# **EXPERIENCE VOLUNTEERISM WITH HANDYMAN PROGRAM**

Sommerset County

For over 30 years, local volunteers from Somerset County's Handyman Program have dedicated countless hours of manual labor to provide independence for elderly and disabled residents throughout Somerset County.

The volunteer program, which consists of men and women, offers small interior household repairs that focus on keeping people safe in their homes. The program offers many services, including: installing grab bars, replacing smoke detectors, installing or removing air conditioners, small plumbing, electrical repairs, and more. Some Handyman Program volunteers also participate in the Wheelchair Ramp Construction Team to build ramps for people who are permanently wheelchair bound.

"It is reassuring to know that the volunteers through our Somerset County Handyman Program are giving residents their personal freedoms back," said Commissioner Paul Drake. "Losing the ability to go outside your home is not something that any resident should be forced to accept. With every ramp project completed, the burden of excessive labor costs and isolation is lifted off the back of another family. That freedom allows residents to spend time outdoors, visit loved ones, and stay connected to the things they enjoy. The entire Board of Commissioners is so grateful to these dedicated, thoughtful, skilled countywide volunteers."

Although residents are expected to pay for supplies, the cost of volunteer labor is free.

"Getting a metal ramp from a private company can cost \$10,000 or more. People can't always afford that," said Somerset County Volunteer Services Director Laurie Roome. "We do ask, if they're able to, to pay for the price of materials that we use. But, if they can't afford that, our program and other donations will cover the cost. Our ramps are built with high - quality materials and by expert craftspersons. Some residents have been

trapped in their houses, so they can't get out to visit a doctor or attend a family event. These ramps not only mean safety, but actually represent freedom."

"Some of our volunteers have carpentry backgrounds and some of them were CEO's, IT specialists, or dentists. They come from all walks of life, but they all love giving back," said Roome. "You don't really need to have any experience to be part of our programs."

Bill Bollwage, a resident of Bridgewater and 15-year veteran of the Handyman Program, said that a willingness to help your neighbor is the main requirement for getting involved.

"You don't need to know everything, so no one should hesitate to get involved," said Bollwage. "You can come here and pick up skills as you go along. When you get to see one of the residents come out of their house for the first time in over a year, it makes you feel good. It gets emotional for the homeowner. We've had a couple of people break down in tears. They get to see their neighbors and now they can just come out and enjoy the weather."



# EARN THE HISTORY OF WASHINGTON ROCK - OCT 12

The Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) will participate in Somerset County's Journey Through the Past history tour on Sunday, October 12, noon to 2 p.m. at Washington Rock State Park in Green Brook, weather permitting. Members of Elizabeth Snyder-Continental Chapter will be on hand with an exhibit to help tell the story of this famous landmark.

According to local tradition, George Washington used this outcrop on the Watchung Mountains as an observation point in 1777. When the site was in danger of being sold to a quarry in 1909, the family of a DAR member purchased 20 acres that included the rock and deeded the land to the State of New Jersey. The DAR then led efforts to erect a monument at the site. Few people realize that Washington spent more than 40 percent of the Revolutionary War in and around the Watchung Mountains.

The DAR is a nonprofit service organization open to all women 18 and over who can prove descent from an individual who aided the cause independence during the American Revolution. Based in Green Brook, Elizabeth Snyder-Continental Chapter serves areas of Somerset, Middlesex and Union counties. New members are welcome. Contact the chapter at ESCchapterDAR@gmail.com.

# HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION PROGRAM

#### October 18 South County Public Works Garage 410 Roycefield Road, Hillsborough 08844

The Somerset County Hazardous Waste Collection Program gives residents and farmers a legal and cost-free way to dispose of unwanted household items that cannot be disposed of in the regular trash. This drop-off opportunity is for residents only.

Proof of Somerset County residency is required; (current driver's license, valid lease, tax bill or any other bill with a Somerset County address). Pre-registration is not required. No businesses allowed.

Occupants should remain in their vehicles at all times. Materials should be stored in residents' trunks, cargo areas, or truck beds and items must be accessible to the staff so they can easily remove items from vehicles.


Five events are held annually at various locations around the county from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. to enable residents to take advantage of the program.

County residents are also asked to take advantage of the RxMission Drive-In/Drop-Off medicine-collection program, which is held in conjunction with scheduled Hazardous Waste drop-off events, rain or shine. Residents can drop off medications at as many of the Hazardous Waste drop-off events as they wish to safely dispose of unwanted or outdated prescription drugs and over-the-counter medications from their homes. Sheriff's officers are on hand to accept the medications.

Please note that materials accepted at Hazardous Waste Days are NOT the same as those accepted at First Saturday of the Month .

An additional hazardous waste disposal option is available to residents who wish to dispose of hazardous waste between county-sponsored collection days. The Morris County Municipal Utilities Authority's permanent household hazardous waste facility will accept materials from Somerset County residents on a fee basis. 




