FRAZEE HOUSE FALL ACTIVITIES AND PUMPKIN PATCH

Fanwood-Scotch Plains Rotary Club

There is an exciting line-up of Fall activities scheduled at the Frazee House Park in Scotch Plains throughout October. The site will be decorated for Halloween and the Great Pumpkin Patch will be back for its eight year! Hundreds of pumpkins will be available, and they'll be sold every day from 11am to dusk throughout the month of October.

During the weekend of October 18h and 19th there will be games for children, a Big Bake sale and many photo opportunities. These will begin on Saturday October 18th at 11 a.m. The Big Bake Sale will be back for the second year and will offer a wide variety of sweet treats including brownies, cookies, cupcakes and fall specialties. Additionally, the Frazee House will participate in Union County's annual "Four Centuries in a Weekend". Representatives will be at the Frazee site between 12 - 5 p.m. on both days with brochures, bookmarks, and an internal tour of the renovated areas of the house. History buffs can note that the Frazee House is one of the stops on the Battle of Short Hills Historic Trail as well as being renowned for the legendary confrontation between General Cornwallis and Aunt Betty Frazee.

On October 24th and 25th, the popular Ghost Walking tours will be back at the Frazee House. The pre-Halloween tours will be conducted by renowned psychic-medium Jane Doherty. Each presentation will begin with a short orientation at the restored Frazee homestead, including details about the spirit world. The 90-minute tours will proceed with a walk along the property, stopping at each "ghost hangout" to reveal the stories and secrets there. There are two tours on 10/24 at 6 p.m. and 7:45 p.m., and three tours on 10/25 at 5 p.m., 6:45 p.m. and 8:30 p.m.

Finally, October activities will end with the first ever séance at the Frazee

House, held in one of the newly renovated rooms. There will be only one session at 7 p.m. on November 1st. Seating will be limited. The séance will be led by renowned psychic-medium Jane Doherty.

All proceeds will go toward completing the renovation of the historic Frazee house. The October activities are a great opportunity for the community to visit the site and see it for themselves. OSBORN CANNONBALL HOUSE MUSEUM

The Osborn Cannonball House Will Be Open For Scotch Plains Day and for Four Centuries in a Weekend.

The Osborn Cannonball House Museum, located at 1840 Front Street in Scotch Plains, will be open to the public on Sunday, October 5th from 11:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. and for Four Centuries in a Weekend on Saturday, October 18, 2025, and Sunday, October 19, 2025 from 12:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. both days.

The museum will feature a display entitled "NJ Passengers Aboard the RMS Titanic," which will include replicas of the actual items used aboard the ship. From the museum's vast antique clothing collection, mannequins will be dressed in "Titanic era," or Edwardian, clothing. This display will have clothing representing the three classes aboard the ship.

Costumed docents will give tours of the 1750 home of the Osborn family, who witnessed and played a role in the Revolutionary War and the founding of the town of Scotch Plains. For the Four Centuries in a Weekend event, there will also be a children's craft in our craft tent along with an early Halloween treat!





LT. REYNOLDS DEFENDING AMERICA UNDER THE SEA

Lt. James Reynolds, a native of Westfield, New Jersey, serves the U.S. Navy assigned to USS Scranton, homeported at Naval Base Point Loma. As a submariner, Reynolds is part of a small percentage of Navy personnel continuing a 125-

ensure Americans' safety.

Reynolds graduated from Saint Peter's Prep in Jersey City in 2013. Additionally, Reynolds earned a bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering from the United States Naval Academy and a master's degree in cyber security, operations and leadership from the University of San Diego.

Reynolds joined the Navy eight years ago. Today, Reynolds serves as a weapons officer.

"I have two older siblings who served," Reynolds said. "I joined to follow the example they set of serving the country."

Known as America's "Apex Predators!," the Navy's submarine force operates a large fleet of technologically advanced vessels. These submarines are capable of conducting rapid defensive and offensive operations around the world, in furtherance of U.S. national security.

USS Scranton (SSN 756) is the second U.S. Navy ship to be named for Scranton, Pennsylvania. Scranton is a Los Angeles-class fast-attack submarine. Los Angeles-class submarines have been the backbone of the submarine force for the last 40 years, with approximately 23 now in commission. They are equipped with 12 Vertical Launch System tubes for firing Tomahawk cruise missiles.

Strategic deterrence is the nation's ultimate

year tradition of service under the sea to help insurance program, according to Navy officials. As a member of the submarine force, Reynolds serves aboard a platform capable of bringing the fight to enemies in defense of America and its allies.

> The U.S. Navy is celebrating its 250th birthday this year.

> According to Navy officials, "America is a maritime nation and for 250 years, America's Warfighting Navy has sailed the globe in defense of freedom."

> With 90% of global commerce traveling by sea and access to the internet relying on the security of undersea fiber optic cables, Navy officials continue to emphasize that the prosperity of the United States is directly linked to recruiting and retaining talented people from across the rich fabric of America.

> Reynolds has many opportunities to achieve accomplishments during military service.

> "My proudest accomplishment is serving as a weapons officer aboard USS Scranton," Reynolds said.

