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HIGH SCHOOL PRESENTS LITTLE WOMEN - NOV. 21-23

The award-winning Morristown High School Theatre Department is proud to announce this year's fall drama production, *Little Women*, with four performances from November 21 to 23, 2025.

MHS Theatre's student production of this timeless classic is an original adaptation of the novel by MHS's own award-nominated director George LaVigne, with input from the students, and is sure to delight theatergoers of all kinds.

A coming-of-age story set in a time of great upheaval and division, *Little Women* is, in LaVigne's words, "an endearing story of family, the bond of sisters, and their struggle in trying times, through poverty and loss."

The play's strong female characters are what attracted LaVigne to *Little Women*. Jo, the second-oldest March daughter, is the exemplar. Creative, ambitious, free-spirited, and proudly feminist at a time when that term was new, Jo has no patience for society's expectations or limits on what girls and women can or can't do, nor does she care to be restricted by her gender, proudly declaring herself "the man of the house" while her father is at war.

"This story is so empowering for women," says Brooks Seibold, who will play Jo in the MHS production. "It's beautiful to see Jo be her own person. At a time when strong women are supposed to be 'cool girlboss untouchable,' it's refreshing to see Jo, a very unconventional activist, be vulnerable and act like a real girl, even though she's a feminist and powerful. This story is so ahead of the times in that sense."

A treat for the holiday season, *Little Women* spans several Christmases in the lives of the March sisters and their mother, Marmee, who instills a spirit of independence, charity, forgiveness, and compassion in her daughters.

A landmark in American literature, Louisa May Alcott's 1868 novel has been adapted countless times, and for good reason. Those adaptations include at least seven feature films, four television mini-series, two operas, two musicals, and even multiple anime interpretations. MHS's production reaches back past all of those descendants to the original novel and Alcott's words to get to the heart of what has made *Little Women* endure for more than a century and a half.

As Jo, the book's stand-in for Alcott herself, asks her mother, "What can there be in a simple little story like that to make people praise it so?"

"There's truth in it," her mother responds. It also has "humor and pathos," per Marmee, and MHS's production is sure to be a heartwarming reminder of "how much genuine happiness can be had in a plain little house."

MHS Theatre will present four live performances of *Little Women* on the Morristown High School stage, including two evening shows and two matinees: Friday, November 21 at 7:00 pm; Saturday, November 22 at 2:00 pm; Saturday, November 22 at 7:00 pm; and Sunday, November 23 at 2:00 pm

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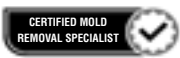
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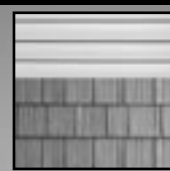
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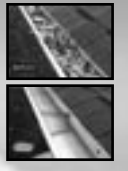
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FRELINGHUYSEN ARBORETUM TO BE SITE OF NEW TRIBUTE TO VETERANS

The Morris County Park Commission and the Morris County Board of County Commissioners recently joined Veterans Valor of New Jersey at the Frelinghuysen Arboretum for a formal signing of an agreement establishing The Healing Garden of Morris, a new public space dedicated to honoring veterans and supporting their families.

The agreement, signed by Park Commission Executive Director Dave Helmer, Park

Commission President Stuart Lasser, and Veterans Valor Chairman Charlie Iuliano, marks the official launch of a project more than two years in the making.

The purpose of The Healing Garden of Morris rests within its name – a garden that serves as a place for peace, reflection and spiritual renewal, while allowing veterans and the broader community to connect. Envisioned as a “living tribute,” the plan is for the garden to host veteran-related art, horticultural programs, wellness seminars and opportunities for creative expression. At its core is the Disarm PTSD initiative, a campaign to help veterans transform their experiences with service-related trauma into a source of purpose and connection.

Will Draper, executive director of Veterans Valor listed and described each of the areas envisioned:

1. Point of Sacrifice: Acknowledging the bravery and sacrifices made by service members.
2. Medevac: Understanding the critical moments of medical evacuation and care in the field.
3. Triage: Exploring the initial assessments and treatments veterans receive upon return.
4. Homeward: Celebrating the emotional journey of returning home and reuniting with loved ones.
5. Recovery: Highlighting the ongoing physical and mental health support essential for veterans.
6. Fallen: Honoring those who lost the battle at home, recognizing their sacrifice and legacy.

