

Today, Twin Maples serves as a clubhouse and hosts many community events and fundraisers. The Fortnightly Club of Summit, a non-profit organization founded in 1893, offers women camaraderie and a full calendar of interesting events and volunteer opportunities. The Club supports the preservation of Twin Maples, education, the arts and humanitarian efforts. For over thirty-years the Club has awarded annual scholarships to deserving young, local women. FRELINGHUYSEN ARBORETUM TO BE SITE OF NEW TRIBUTE TO VETERANS

Morris County Board of County Commissioners recently joined Veterans Valor of New Jersey at the Frelinghuysen Arboretum for a formal signing of an agreement establishing The Healing Garden of Morris, a new public space dedicated to honoring veterans and supporting their families.

The agreement, signed by Park Commission Executive Director Dave Helmer, Park

The Morris County Park Commission and the Commission President Stuart Lasser, and 7. New Life: Inspiring hope and new Veterans Valor Chairman Charlie Iuliano, marks the official launch of a project more than two years in the making.

> The purpose of The Healing Garden of Morris rests within its name – a garden that serves as a place for peace, reflection and spiritual renewal, while allowing veterans and the broader community to connect. Envisioned as a "living tribute," the plan is for the garden to host veteranrelated art, horticultural programs, wellness seminars and opportunities for creative expression. At its core is theDisarm PTSD initiative, a campaign to help veterans transform their experiences with service-related trauma into a source of purpose and connection.

Will Draper, executive director of Veterans Valor listed and described each of the areas envisioned:

- 1. Point of Sacrifice: Acknowledging the bravery and sacrifices made by service members.
- 2. Medevac: Understanding the critical moments of medical evacuation and care in the field.
- 3. Triage: Exploring the initial assessments and treatments veterans receive upon return.
- 4. Homeward: Celebrating the emotional journey of returning home and reuniting with loved ones.
- 5. Recovery: Highlighting the ongoing physical and mental health support essential for
- 6. Fallen: Honoring those who lost the battle at home, recognizing their sacrifice and legacy.

beginnings for veterans and their families.

During the event, several veterans -- Aaron Oliver, a 21-year U.S. Army veteran; Rob Hughes, retired U.S. Navy captain and board member of Veterans Valor; and Peter Danchise, a Vietnam veteran and artist -- spoke about the challenges they faced and continue to face with PTSD and readjusting to life after war. They emphasized how meaningful this project is to them and to other veterans who share those experiences. Following the signing, attendees toured the future garden site.

Morris County continues to prioritize veterans through programs and partnerships that provide support and recognition. Last year, the county expanded the Veterans Services Office in Morris Township to accommodate a federal Veterans Affairs Community Access Point. In September, the county partnered with the County College of Morris to provide a Veterans Services Officer twice a month at the college's Veterans Resource Center.

Veterans Valor, also known as The Healing Gardens of Morris, Inc., is a nonprofit dedicated to honoring and supporting New Jersey veterans, especially those wounded in service, and their families.

The group aims to raise awareness of postservice challenges and create opportunities for healing and connection through communitydriven initiatives.


