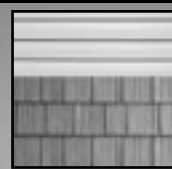

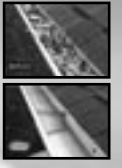

COUNTDOWN TO JULY 4TH, 2026

America250 - In New Jersey & Nationwide

Next year, on July 4, 2026, the United States of America will commemorate and celebrate the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. This historic milestone is an opportunity to pause and reflect on our country's past, to honor the contributions of all Americans, and to also look ahead towards the future that we want to create and leave behind for the next generation of Americans.

On the federal level, America250 is a nonpartisan initiative working to engage every American in commemorating the 250th anniversary of our country. This multi-year effort, from now through July 4, 2026, is an opportunity to pause and reflect on our nation's past, honor the contributions of all Americans, and look ahead toward the future we want to create for the next generation and beyond.

In New Jersey, RevolutionNJ has been set up and is a partnership between the New Jersey Historical Commission (NJHC), a division of the New Jersey Department of State, and the nonprofit Crossroads of the American Revolution Association to plan the commemoration of the 250th anniversary of the American Revolution in New Jersey.

Notice to Release Title V Permit Renewal and Environmental Justice Impact Statement and Intent to Hold Public Information Session for Title V Operating Permit Program Interest (PI) No. 41712, Title V Operating Permit Renewal Activity No. BOP240005 and Title V Operating Permit Modifications Activity No. BOP240004, EJ Project No. 35009928

NJDEP Environmental Justice Regulations
Notice is hereby given, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 7:1C-4.1 and the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) Environmental Justice (EJ) regulations that the Merck site, located at 126 East Lincoln Avenue, Rahway, New Jersey, intends to hold a public information session on October 22, 2025 at 6 p.m. to share details about its Title V permit applications and Environmental Justice Impact Statement (EJIS).

The Merck site is classified by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and NJDEP as a major Title V facility. Title V of the Clean Air Act (CAA) directs States – like New Jersey – to develop and enforce an operating permit program that set air emission limits from specific sources. This Title V operating permit is a legal document that is issued to all major sources of air emissions and cites what a facility must do to control sources of air emissions. Merck operates with a Title V operating permit under the EPA CAA.

In September 2020, the New Jersey State Legislature signed an EJ law that requires the NJDEP to explore public health impacts and environmental stressors during review of environmental permits related to new, upgraded and expanded facilities. Regulations implementing this law were adopted by NJDEP in April 2023. The Merck site is one of the many facilities in Union County and New Jersey that is subject to the new EJ Law, as it is a major-source permit holder located within an area designated as an “overburdened community” or OBC.

The Merck site submitted its Title V renewal application to the NJDEP on May 23, 2024. This application incorporates various permit modification details that reflect new and pre-existing equipment for multiple projects at the Merck site. An EJIS is an extensive review of environmental and public health conditions in an overburdened community that identifies and analyzes: existing/adverse environmental public health stressors; cumulative stressors and a facility’s potential contributions to stressors; and mitigations that the facility can take to avoid adverse cumulative impacts to the community. The public can view a copy of Merck’s EJIS at the Linden Free Public Library (31 E

Henry St, Linden, NJ 07036) and Rahway Public Library (2 City Hall Plaza, Rahway, NJ) or online at the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection’s website: <https://dep.nj.gov/ej/meetings/#union>.

Merck will hold a public information session on October 22, 2025 at 6 p.m. at the Linden Free Public Library – Columbia Bank Room located on 31 E Henry St, Linden, NJ 07036 and on Zoom. Merck will accept public comments at the information session and during a 90-day comment period from August 22 to November 22, 2025. EARL C. HOAGLAND REMAINS THE MOST SUCCESSFUL COACH IN THE ANNALS OF RAHWAY HIGH SCHOOL SPORTS

If one were to peruse the record books of Rahway High School's football and baseball teams, the name Earl C. Hoagland stands out as the coach who amassed the most impressive records. In Hoagland's 15 year tenure as football coach (1938-1952), he guided his squads to an over-all record of 96-26-11 and earned 8 sectional titles. His baseball teams won seven sectional crowns, the Greater Newark Tournament in 1950 and 1957 and four Union County championships (1950, 1956, 1958, and 1961) during his 32 years in the dugout (1940-1971.)

