

The Rotary Club of Hanover NJ recently awarded the Maasai Girls Fund, an organization transforming the lives and futures of vulnerable youths in rural Kenya, two thousand dollars to provide life changing scholarships.

These scholarships provide education in a place where females have long been denied opportunity. The more education provided, the more girls are able to escape child marriage and genital mutilation which is common practice in Maasai tradition.

Educated girls become healthier women who have fewer, but healthier children. Their education adds to their community value, using their resources to benefit families and neighborhoods. Education also empowers them to make their own life decisions. \$2,000 dollars will provide two full annual

Primary School scholarships and 2 full annual Secondary School scholarships to these young people including books, transportation and school uniforms.



FREE WIND SYMPHONY CONCERT - OCT 22

The Hanover Wind Symphony (HWS) has been playing the best sounds around for 40 years. That's quite a feat. And, speaking of feet, the wind band will present a repertoire of extraordinary dance music in a free concert called "Dance On." The toe-tapping performance will take place on Wednesday, Oct. 22, at 7 p.m., at Memorial Junior School, 61 Highland Ave., in Whippany.

The featured soloist at this engaging concert will be this year's HWS scholarship winner, Madison Choo, a junior at Northern Valley Regional High School in Demarest, who plays the oboe. She will perform her solo in "Concerto for Oboe" by Vincenzo Bellini.

Madison used her HWS scholarship for lessons with her private teacher to further her music education. She notes, "I'm extremely honored to be the recipient of this scholarship. I'm also very excited for my first-ever performance where I'm playing as a soloist. I hope everyone enjoys it." She's been practicing her oboe solo since early July.

Says Matthew Paterno of Parsippany, HWS music director and conductor, "Come dance the night away with the Hanover Wind Symphony and our fall program 'Dance On'! We hope you savor the energy and excitement of the music behind so many different types of dances."

Ever since she started playing the oboe during her freshman year, Madison has rapidly progressed in her musical abilities. Currently, she is enrolled in the pre-college program of Manhattan School of Music and plays with their Philharmonic Orchestra. Additionally, she is a member of the New York Youth Symphony, which is a Grammy-winning ensemble. There, she performs with college students and other talented musicians. She is also a member of the New Jersey Region I Band.
