

#### STEVE MONETTI HONORED FOR LIFE-SAVING ACTIONS

Township of Scotch Plains

The Township of Scotch Plains recently recognized Steve Monetti for his heroic actions after saving a guest from a lifethreatening emergency during a celebration at Congregation Beth Israel.

During a Bat Mitzvah at the synagogue on June 14, 2025, a guest began choking in the hallway outside of the sanctuary. A pill had become lodged in his throat.

Monetti, a security guard at the synagogue since April, stepped in without hesitation, performing the Heimlich maneuver and clearing the obstruction. His quick and composed response prevented what could have been a tragic outcome. As the event occurred in the hallway, it did not impact the Sabbath service underway.

In a Township proclamation issued by Mayor Joshua Losardo and the Township Council on October 24, 2025, Monetti was praised for his courage, calm under pressure, and life-saving efforts. The event included Rabbi Howard Tilman of CBI, and Aviva Tilles, who serves as the synagogue's executive director.

"We are so grateful for Steve's quick response to step up and jump into action, helping us avert a potential tragedy," the rabbi said. "Our entire security team and personnel have become crucial partners in keeping our community safe. Knowing that our guards are prepared to handle so many different scenarios lets us all feel comfortable coming together for sacred occasions and special events. We were blessed to have Steve at our synagogue that morning."

The proclamationcommends Monetti for his "bravery, calm under pressure, and life-saving efforts," expressing the community's deep gratitude and admiration.

"Steve's calm and decisive response in that moment of crisis was extraordinary," Mayor Losardo added. "His actions exemplify compassion and courage, and we're grateful that he was there to help when it mattered most."

Monetti's actions serve as a powerful reminder of the importance of emergency preparedness and the impact one person's courage can have.

"Stories like this remind us that heroism isn't limited by where you live - it's about being ready to act when someone is in need," Losardo added.

The Township's recognition of Monetti underscores a broader community value — that selflessness and quick thinking can make all the difference in a moment of crisis.

Maryann, who always had a smile on her face and a friendly greeting for visitors, handled OPRA (Open Public Records Act) requests from the public for the past 8 ½ years. Prior to that, she worked at the Westfield Area YMCA for over 13 years.

"If you ever made an OPRA request in Scotch Plains Township, interacted with the Clerk's office, or attended a Council meeting, chances are you crossed paths with Maryann," Scotch Plains Deputy Mayor Matt Adams wrote. "She never had a negative word to say about anyone, and always had a smile on her face."

An excerpt from Maryann's obituary:

Maryann E Matteo 83, died unexpectedly, on Monday October 20, 2025 at Overlook Hospital in Summit, NJ.

Maryann was referred to by many as a Maverick: A modern, feminist go-getter - never stopping to achieve her personal and professional goals and always pushing for a greater good for her family and society. She worked for over 20 years with Kodak Inc. in business equipment and retail sales and was a nationally recognized sales leader operating out of the NYC Metro Area. Most recently, Maryann was working during her retirement and up until she passed away with the Township of Scotch Plains in the clerks office of vital statistics often working on various projects.

In her spare time she built a number of practical skills that she could use and share with

others. She was a certified dietician, which she pursued for the benefit of her daughter in her battle with MS. Maryann was a Master Gardener and enjoyed cooking vegan and traditional Italian meals she learned from her family. She became a matriarch for the family and proudly served that role, constantly checking in with family members and organizing visits and reunions.

Maryann was a longstanding, dedicated and highly active member of the Scotch Plains community in various civic roles. Over the years she served as Corresponding Secretary and Board Member of the Fanwood UNICO chapter and volunteered annually at the Labor Day Festival and could be found at either the Super 50/50 booth or the UNICO chapter booth. She was also a devoted member of the St Bartholomew Church Community and would often be seen quietly saying her rosary in the Narthex prior to mass.

Maryann is survived by her loving children Jeanmarie Hasiak and husband Robert, Ralph Barletta and wife Sandra, James Barletta and wife Stephanie, 7 caring grandchildren, Keith, Blake, Scott, Jeffrey, Vincent, Mason and Amelia and 2 cherished great grandchildren, Chloe & Miles. She is also survived by her brother James Matteo and wife Sharon as well as many nieces and nephews.

Her impact, generosity and love will be sorely missed by all who had the privilege to know her.

#### **UNICO SUPPORTS ITALIAN STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM**

#### Scotch Plains-Fanwood UNICO

As part of its mission to contribute to worthy initiatives while promoting the image of Italian Americans and Italian heritage and culture, Scotch Plains-Fanwood UNICO collaborated this fall with the Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School (SP-F HS) Italian Student Exchange Program.

SP-F UNICO's involvement in the program,

which continues through early 2026, began in August when the organization presented Italian teacher Signora Carmela Lambert and her students with a \$2,000 donation to the SPFHS Italian Exchange program. In February 2026, 15 SP-F HS students will travel to Sala Consilina/Teggiano in the province of Campania and live with host families for 10 days. The

students will also attend the local high school, Pomponio Leto Liceo, in Teggiano. SP-F UNICO's donation will be put toward the students' excursion to Sorrento and their tour of Capri.

As part of the program, several exchange students from Sala Consilina/Teggiano arrived on October 9 to attend SP-F HS and live with local host families.

SP-F UNICO Second Vice-President Jeff Blanck and members Domenick and Michele Saliola attended a welcome breakfast for the Italian students on October 10. The students attended SP-F HS during their visit and returned to their homes in Italy on October 19.

SP-F UNICO remains grateful that the SP-F HS Board of Education continues to offer Italian class as part of its World Language program and looks forward to future collaborative opportunities with the Italian program.

#### A JOYFUL FREE FAMILY CONCERT - DEC 13





The Club supports the preservation of Twin Maples, education, the arts and humanitarian efforts. For over thirty-years the Club has awarded annual scholarships to deserving young, local women. The volunteer squad uses 100% of your taxdeductible\* donation to fully stock our ambulances with the most innovative equipment. Last year, a new, state-of-the-art ambulance was purchased to continue the tradition of extraordinary service. The organization also offers ongoing training and provides uniforms free of charge to our members.