7. New Life: Inspiring hope and new beginnings for veterans and their families.

During the event, several veterans -- Aaron Oliver, a 21-year U.S. Army veteran; Rob Hughes, retired U.S. Navy captain and board member of Veterans Valor; and Peter Danchise, a Vietnam veteran and artist -- spoke about the challenges they faced and continue to face with PTSD and readjusting to life after war. They emphasized how meaningful this project is to them and to other veterans who share those experiences. Following the signing, attendees toured the future garden site.

Morris County continues to prioritize veterans through programs and partnerships that provide support and recognition. Last year, the county expanded the Veterans Services Office in Morris Township to accommodate a federal Veterans Affairs Community Access Point. In September, the county partnered with the County College of Morris to provide a Veterans Services Officer twice a month at the college's Veterans Resource Center.

Veterans Valor, also known as The Healing Gardens of Morris, Inc., is a nonprofit dedicated to honoring and supporting New Jersey veterans, especially those wounded in service, and their families.

The group aims to raise awareness of post-service challenges and create opportunities for healing and connection through community-driven initiatives.

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ENROLLING IN MEDICARE AND UPDATING YOUR PLAN

Turning 65 marks eligibility for Medicare, a federal health insurance program designed for seniors and certain individuals with disabilities. While the system can be complex, resources are available to help beneficiaries navigate enrollment, updates, and plan changes to ensure their coverage continues to meet their needs.

Original Medicare consists of Part A (hospital insurance) and Part B (medical insurance). Part A covers hospital stays, skilled nursing facilities, home health, and hospice care. Part B focuses on outpatient care, doctor visits, preventive screenings, and therapies. While comprehensive, Original Medicare leaves gaps in coverage, which can be supplemented through Medigap policies. These help with deductibles, co-pays, and sometimes foreign travel coverage, offering flexibility and predictability.

Medicare Advantage (Part C), offered by private insurers, combines Parts A and B and often includes additional benefits like vision, dental, hearing, fitness programs, and lower premiums. These plans have out-of-pocket maximums, but often require use of in-network providers.

Prescription drug coverage (Part D) is also offered through private plans. Each plan has a formulary outlining covered medications, cost-sharing structures, and potential coverage gaps, though assistance programs like "Extra Help" exist for those with limited income. New Jersey also provides state assistance through PAAD and Senior Gold to help seniors manage prescription

drug costs.

For higher-income beneficiaries, Medicare applies IRMAA (Income-Related Monthly Adjustment Amount), which adds extra costs to Part B and D premiums based on IRS tax information.

Enrollment timing is crucial. While some may delay enrollment due to employer coverage, late enrollment penalties apply if coverage lapses without creditable insurance.

Every year, Medicare beneficiaries have an opportunity to review and adjust their coverage. The Annual Enrollment Period (October 15 – December 7) allows switching between Original Medicare and Advantage plans, adding or changing drug plans, or returning to Original Medicare. Any changes take effect January 1. Additionally, the Medicare Advantage Open Enrollment (January 1 – March 31) allows those in Advantage plans to switch or return to Original Medicare.

When evaluating options, beneficiaries should consider cost, provider networks, additional benefits, drug coverage, and changes in their health or medications.

