CELEBRATE THE HOLIDAYS IN GRAND STYLE WITH FREE CONCERT DEC. 14

Music always puts people in the holiday spirit, and a spirited free concert featuring the renowned Hanover Wind Symphony (HWS) and the outstanding Morris Music Men will make the holidays shine even brighter.

Called "Holidays in Hanover: Wassailing Through Hanover," the festive performance will take place on Sunday, Dec. 14, at 3 p.m., at Memorial Junior School, 61 Highland Ave., in Whippany.

Speaking about the grand holiday concert, HWS musical director and conductor Matthew Paterno of Parsippany says, "Please join the Hanover Wind Symphony and the Morris Music Men as we go 'wassailing' through the early American village of Hanover! Hear the music of the holidays as you might have heard it in the houses and on the street corners of our special town!"

HWS and the Morris Music Men will go back

and forth, with one group performing, then the other. "The idea is 'wassailing,' or spreading good health and good cheer through the village of Hanover in early America," Paterno adds.

A finale, combining both groups, and inviting audience participation will be a Christmas sing-along.

One of only a handful of outstanding community-based adult wind bands in New Jersey, the renowned 70-member Hanover Wind Symphony (www.hanoverwinds.org) delights audiences of all ages by giving a contemporary twist to traditional favorites. The large orchestra, made up exclusively of woodwind, brass and percussion instruments, embraces as its mission bringing "Music to People and People to Music."

An all-volunteer, nonprofit organization, HWS plays marches, toe-tappers, and standards while also presenting pieces written by current active composers, some of whom are members of the

ensemble. They come together to connect musically with others, share the enjoyment of music with live audiences, and help mentor the next generation of wind musicians. HWS is a cultural gem treasured by music lovers throughout the area.

Since the late 1950s, the award-winning Morris Music Men (morrismusicmen.org) have been treating northern New Jersey audiences to the uniquely American form of vocal music known as barbershop harmony. An a cappella choral group made up of more than 40 members ranging in age from men in their 30s to men in their 90s, they're a chapter of the Barbershop Harmony Society, the world's largest men's a cappella singing society.

Under the inspired direction of Nate Barrett, a professionally trained musician, the Morris Music Men sing for civic and charitable organizations, private groups, houses of worship, community events, and fundraisers.

ENROLLING IN MEDICARE AND UPDATING YOUR PLAN

Turning 65 marks eligibility for Medicare, a federal health insurance program designed for seniors and certain individuals with disabilities. While the system can be complex, resources are available to help beneficiaries navigate enrollment, updates, and plan changes to ensure their coverage continues to meet their needs.

Original Medicare consists of Part A (hospital insurance) and Part B (medical insurance). Part A covers hospital stays, skilled nursing facilities, home health, and hospice care. Part B focuses on outpatient care, doctor visits, preventive screenings, and therapies. While comprehensive, Original Medicare leaves gaps in coverage, which can be supplemented through Medigap policies. These help with deductibles, co-pays, and sometimes foreign travel coverage, offering flexibility and predictability.

Medicare Advantage (Part C), offered by private insurers, combines Parts A and B and often includes additional benefits like vision, dental, hearing, fitness programs, and lower premiums. These plans have out-of-pocket maximums, but often require use of in-network providers.

Prescription drug coverage (Part D) is also offered through private plans. Each plan has a formulary outlining covered medications, cost-sharing structures, and potential coverage gaps, though assistance programs like "Extra Help" exist for those with limited income. New Jersey also provides state assistance through PAAD and Senior Gold to help seniors manage prescription

drug costs.

For higher-income beneficiaries, Medicare applies IRMAA (Income-Related Monthly Adjustment Amount), which adds extra costs to Part B and D premiums based on IRS tax information.

Enrollment timing is crucial. While some may delay enrollment due to employer coverage, late enrollment penalties apply if coverage lapses without creditable insurance.

Every year, Medicare beneficiaries have an opportunity to review and adjust their coverage. The Annual Enrollment Period (October 15 – December 7) allows switching between Original Medicare and Advantage plans, adding or changing drug plans, or returning to Original Medicare. Any changes take effect January 1. Additionally, the Medicare Advantage Open Enrollment (January 1 – March 31) allows those in Advantage plans to switch or return to Original Medicare.

When evaluating options, beneficiaries should consider cost, provider networks, additional benefits, drug coverage, and changes in their health or medications.

HELPING TO CREATE LIFELONG READERS

"The Dictionary Project" provides free dictionaries to students, helping them become lifelong readers. The goal of this program is to assist all 3rd grade students in becoming good writers, active readers, creative thinkers, and resourceful learners by providing them with their own personal dictionary. The dictionaries are a gift for each student to use at school and at home for years to come. Educators see third grade as the dividing line between learning to read and reading to learn.

