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D.A.R. SPOTLIGHT ON HISTORY

On October 4, members of the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) were invited to assist the Green Brook Cultural, Heritage & Historic Preservation Committee and the Green Brook Historical Society with general cleaning and maintenance tasks at the historic Dr. John Vermeule House. The goal was to prepare for an open house the following weekend.

Constructed in 1799, the Georgian colonial-style farmhouse on Rock Avenue in Green Brook was open to the public as a stop on Somerset County's Journey Through the Past history tour, October 11-12. Volunteers dusted and swept inside the house while others raked and cleared the property.

"As we approach the semiquincentennial, it is the perfect opportunity to increase awareness of events that took place in this area during the American Revolution," said DAR Chapter Regent Nancy Stoll, one of the volunteers. "We had Continental Army and militia encampments, skirmishes with the British, the Battle of the Short Hills, and the many contributions of area residents, including the Vermeule family, to the American cause.

"Events such as Journey Through the Past highlight local history and the importance of preserving historic sites," Stoll said. During the event, Elizabeth Snyder-Continental Chapter DAR hosted a history display at Washington Rock State Park in Green Brook, one of the 34 stops on the history tour.

The DAR is a nonprofit, nonpolitical service organization open to women 18 and older who are descended from a man or woman who aided the cause of American independence. 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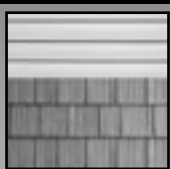
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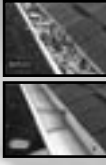

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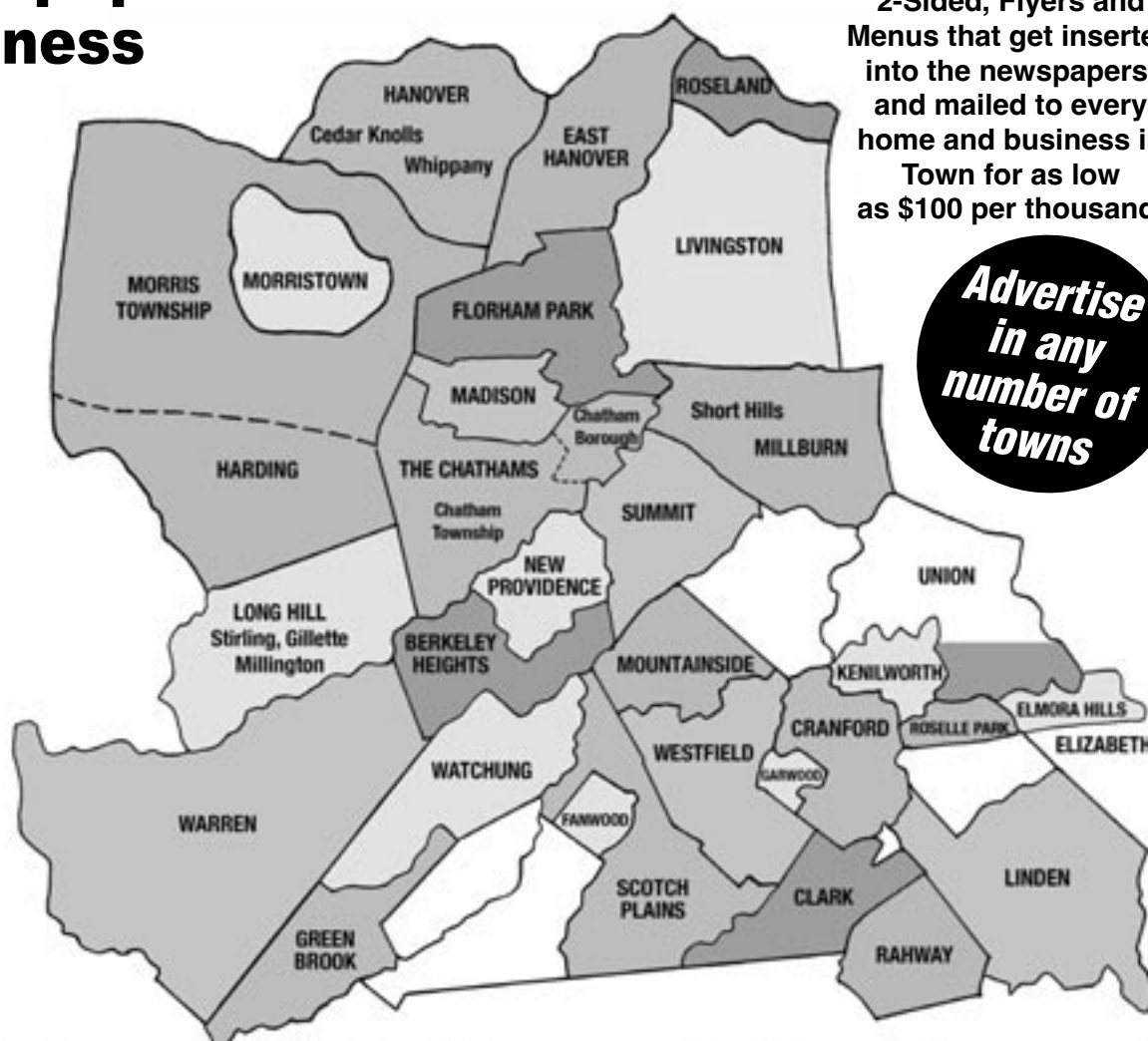