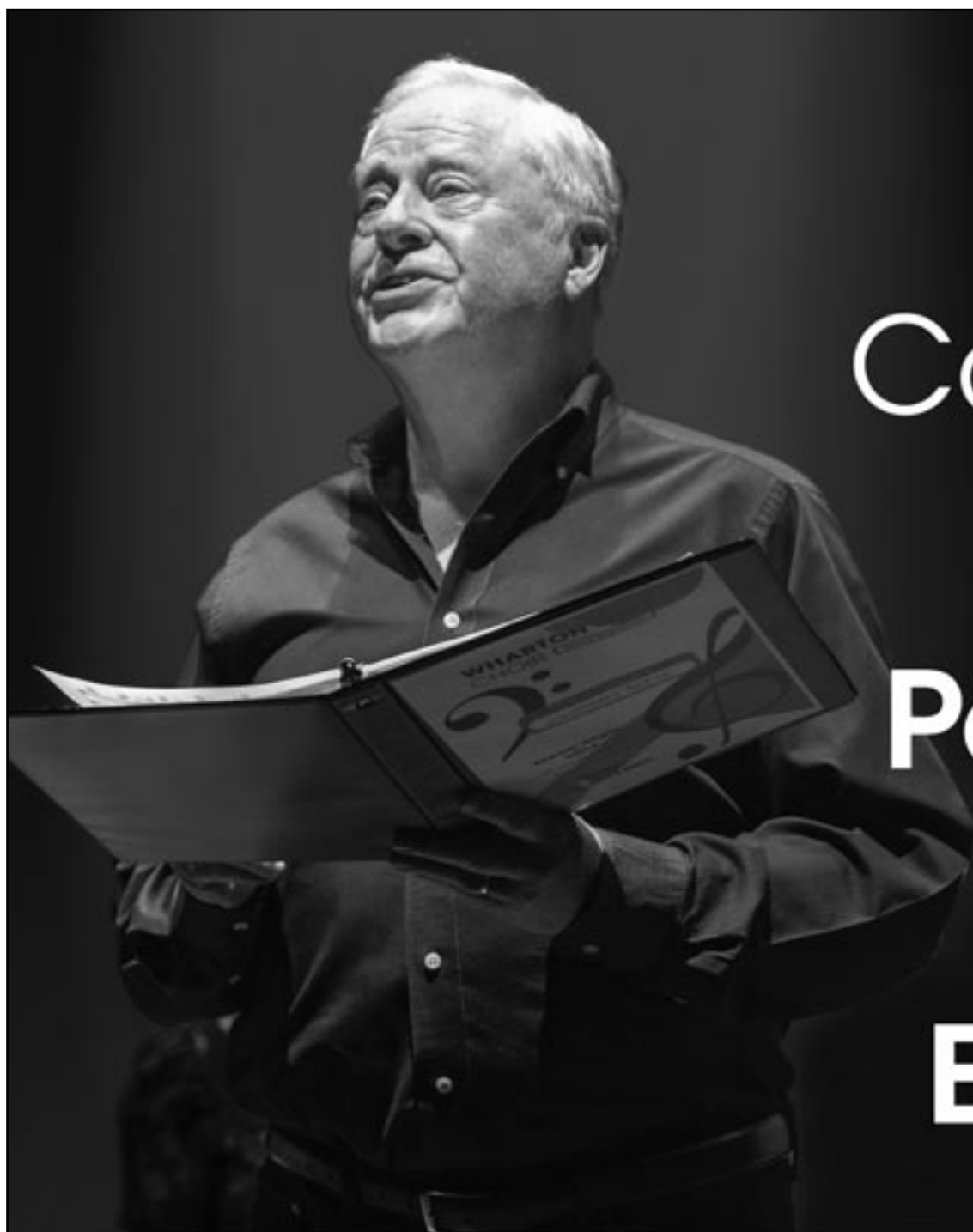
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FIRST VETERANS SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENT, KELLY BROWN