Reynolds serves a Navy that operates far forward, around the world and around the clock, promoting the nation's prosperity and security.

"Serving in the Navy means honoring this country and its Constitution to promote freedom and democracy around the world," Reynolds added.



POLICE OFFICERS ADOPT LUCKY PUPPIES THEY RESCUED

Best Friends Animal Society

In December 2024, a trio of officers with the Clark Police Department in New Jersey responded to a call from a Good Samaritan about puppies that were abandoned in a five-gallon bucket. When they arrived on the scene, the officers discovered eight tiny puppies, only a couple of weeks old, huddled together for warmth in the freezing winter temperatures.

The puppies were immediately rushed to Associated Humane Society-Newark after hours by their Animal Care Officers (ACOs) for veterinarian evaluation and treatment. They were cold, starving, severely dehydrated, and infested

with fleas.

"Deann Bowen, the Manager at AHS's Tinton Falls location and a veteran vet tech with experience in neonatal care, was able to meet our ACO's halfway up the Parkway and took them right into foster," said Danielle Mania, Chief Operating Officer of AHS-Newark.

With the puppies safely in foster care, which included round-the-clock feedings until they were able to eat on their own, the team at AHS-Newark set about finding their family. They posted the story and photos on social media the next morning, took press interviews, and raised \$40,000 to provide for the puppies' medical treatment and care.

"We did receive a few tips, but all were unsuccessful," said Mania. Once they were old enough, the puppies were sent to foster in different foster homes.

The officers were instantly interested in adopting puppies from the litter. With each passing day, they could not stop thinking about the puppies' wellbeing and regularly checked in on them. When they were all spayed/neutered and ready to adopt in March 2025, there was no need to list them all. Three of the puppies - now named Ozzy, Capri, and Zeus - had already found their loving homes with the three police officers that saved their lives on that cold winter day. Officer Ronny Taborda (adopted Capri), Detective Bruce McDonald (adopted Zeus), and Detective Paul

Sosnowski (adopted Ozzy).

"The Clark PD has an adorable group chat to keep in touch with all of the adopters, and they frequently have play dates with each other," said Mania. "This situation was really a testament as to how we work together as a team across the entire organization to save lives and find pets homes."

This full circle moment highlights modern animal services practices, and the pet lifesaving work that police and animal control officers do in their communities. It is also a reminder of the importance of microchipping pets and having them wear up-to-date identification tags, so in the event they become lost, they can be quickly reunited with their owners. Data indicates that 52% of lost dogs and two out of every five cats are successfully returned when microchipped, which reduces the amount of time lost pets stay in shelters that often already have limited space.

Best Friends Animal Society, a leading national animal welfare organization working to end the killing of cats and dogs in America's shelters, is partnering with AHS-Newark to help them achieve their pet lifesaving goals. Best Friends' most recent data shows that New Jersey is on the verge of becoming a no-kill state with an 89% save rate. There are just ten shelters in the state that need to save less than 100 pets to achieve no-kill. For more information, visit bestfriends.org.

SMALL BUSINESS MENTORING HELPS MILITARY VETERANS SUCCEED

According to research, 80 percent of the 1.7 million veteran-owned business owners consider themselves successful. The small business fiveyear survival rate for veterans is double that of the non-veteran population.

Data from the U.S. Small Business Administration has shown that small business owners with an established mentor have twice the success rate – 70 percent versus 35 percent – as those who do not have a mentor.

In conjunction with National Military Appreciation Month in May, SCORE, a national nonprofit organization that assists small businesses, has developed specific resources for workshops. use by its 10,000 mentors nationally in mentoring veterans.

The SCORE Veterans Small Business Resource Guide features veterans-specific resources to offer insight on developing a business plan, securing funding, starting a business, buying an existing business, buying a franchise, connecting with one of SCORE's volunteer mentors, and gaining a better understanding of business through webinars and

"Volunteering at SCORE is my way of showing appreciation to those who helped and guided me during my career while sharing my background and experience to help entrepreneurs succeed," said SCORE Mid-Atlantic Regional Vice President Ed Coleman. "While I enjoy working with all SCORE clients, as a U.S. Army veteran, I particularly enjoy working with veterans to translate their military experience into entrepreneurship. Helping clients realize their

dreams is very gratifying and the essence of the SCORE mission."

SCORE Central Jersey Chapter Chair Nancy Verduin said mentors continually expand their knowledge base to better assist veterans on their entrepreneurial journey.

"Military transitioning from active duty have different needs than civilians in terms of starting a business," said Verduin. "It's wonderful to have veterans' resources at our volunteers' fingertips to aid in mentoring our service men and women."

Veterans account for about 10 percent of SCORE's client base. Veterans own 10 percent of small businesses and 14 percent of franchises. Since franchisors have a defined plan of what the business should entail, veterans represent the perfect franchisee given their ability to effectively execute plans as intended.

Nationally, veterans own nearly 2 million businesses, employing more than 5 million Americans, and generating more than \$1 trillion in annual income. Of those, 40 percent of veteran-owned businesses generate more than \$500,000 in annual revenue.
