appreciation Week’s Family Fun Festival and the Livingston Fire Department’s Annual Open House to present an event meant to foster stronger ties between neighbors and law enforcement, building a true sense of community.

The community gathering will feature an incredible array of free, family-friendly activities, including a petting zoo, craft tent, pony rides, chalk walk, demonstrations from robotics

programs and a touch-a-truck experience. There will also be free food and soft drinks, rides, carnival games, giveaways, balloon twisting, fun face painting, and exciting law enforcement displays. Attendees will have the chance to explore Livingston Fire Department fire trucks, Livingston First Aid Squad ambulances and witness a live extrication demonstration.

The Walking Club will meet from 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. on Fridays from September 12 through November 7, 2025, weather permitting.

The Walking Club is free and open to adults over the age of 18. Participants will meet in the free public parking lot at McLoone’s Boathouse. The walk is 1.75 miles around the reservoir, which should take about one hour.

Walking is a great way to get some exercise and offers many health benefits: it can help you maintain a healthy weight, reduce joint pain, improve balance, lower the risk of high blood pressure, and more.

NEW GARBAGE COLLECTION COMPANY GUIDES AND CONTACT

Livingston Township

Beginning September 1, 2025, garbage collection in the Township of Livingston will be handled by F. Basso, Jr. Rubbish Removal, Inc.

CONTACT THE GARBAGE COMPANY DIRECTLY

Starting September 1, all questions about garbage collection - including missed pickups, service concerns, and general inquiries - should be directed to

F. Basso, Jr. Rubbish Removal, Inc.
at 862-452-4664

Residents should not contact the township with garbage service issues. Instead, the garbage vendor should be contacted directly for the fastest and most effective assistance.

CHANGES TO BULK PICKUP

Residents will now be limited to a maximum of five bulky items per household each bulk pickup. The weight of each individual item must not exceed 150 pounds. Items must be able to fit in a garbage truck.

Bulk pick up items include, but are not be limited to: furniture; plastic appliances; rugs and carpets rolled and tied in four foot lengths weighing no more than 50 pounds; clothing; toys; screens; doors; branches three to four inches in diameter in bundles (not to exceed four feet in length); garden and lawn trimmings in bags; and automobile tires removed from the rim.

Bulk pickup will still occur on the last regular collection day of the month based on each section.

OPTIONAL REAR YARD PICKUP

F. Basso, Jr. Rubbish Removal, Inc. will offer optional rear yard (back door) pickup for a monthly fee paid directly by interested residents. The cost is \$28.50 per month for up to three garbage cans. Residents can enroll/set up existing accounts at fbassoinc.com. Billing questions can be directed to 973-868-8496.

WHAT RESIDENTS NEED TO KNOW

- Collection days will not change.
- Garbage should be placed curbside before 6:00 a.m. on your collection day, but not before 4:00 p.m. the day prior.
- All garbage should be bagged and secured inside a garbage container weighing no more than 50 pounds.
- Residents may place out up to three 30-gallon containers each collection day.
- Do not block garbage containers with parked vehicles or other obstacles.
- Please note that recycling and hazardous waste collection are handled by separate vendors. Waste Industries remains the township's recycling collection vendor.
