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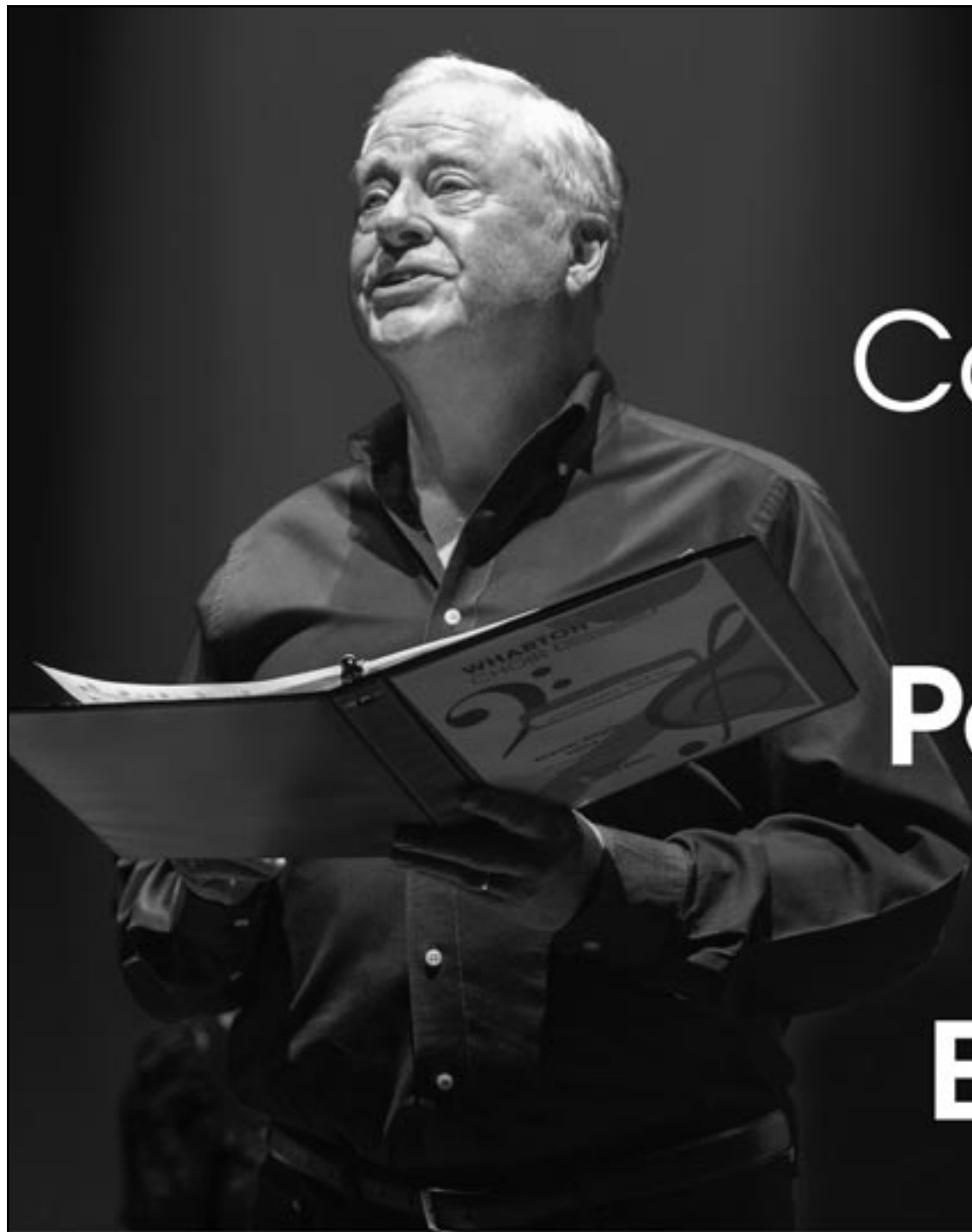

