
Food will be available from 5:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m., while supplies last. Guests are encouraged to arrive early to sample the traditional dishes,







COURSE ON HOW TO SUPPORT YOUR LOVED ONE'S MENTAL HEALTH JOURNEY

Course will be offered by the Union County Chapter of NAMI. The course will meet in person starting on Thursday evening October 9th and meet each Thursday from 7:00 to 9:30 p.m. over a consecutive 8-week period in Scotch Plains. The course is free-of-charge, with all necessary materials furnished at no cost to participants.

The course is specifically for the parents, siblings, spouses/partners, teen-age and adult children, and significant others of individuals with severe and persistent mental illness. The program is not appropriate for individuals who, themselves, suffer from one of the major mental disorders. NAMI members who have completed intensive training will teach.

Curriculum topics include schizophrenia,

POLICE SHARE BACK TO SCHOOL SAFETY ADVICE

Roselle Park Police Department's advice for the residents, students, parents and visitors for the upcoming school year that is upon us.

ADVICE FOR STUDENTS

- Be alert and aware. Stay aware of your surroundings and avoid distractions like phones and headphones while walking.
- Travel in groups. Walk or bike with friends or siblings whenever possible. Wait for the bus at the stop with other students.
- Use caution when walking. Always use sidewalks, crosswalks, and corners. If there is no sidewalk, walk facing traffic. Look left, right, and left again before crossing, and obey all crossing guards and traffic signals.
- Never run out into the street or cross between parked cars.
- Take care when biking. Always wear a
 properly fitted helmet. Ride single file, on the
 right side of the road, and with the flow of
 traffic. Always get off and walk your bike
 across intersections.
- Follow bus rules. Wait for the bus to stop completely before getting on or off, and always cross in front of the bus so the driver can see you.
- Never talk to strangers. Refuse rides or gifts from anyone you don't know, and report suspicious activity to a trusted adult.
- Report concerns. Speak up about bullying, suspicious behavior, or anything that makes you uncomfortable. Tell a parent, teacher, or police officer.
- Know emergency information. Younger children should memorize their home address, phone number, and a parent's contact information.


ADVICE FOR PARENTS

• Create a safety plan. Map out and practice a

- safe walking route to school or the bus stop with your children.
- Have an emergency protocol. Ensure your child knows what to do in case of a school lockdown or other emergency.
- Review school safety protocols. Be familiar with the school's emergency plans and procedures. Ask how law enforcement is involved and how parents will be informed during an incident.
- Maintain open communication. Create an environment where your child feels comfortable bringing up fears or concerns about school safety.

Advice for drivers

- Slow down. Obey all speed limits in school zones, and take extra care to watch for pedestrians and bicyclists, especially in poor weather.
- Stop for school buses. Always stop when a school bus has its red lights flashing and its stop arm extended. It is against the law to pass a stopped school bus.
- Avoid distractions. Put your phone away and give the road your full attention, especially in school zones.
- Yield to pedestrians. Never block crosswalks and always yield to pedestrians.
- Practice safe drop-offs. Use designated dropoff zones to avoid traffic congestion. Never drop off a child on the opposite side of the street. Do not double park to let your child out of the vehicle.
- Pay attention to posted signage. Please be aware of signage in the area of our schools to include: No U-Turns, Pick up and drop off areas, No turns at certain intersections during posted hours, No Parking during certain times, Temporary Do Not Enter signs etc.



LT. REYNOLDS DEFENDS AMERICA UNDER SEA

Lt. James Reynolds, a native of Westfield, New Jersey, serves the U.S. Navy assigned to USS Scranton, homeported at Naval Base Point Loma. As a submariner, Reynolds is part of a small percentage of Navy personnel continuing a 125year tradition of service under the sea to help ensure Americans' safety.

Reynolds graduated from Saint Peter's Prep in Jersey City in 2013. Additionally, Reynolds earned a bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering from the United States Naval Academy and a master's degree in cyber security, operations and leadership from the University of San Diego.

Reynolds joined the Navy eight years ago. Today, Reynolds serves as a weapons officer.

"I have two older siblings who served," Reynolds said. "I joined to follow the example they set of serving the country."

Known as America's "Apex Predators!," the Navy's submarine force operates a large fleet of technologically advanced vessels. These submarines are capable of conducting rapid defensive and offensive operations around the world, in furtherance of U.S. national security.

USS Scranton (SSN 756) is the second U.S. Navy ship to be named for Scranton, Pennsylvania. Scranton is a Los Angeles-class fast-attack submarine. Los Angeles-class submarines have been the backbone of the submarine force for the last 40 years, with

approximately 23 now in commission. They are equipped with 12 Vertical Launch System tubes for firing Tomahawk cruise missiles.

Strategic deterrence is the nation's ultimate insurance program, according to Navy officials. As a member of the submarine force, Reynolds serves aboard a platform capable of bringing the fight to enemies in defense of America and its allies.

The U.S. Navy is celebrating its 250th birthday this year.

According to Navy officials, "America is a maritime nation and for 250 years, America's Warfighting Navy has sailed the globe in defense of freedom."

With 90% of global commerce traveling by sea and access to the internet relying on the security of undersea fiber optic cables, Navy officials continue to emphasize that the prosperity of the United States is directly linked to recruiting and retaining talented people from across the rich fabric of America.

Reynolds has many opportunities to achieve accomplishments during military service.

"My proudest accomplishment is serving as a weapons officer aboard USS Scranton," Reynolds said.

"Serving in the Navy means honoring this country and its Constitution to promote freedom and democracy around the world," Reynolds added.
