Louis, MO. Competing in a highly competitive championship field of fifteen, Hume placed fourth in the Opportunity Open English Pleasure Amateur/Junior Exhibitor Combined Class, a notable achievement in one of the show's most challenging divisions.

Riding "Pocketful of Sun," a registered American Saddlebred, Hume trains under the guidance of Erin McCracken, owner of Seraphim Stables in Sandyston, NJ. She has been competing in Saddleseat divisions since fifth grade and has steadily built a reputation as a dedicated and accomplished rider.

Hume's equestrian journey began at age six at the Little Red Barn in Jamesport, NY, where her love of horses first took root. She has remained connected to the Long Island barn over the years, working there as a summer camp counselor throughout high school.

In recognition of her commitment to both academics and athletics, Hume is a proud United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) member and has earned the distinction of US Equestrian Interscholastic Athlete.

Later this month, Hume will compete at the Twin State American Saddlebred Association Octoberfest Horse Show in Springfield, MA, marking her final competition as a Junior Exhibitor before advancing to the next level of her equestrian career.

Hume also successfully completed the United States Equestrian Interscholastic Athlete

Program. She has balanced her sporting ambitions with achieving her educational goals.

The United States Equestrian Federation is recognized by the U.S. Olympic and Paralympic Committee as the National Governing Body for equestrian sport in the United States. According to the Federation, US Equestrian is dedicated to pursuing excellence and promoting growth across all levels in equestrian sport, from the grass roots to the Olympic level.

On average, an equestrian athlete will minimally spend 25 hours per week training at the barn. The hours spent training are purely dedicated to time spent in the saddle in preparation for competitions. Similar to other Olympic recognized sports, equestrian sport helps to develop our youth into productive members of society. These athletes are building confidence and leadership skills and developing a drive for success, and to do so, they must have an unwavering dedication and commitment to the sport; all of which are key assets when entering the work force.

The Interscholastic Athlete Program highlights our athlete's achievements by awarding them with a United States Equestrian Federation Varsity patch, pin, award letter, and a well-deserved reference for their resumes.





Being an EMT requires training in many facets of being a First Responder. The Clark Volunteer Emergency Squad's Life Honorary Member, Michael Gennaro led squad members and EMTs from other local agencies in a class on responding to emergency calls involving possible crime scenes. EMTs learned that while their safety is a primary concern, so is preserving a scene that indicates a crime may have been committed. Patient care is always paramount to an EMT's response but so is being sure that everyone is in a safe situation.

Mike Gennaro has an impressive résumé. Mike has been involved in emergency services since 1988. He is a retired lieutenant with the Hillside Police Department, is a phlebotomist, teaches at the John H. Stamler Police Academy, and teaches first aid courses. "I see things from both sides," said Mike. "Having been working scenes as a police officer and an EMT gives me a unique ability to understand the job each must perform."

The EMTs walked away with a clearer understanding of how to recognize a possible crime scene and the additional steps they must take to preserve the scene so that police and investigators can gather evidence. Gennaro

explained that a crime scene is often larger than just the place where a patient is located. He impressed the need to avoid tunnel vision but rather see things as though looking through a wide-angle camera lens. Because the crime scene can encompass a large area, EMTs may need to keep equipment farther away from their patient than they commonly would.