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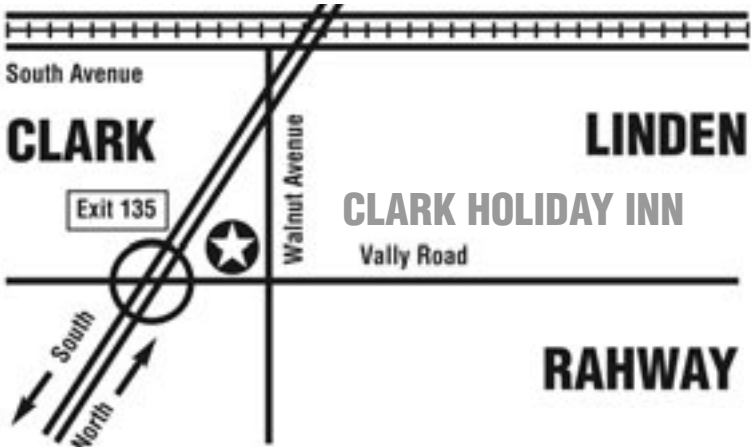




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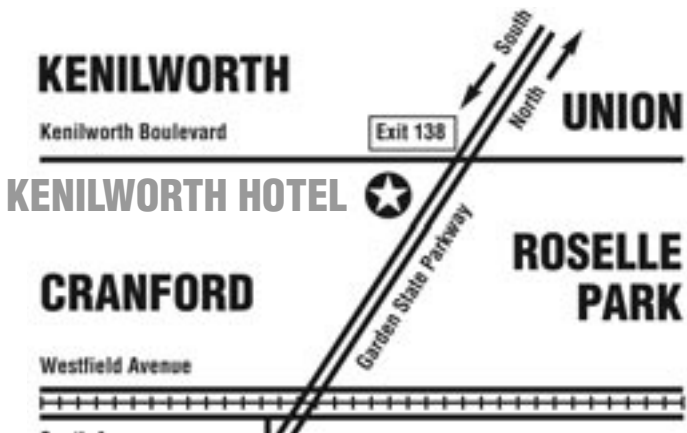
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LEAVE THE LEAVES AND SAVE THE STEMS

Berkeley Heights Environmental Commission

Raking, bagging, and disposing of leaves is as much an autumn tradition as Halloween. Instead of bagging those leaves, keep them and use them to help beneficial insects and to feed your lawn.

Invertebrates rely on fallen leaves and other organic debris to cover and insulate them from the elements. Whatever your landscape, you can ensure that resources for nests and overwintering habitat are available.

WHO USES LEAVES AND DEAD STEMS?:

- 30% of native bees are tunnel-nesting, such as leafcutter and mason bees. They need narrow tunnels or other tiny spaces in dead wood, hollow stems, or brush piles.

- Bumble bee queens burrow an inch or two into the earth to hibernate for winter. A layer of leaves is welcome protection from the elements.

- Woolly bear caterpillars tuck themselves into leaf piles for protection from cold weather.

HOW CAN YOU HELP?

- Make piles of leaves in the back corner of a yard.

- Use leaves to mulch garden beds and trees.

In addition to making piles of leaves for bees and caterpillars, you can mow leaves back into the lawn. Depending on the type of mower you have, you can either switch to the mulch setting or make several passes over dry leaves to cut and re-cut them into fine pieces. These leaf fragments drop into the grass where microbes break them down further, returning nutrients and organic matter back to the lawn.