The idea for this project began in 1992 in Savannah, Georgia when a local resident gave 50 dictionaries to children who attended school close to her home. The project ballooned over the years as teachers and volunteers started fundraising in Georgia to supply more students with the books.

One of the volunteers, South Carolina's Mary French, realized to grow the project serious fundraising was needed to support it. With that she and her husband Arno formed the 501c3 association in 1995. Over 31-million children have benefited from The Dictionary Project.

Across the United States, the program has been picked up over the years by various civic organizations, businesses and individuals. The Hanover Rotary Club joined the effort in 2001 and since then has been providing dictionaries to Morris 3rd graders on a yearly basis. On Monday November 3rd, over 240 dictionaries were gifted at Salem Drive, Bee Meadow, Mountview Road and East Hanover Central Elementary schools.

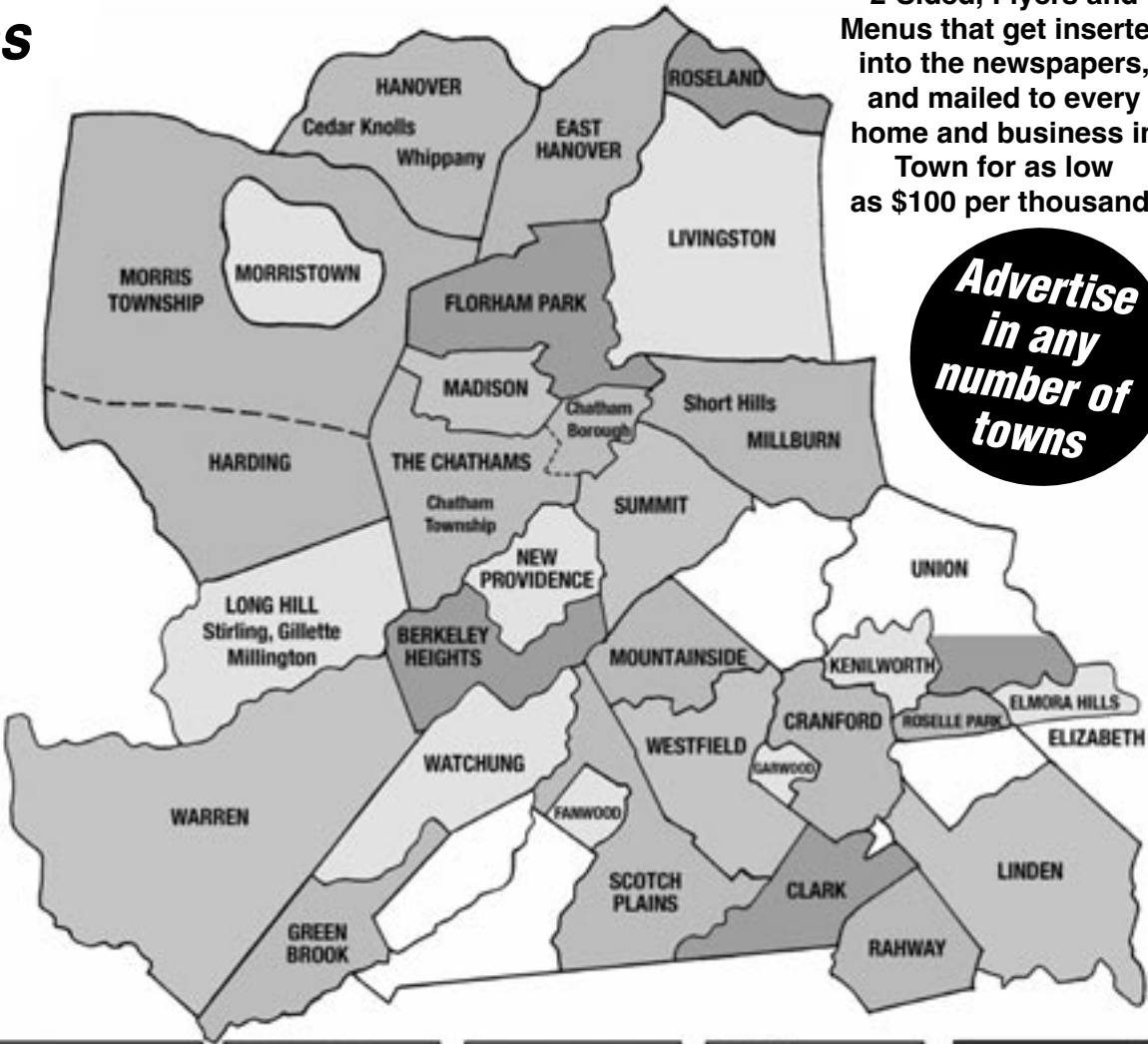