The Rahway High football team was a dominant force in the state in the infant days of high school football until the late 1920s. Early coaches included Walter Short (1910-1914), Earl Walters (1915-1922), Al Brooks (1923-1925), and Austin Singer (1926-1930), all who guided their teams to great success. Coach Brooks alone captured two state championships in his three seasons in Rahway. However, during the 1930s, the teams fell on hard times, and Rahway fans demanded a change of the coaching staff to bring RHS back to glory.

They found their coach in Earl Hoagland. Hoagland, a graduate of Purdue University's class of 1935, had played three sports in his collegiate career, but his true call was in coaching. After graduation, he spent a year as an assistant coach at Clemson University and a year later came north to lead North Plainfield High to a Somerset County championship. It was Rahway High's good fortune that the Board of Education saw something special in the young coach and hired him in January, 1938. He was also hired to develop the intramural baseball squad which was slated to become a varsity sport in 1940.

It took only two seasons before Hoagland started his remarkable run of successful campaigns. After winning the final contest of his second season, in which the team ended 4-3-2, Hoagland's teams would post a 29 game undefeated streak. While the streak ultimately ended in a 7-0 loss to Morristown in 1943, it wasn't before Rahway captured Group 3 Sectional championships in 1941 and 1942. At the time, the streak was the longest in the history of Union County football.

His success didn't stop with the end of his streak. A firm believer in hard work and proper execution of fundamentals, his teams would go 46-5-2 from 1947-1952, and in all six seasons, the Rahway gridders would be awarded championships in their state section. Hoagland would go out on a high note posting a 9-0 record in his final season in 1952.

Coach Hoagland's resignation in December, 1952 naturally caught everyone in the city by surprise and rumors surrounding his departure from the football program were rampant. To quell the controversy, Hoagland placed a statement in the local papers saying, "During that fifteen year period, the effort has been mentally and physically exhausting." His exhaustion may have

stemmed from the fact that during the years that he was coaching football he was also spending almost four months each spring coaching the baseball team.

Hoagland's results on the diamond were almost as impressive as those on the gridiron. Baseball as a varsity sport in Rahway started in 1940, and one can only imagine the difficulty of competing against teams that had been long established. Yet within only five years, Hoagland's 1944 team finished with a 13-5 record and joined Linden High as co-champions of North Jersey, Group 3 Section 2. Over the next 14 years, his teams would prove to be powerful opponents against the best in Union, Middlesex, and Essex Counties.

The heavy hitting 1950 team made Union County history by becoming the first team to win high school baseball's Triple Crown. They were named the champions of Union County, were selected sectional Group 2 champs, and best of all, won the Greater Newark Tournament. This last tournament, emblematic of the State Championship, was considered the most coveted honor in all of New Jersey high school baseball. Hoagland's teams would go on to win three more

Union County titles (1956, 1958, and 1961), and the 1957 team, although losing the final game of the county tournament, won the Greater Newark Tournament. By season's end, they were selected as the top team in the state.

In 1960, Hoagland was appointed Rahway's Director of Athletics, but his love of coaching and baseball kept him on the diamond. After the successful 1961 season, and with his best years behind him, Hoagland met with varying degrees of success until his resignation in February, 1972, ending a career spanning 32 baseball seasons. He retired from the Rahway school system at the end of the 1972 school year.

A final tribute was bestowed on Coach Hoagland before the Thanksgiving Day football game in 1981 when "Earl C. Hoagland Day" was held at Veterans Field. Many fans including former players were present. The program included speeches by Board of Education members and Rahway's mayor, Daniel L. Martin, and concluded with the naming of the new athletic field house in his honor.

It was only fitting that Coach Hoagland's Day ended with a 13-0 Rahway victory over rival Arthur L. Johnson Regional (Clark) High.

AMAZING RESOURCES IN THE RAHWAY HISTORY ROOM

Rahway Public Library

The Rahway History Room, located on the 2nd floor of the Rahway Public Library, opened on Monday, February 7, 2005 and soon became the place to go to get answers to any questions related to Rahway.

Since its opening, a total of 1,897 patrons have visited the room, phoned, or emailed requesting research assistance. Patrons primarily come from Rahway, other cities in Union County, and from many other jurisdictions throughout the state. But it's not just local people looking for information! Research has also been provided for individuals residing in thirty-six other states plus the District of Columbia, and this remarkable service has even been utilized by persons from Australia, Canada, England, France, and Serbia.