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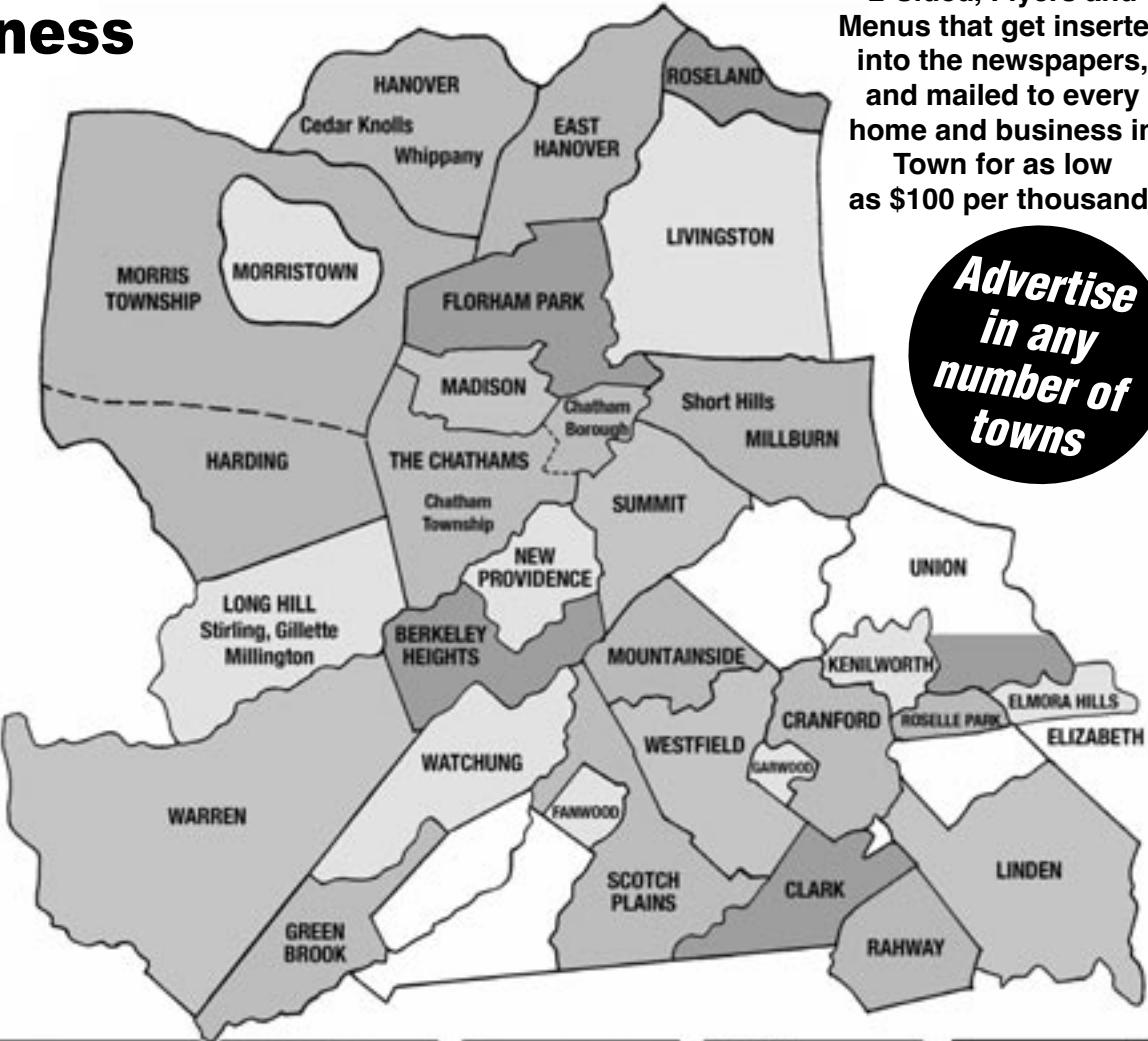

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CIVIL AIR PATROL AWARD HONORS BILLY MITCHELL

Lone Eagle Composite Squadron of the Civil Air Patrol (CAP).

Recently, Cadet 2d Lt Priyanka Nair, of the Lone Eagle Composite Squadron, was presented with her Civil Air Patrol (CAP) Billy Mitchell Award by Capt. Adam Fitting, Commander, at the Morristown Armory, Morristown, NJ. She is the daughter of Mr. Nair and Mrs. Leju of Glen Ridge, NJ.

She served as a flight commander at TN Wing encampment and has given presentations on the importance of character and the Spittin' Kitten's Squadron history. She was named the honorable graduate at the NJ Ground Search & Rescue(GSAR) Summer School and qualified for GTM 3, 2, and UDF. She is a sophomore at Newark Academy on the Varsity basketball team. Outside of school, she enjoys playing and teaching violin.

The Billy Mitchell award, the second cadet milestone achievement, is earned after the successful completion of the first eight achievements of the cadet program. In addition to the achievements, the cadet must pass a comprehensive examination on aerospace and leadership and attend a Basic Encampment. Only

about 15% of all Civil Air Patrol cadets achieve the Billy Mitchell Award.

Billy Mitchell Cadets who enlist in the U.S. Air Force are promoted to E-3 (airman first class) instead of E-1 (airman basic) upon completion of basic military training. Billy Mitchell cadets who enlist in the Army, Navy, or Marine Corps are promoted to E-2 instead of E-1 upon completion of basic military training. Further, Billy Mitchell cadets who enlist in the US Coast Guard are promoted to E-3 (seaman) instead of E-1 (seaman recruit) upon completion of boot camp. Finally, they are considered favorably by the admission staff for selection to the AFROTC and the USAF Academy.

The Lone Eagle Composite Squadron meets on Wednesday nights, 7:00 to 9:00 p.m., at the Morristown National Guard Armory, NJ. Youth can start the cadet program at age twelve, and adults can join as senior members starting at age 18.
