COUNTY OFFICE ON AGING AND DISABILITY

Almost 90% of older adults strive to age in place, but due to financial strain and lack of affordable housing, this goal has become only a dream for many. Almost half of older Americans are struggling to pay their monthly bills, according to the Health and Retirement Study and National Council on Aging.

The good news is that older residents and adults with physical disabilities can call the Somerset County Office on Aging and Disability Services for information, assistance and referrals at 908-704-6346.

"The Office on Aging and Disability Services has expert staff on hand who will actively listen to residents about their concerns and provide information about available services," said Somerset County Commissioner Paul M. Drake, liaison to the Somerset County Department of Human Services.

STAY NJ - PROPERTY TAX RELIEF **FOR SENIOR CITIZENS**

The Stay NJ program offers property tax relief to eligible homeowners aged 65 years and older who have owned and lived in their home for the full twelve months in 2024, and have an income below \$500,000. The program reimburses applicants for 50% of their property tax bills; up to a maximum of \$13,000. The filing deadline is October 31, 2025. For more information about Stay NJ, visit: nj.gov

SENIOR FREEZE - PROPERTY TAX REIMBURSEMENT PROGRAM

The Senior Freeze program reimburses eligible older residents and disabled persons for property tax or mobile home park site fee increases on their principal residence. To qualify, applicants must meet all eligibility requirements. For more information on Senior Freeze, visit: nj.gov

ANCHOR (AFFORDABLE NJ COMMUNITIES FOR HOMEOWNERS AND RENTERS)

This program offers property tax relief for eligible residents who own or rent New Jersey property as their main home. Eligibility is based on residency, income, and age in 2024. For more information, visitnj.gov.

The OoADS can assist Somerset County residents aged 60 and above, adults with physical disabilities, and caregivers, to complete and submit an application for these and many other valuable programs, including: Hearing Aid Assistance to the Aged and Disabled (HAAD); Low-Income Heating and Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP); Medicare Savings Programs (QMB, SLMB, QI); Pharmaceutical Assistance for the Aged and Disabled (PAAD); and the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP).

Retired high school English teacher Doreen Ladinski of Warren has been named Literacy Volunteers of Somerset County's (LVSC) "Tutor of the Month."

LVSC is a non-profit that promotes literacy throughout the community by providing free student-centered tutoring and literacy programs, which enable adults to function more effectively in their daily lives. Founded in 1981, LVSC serves students who struggle to read, write and communicate in English. Literacy skills help students with tasks such as calling 9-1-1, filling out an application or reading emails from a child's teacher. Ladinski, currently a substitute teacher, joined LVSC in 2019 and has tutored numerous students since. She takes great pride in her students' accomplishments and helps them with tasks such as understanding U.S. currency and taking and passing proficiency tests.

Commenting on her LVSC journey, Ladinski



said, "LVSC offered me the perfect opportunity to help others develop their literacy skills. I learned early on in my teaching career that helping people develop these skills was one of the most gratifying experiences I've ever known. Nothing is more fulfilling for me than helping others meet their needs or goals."

LVSC is actively recruiting volunteers in Warren to help meet the needs of the local community. An hour or two a week is all it takes

to make a difference, and you don't have to be a teacher to be a tutor. With one-to-one or small group tutoring, you can help English as a Second Language (ESL) students improve their reading comprehension, writing skills, and conversational English. Training is provided.



The Somerset County Hazardous Waste Collection Program gives residents and farmers a legal and cost-free way to dispose of unwanted household items that cannot be disposed of in the regular trash. This drop-off opportunity is for residents only.

Proof of Somerset County residency is required; (current driver's license, valid lease, tax bill or any other bill with a Somerset County address). Pre-registration is not required. No businesses allowed.

Occupants should remain in their vehicles at all times. Materials should be stored in residents' trunks, cargo areas, or truck beds and items must be accessible to the staff so they can easily remove items from vehicles.

Five events are held annually at various locations around the county from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. to enable residents to take advantage of the program.

County residents are also asked to take advantage of the RxMission Drive-In/Drop-Off medicine-collection program, which is held in conjunction with scheduled Hazardous Waste drop-off events, rain or shine. Residents can drop off medications at as many of the Hazardous Waste drop-off events as they wish to safely dispose of unwanted or outdated prescription drugs and over-the-counter medications from their homes. Sheriff's officers are on hand to accept the medications.

Please note that materials accepted at Hazardous Waste Days are NOT the same as those accepted at First Saturday of the Month.

An additional hazardous waste disposal option is available to residents who wish to dispose of hazardous waste between county-sponsored collection days. The Morris County Municipal Utilities Authority's permanent household hazardous waste facility will accept materials from Somerset County residents on a fee basis. 


