TEDESCO PARK OFFICIALLY RE-OPENS WITH RIBBON CUTTING

Following work that began in the summer of 2024, Tedesco Park officially re-opened on September 10th with a celebratory ribbon cutting ceremony. The park, located on Cooper Ave., underwent significant improvements, including a new playground, new pickleball courts, and other amenities. These upgrades were funded in part by a 2023 Community Development Block Grant and a 2020 Local Aid Program grant, aiming to enhance park accessibility and provide modern facilities for residents.

In the photo to the right, Mayor James Spango is joined by Mrs Lucy Tedesco as she cuts the Ribbon Officially dedicating the municipal park on Cooper Ave. The park is named in honor of the late Councilman Carlo Tedesco. WERE THERE PIRATES IN NEW JERSEY?

Begin celebrating the 250th Anniversary of the American Revolution by learning the little-known history of New Jersey's Privateers and the part they played in the war.

The Sea Dogs, a group of privateer reenactors, will bare their cutlasses at historic Twin Maples in Summit on Saturday, October 4 in two shows at 2 and 3 p.m. History buffs and the whole family will enjoy a brief lecture, exhibits of privateer artifacts and musical renditions of old sea shanties. Will the British arrive to chase the brave privateers? Come and see!

Tickets are available online at www.fortnightlyclub.org. Ticket prices are \$15 per adult and \$5 per child (3-12). Seating is limited. Free parking. No strollers, please.

The program takes place at Twin Maples, 214 Springfield Avenue, Summit, a site on both the New Jersey and National Historic Registers. The Twin Maples estate was built in 1908 in the Colonial Revival style. Its facade is reminiscent of the White House. The estate is owned by the Fortnightly Club of New Jersey, a non-profit

women's club founded in 1893.

Proceeds benefit Twin Maples' historic preservation.

Later, on October 4 at 5 p.m. the Fortnightly Club of Summit will host a Colonial Tavern Night fundraiser featuring authentic colonial drinks and music with a colonial inspired appetizer and dessert buffet, featuring the Regimental Brewmeister and the Ministers of Apollo. Tickets for this event are available at fortnightlyclub.org for \$65 per person. Proceeds benefit masonry repairs of the Twin Maples terrace.

The Fortnightly Club has a full calendar planned for the coming year including a Designer Fashion ReSale event, a Twin Maples Ghost Hunt with New Jersey Paranormal, a Holiday Ceramics Workshop, breakfast or brunch with Santa at Twin Maples on December 6 and 7, the Battle of the Bubbliies, Baking at Twin Maples and a Tranquility Workshop. SINGING AT THE THRESHOLD

Garden State Threshold Choir

A choir that rehearses but does not perform. A choir that goes in a very small group to sing to one person at a time. A choir whose mission is to provide, not entertainment, but kindness and comfort, to someone who is dying. That is a Threshold Choir.

Threshold Choir is a nonprofit network of about 200 chapters across the country and abroad. And there is one right here in Whippany, NJ, called the Garden State Threshold Choir.

Founded 25 years ago, Threshold Choir singers go, by invitation, to sing at the bedside of those crossing life's challenging thresholds, especially the final threshold between living and dying.

The Garden State Threshold Choir began in 2017 when Whippany resident Judy Hahn retired, looked for a chapter to join, and, finding none nearby, started recruiting to form a new chapter. "It takes time and patience to establish a new chapter," says Hahn. "And it takes time and patience for each singer to be ready to do this work. What we have is an incredibly dedicated and compassionate group of women."

Arriving in a group of two to four singers at a hospital, nursing facility or home, they carry folding stools and sit by the bed. "Even if the hospice patient is nonresponsive, we believe they can hear us and feel the vibrations of our harmonies," says Hahn. "For those close to the

end, it is said that we are 'singing them home.'"

Threshold Choir has its own unique repertoire of songs, written mostly by members. The songs are simple and short, sung softly a capella, first in unison, then repeated and layered with harmonies. The lyrics speak of rest, comfort, letting go, or about peacefulness and love.

"People wonder how we can sing to a dying person," noted Cedar Knolls resident Bonnie Adams. "But to us it's an honor to be present in that sacred, intimate space. We see the breathing relax; and when the patient is surrounded by family, the songs give voice to their feelings and help them grieve."

The Garden State chapter is accepting inquiries for membership. A singer has to be able to carry a tune, hold her own part in harmony, blend with other voices, be willing to self-monitor and accept gentle feedback, and, above all, communicate kindness with their voice. Rehearsals are held on Tuesday evenings, alternating between Zoom sessions and in-person at the First Presbyterian Church of Whippany.

Threshold Choir is a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization that honors all spiritual paths and has no religious affiliation. All of the chapter's services are free of charge.

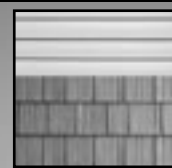

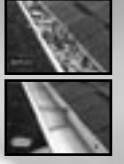

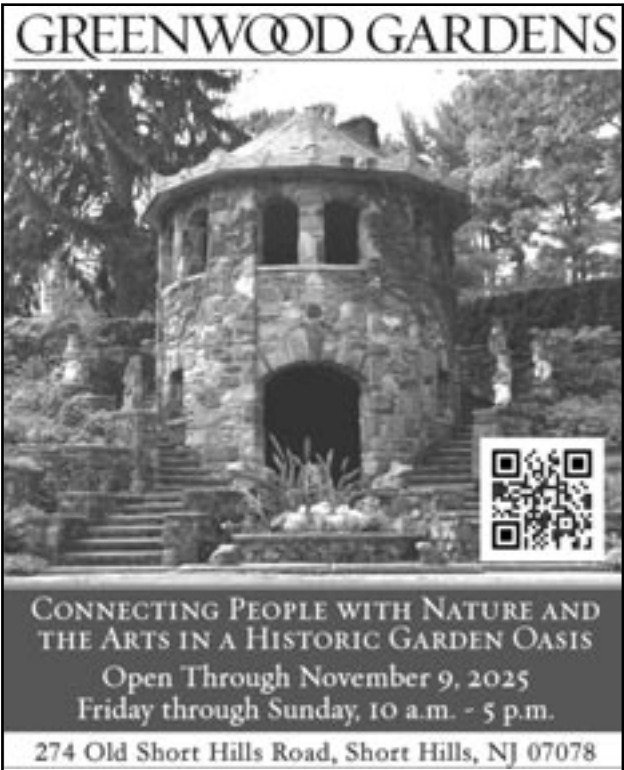