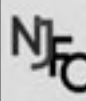

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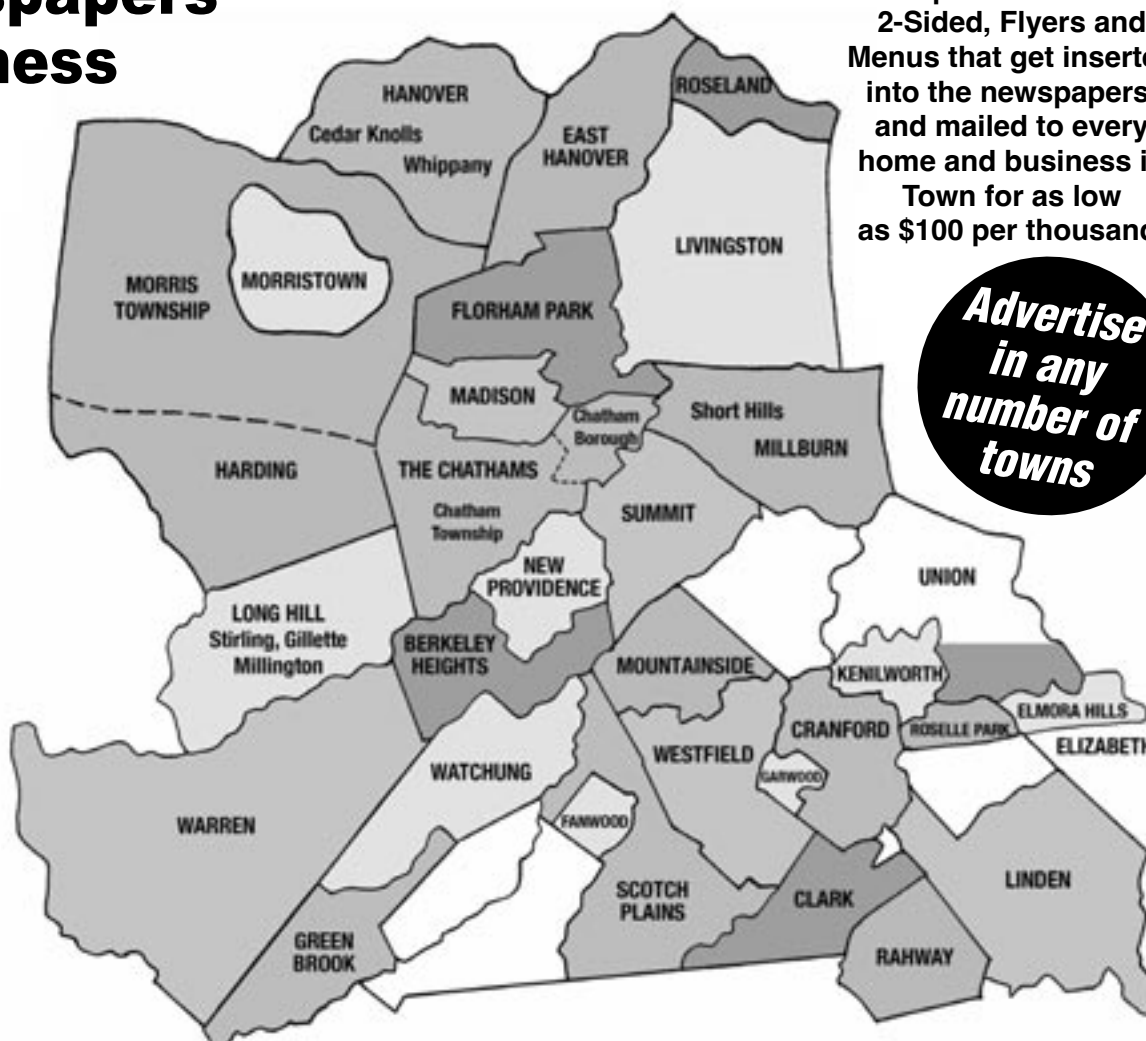
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LT. REYNOLDS DEFENDING AMERICA UNDER THE SEA

Lt. James Reynolds, a native of Westfield, New Jersey, serves the U.S. Navy assigned to USS Scranton, homeported at Naval Base Point Loma. As a submariner, Reynolds is part of a small percentage of Navy personnel continuing a 125-year tradition of service under the sea to help ensure Americans' safety.

Reynolds graduated from Saint Peter's Prep in Jersey City in 2013. Additionally, Reynolds earned a bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering from the United States Naval Academy and a master's degree in cyber security, operations and leadership from the University of San Diego.

Reynolds joined the Navy eight years ago. Today, Reynolds serves as a weapons officer.

"I have two older siblings who served," Reynolds said. "I joined to follow the example they set of serving the country."

Known as America's "Apex Predators!," the

Navy's submarine force operates a large fleet of technologically advanced vessels. These submarines are capable of conducting rapid defensive and offensive operations around the world, in furtherance of U.S. national security.

USS Scranton (SSN 756) is the second U.S. Navy ship to be named for Scranton, Pennsylvania. Scranton is a Los Angeles-class fast-attack submarine. Los Angeles-class submarines have been the backbone of the submarine force for the last 40 years, with approximately 23 now in commission. They are equipped with 12 Vertical Launch System tubes for firing Tomahawk cruise missiles.

Strategic deterrence is the nation's ultimate insurance program, according to Navy officials. As a member of the submarine force, Reynolds serves aboard a platform capable of bringing the fight to enemies in defense of America and its allies.

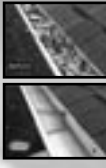