These inquisitive souls have come through the doors looking for information on a variety of topics. The following is just a sample of some that have been researched on their behalf: genealogy; obituaries; military and veteran topics; African-American topics; and histories of homes, churches, the Fire and Police Departments, industries, sports, and social and fraternal clubs; to name a few. Patrons have also sought help from the History Room to do extensive research on some of Rahway's notable citizens including Carl Sagan, Milton Friedman, Abraham Clark, Clifford Case, Nikola Tesla, Carolyn Wells, Dr. Fred Albee and the Boland brothers.

All sorts of questions are asked, but here is a sample of some of the most common: "When was my home built, and who were the previous owners?" "What happened at the Battle of Spanktown?" "What is the highest elevation in the city?" "How many car dealerships were located in Rahway?" "Are there any Sears Roebuck houses in the city?" "Is there any information on my relative who lived in Rahway in the late 1800s?" "How many taverns were in the city in the 1950s?" And "what kinds of fish can be caught in Rahway's rivers and lakes?"

These questions are answered because the Rahway History Room maintains a wide variety of available resources. Some, but not all, include: microfilm of local newspapers, 1910-2000, (which will soon be available online through a New Jersey State Library Grant); City Directories, 1873-1981; a copy of the New Jersey Historic Preservation Survey (a list of all the homes in Rahway with focus on homes built before 1911); 43 maps of the city, 1856-2022; Rahway High School Yearbooks, 1929-present; and many other primary and secondary source file-types.

But probably the most valuable resource in the History Room is Mr. Alex Shipley, a 30-year former English teacher at Rahway High, who serves as Rahway's City Historian and the library's first Research Consultant. Mr. Shipley is in the History Room on the first Monday of

each month from 3:30-7:30 p.m. and is also available to meet with patrons during the week by appointment. Please call the library today to arrange a time to speak with Mr. Shipley.

AUTUMN GARDENING CHORES & POISON IVY

Leaves of three, let it be. Hairy vines, no friend of mine. This rhyme is used to teach children how to identify and avoid Poison Ivy.

Poison ivy is a toxic vine which brings misery to millions of people that come in contact with it every year. Although we are most concerned during the summer, every part of this plant is toxic at all times of the year. Even bare stalks are poisonous in the dead of winter. Therefore if you have poison ivy in your area it is important to safely eradicate it.

Native to the eastern United States the vines can be found everywhere in local parks and forest, rambling through bushes and shrubs or climbing trees in the best of gardens, even yours. Poison Ivy thrives at the seashore where the salt water spray kills many other plants.

In the spring small bright red to reddish purple leaflets appear first. These leaflets turn a glossy green by mid-summer. Each leaf consists of three leaflets that are two to four inches long.

As summer turns to autumn this vine is often the first plant to change colors. Bright orange, red and yellow leaves make poison ivy easy to spot. These bright colors make September a perfect time to scan your property and area for Poison Ivy.

A mature vine is easy to ID at any time of the year. Often as thick as a man's wrist, the vines are covered with thousands of tiny hairs with allows it to cling to trees, growing as high as 50 to 75 feet. Look but don't touch as this will also cause a nasty rash.

Poison ivy has both male and female plants. The females produce clusters of white berries that hold on the vine throughout winter and are spread by birds that ingest the fruit.

Do not burn poison ivy to control it. The fumes are very toxic when inhaled into your lungs. This is a danger to firemen who might breathe the fumes in heavily infested areas like beach towns.

If you do have poison ivy and keep children and pets a safe distance.

Whenever using chemical control take proper precautions. Wear protection and follow the directions on the label.

AUTUMN GARDENING CHORES

Fall officially starts on September 21, but the autumn planting season in our area begins in late August and early September as temperatures drop and conditions become favorable for planting.

PLANTING TREES & SHRUBS

Trees and shrubs planted in the autumn have a major obstacle they must overcome. In a short period of time the ground will freeze and root development will come to a halt until next spring.

To help roots prepare for winter, trees and shrubs should be planted before October 1st, which is six to eight weeks before the ground freeze occurs in our areas. This gives the root systems time to adjust before the ground is frozen in mid-November.

RESEEDING AND LAWN RENOVATION

No matter how beautiful your lawn is it will greatly benefit from autumn reseeding. All plants including grass have a certain life span. As the older grass dies away it leaves spots where weeds can take hold next spring. The best way to avoid that is with thick lush growth. Since we cut our lawns often they are not able to reseed themselves.

This year the cool wet spring allowed fungus to take hold and kill large areas of lawns. That was followed by a hotter than normal summer and heat waves. These conditions left many lawns with large dead patches and in need of 'renovation'.

There is too much information to put in this article, but luckily we can get the best information from the professionals and volunteers at our Cooperative Extensions. Rutgers Cooperative Extension of Union County is our local resource. We can also utilize information from Penn State and Ohio State universities just to name a few. For example if you Google "Penn State, lawn renovations", Fact Sheets will pop up with information that has been researched and tested by the professionals. Some Extensions even have YouTube Videos on topics ranging from proper planting techniques, pruning shrubs and vegetable gardening and much more.

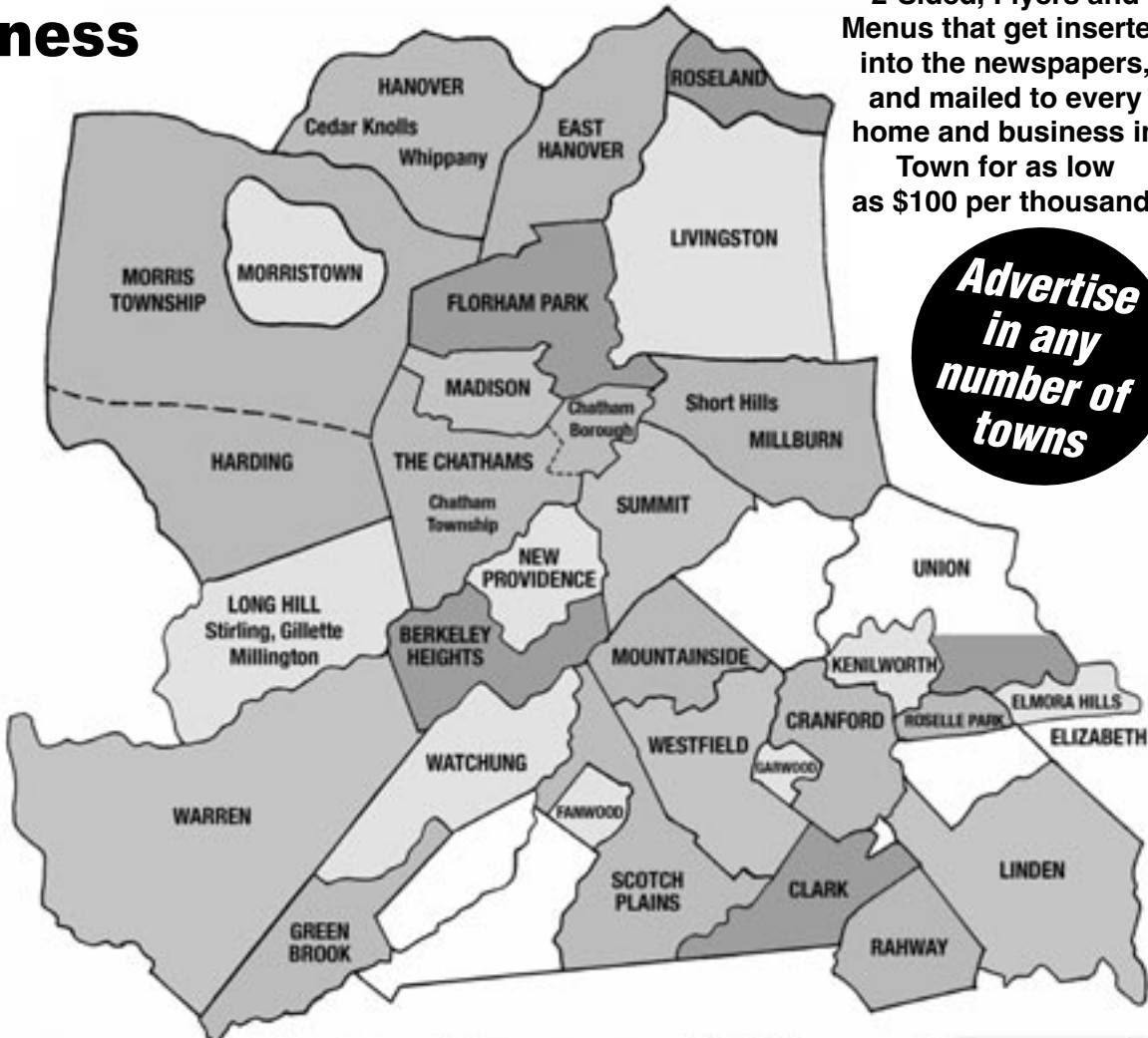
