FIRST AID SQUAD ASSISTS WITH UNEXPECTED BIRTH

What began as a quiet Saturday evening for the Summit Volunteer First Aid Squad quickly turned into an unforgettable experience when members were dispatched to assist a woman in active labor on Passaic Avenue.

Upon arrival, Summit Police officers were already on scene with the new parents and their newborn daughter, who had made her arrival moments before the first ambulance crew. staffed by members Beverly Brown and John Reichart, reached the location. Both Beverly and John immediately provided post-delivery care to mother and baby while coordinating additional resources to ensure continued coverage for the city.

Additional member volunteers, Jolan Schluter, John Buscaino, Bob Mendes, Blair Clark-Schoeb, and Mary Kate Davidson, responded to assist with transporting the family to the hospital, while Atlantic Health paramedics provided advanced life support, ensuring that both mother and child received seamless, high-quality care. Reichart, a retired police supervisor, coordinated communications and logistics at the scene while Beverly attended to the new mother.

"After 44 years on the squad, I can honestly say that this was one of those calls that reminds us why we volunteer," said Crew Chief Beverly Brown, who joined the Summit Volunteer First Aid Squad in 1980. "Most of our calls involve people in crisis or distress, but this was pure joy, and it's something none of us will ever forget."

The Summit Volunteer First Aid Squad is a 100% volunteer organization providing emergency medical services to the City of Summit 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and 365 days

ENROLLING IN MEDICARE AND UPDATING YOUR PLAN

Turning 65 marks eligibility for Medicare, a federal health insurance program designed for seniors and certain individuals with disabilities. While the system can be complex, resources are available to help beneficiaries navigate enrollment, updates, and plan changes to ensure their coverage continues to meet their needs.

Original Medicare consists of Part A (hospital insurance) and Part B (medical insurance). Part A covers hospital stays, skilled nursing facilities, home health, and hospice care. Part B focuses on outpatient care, doctor visits, preventive screenings, and therapies. While comprehensive, Original Medicare leaves gaps in coverage, which can be supplemented through Medigap policies. These help with deductibles, co-pays, and sometimes foreign travel coverage, offering flexibility and predictability.

Medicare Advantage (Part C), offered by private insurers, combines Parts A and B and often includes additional benefits like vision, dental, hearing, fitness programs, and lower premiums. These plans have out-of-pocket maximums, but often require use of in-network providers.

Prescription drug coverage (Part D) is also offered through private plans. Each plan has a formulary outlining covered medications, costsharing structures, and potential coverage gaps, though assistance programs like "Extra Help" exist for those with limited income. New Jersey also provides state assistance through PAAD and Senior Gold to help seniors manage prescription

drug costs.

For higher-income beneficiaries, Medicare applies IRMAA (Income-Related Monthly Adjustment Amount), which adds extra costs to Part B and D premiums based on IRS tax information.

Enrollment timing is crucial. While some may delay enrollment due to employer coverage, late enrollment penalties apply if coverage lapses without creditable insurance.

Every year, Medicare beneficiaries have an opportunity to review and adjust their coverage. The Annual Enrollment Period (October 15 – December 7) allows switching between Original Medicare and Advantage plans, adding or changing drug plans, or returning to Original Medicare. Any changes take effect January 1. Additionally, the Medicare Advantage Open Enrollment (January 1 – March 31) allows those in Advantage plans to switch or return to Original Medicare.

When evaluating options, beneficiaries should consider cost, provider networks, additional benefits, drug coverage, and changes in their health or medications.

DR. ANGELA WEST OF TEMPLE SINAI HOSTS FREE ZOOM SERIES 'OBJECTS OF SURVIVAL: MATERIAL CULTURE AND HOLOCAUST MEMORY'

Dr. Angela West, adjunct professor in Drew University's Holocaust Studies Department, will present a free two-part Zoom series, titled "Objects of Survival: Material Culture and Holocaust Memory," on Thursdays, Dec. 4 and 11, at 1 p.m. via Zoom.

The series, sponsored by National Council of Jewish Women (NCJW), West Morris Section and coordinated by the Our Jewish World program, will offer a singular look at how Holocaust captives remained emotionally strong and survived during this most unimaginable of times through "material objects"--items they created, preserved, or stole from World War II Germany.

Our Jewish World is coordinated by Melanie Levitan and Ilene Dorf Manahan, both of Morristown.

Dr. West will focus on a variety of objects that have since served as powerful tools for uncovering and interpreting Holocaust history. Some of the donated historical items have connections to Morris County community members and their experiences.

In the first session, on Dec. 4, Dr. West will review the kind of stories that objects represent about resilience, survival and resistance, and the role such items--that is, the "material culture" created, saved or hidden in ghettos, camps or secret places--now play in helping future generations remember the past. Through the use of such deeply personal artifacts as a prisoner's uniform, handmade art from Bergen-Belsen, and a saved trapped door, Dr. West will make it clear how physical objects can preserve memory and offer new ways of connecting to individuals' stories during times of extremity.

In the second session, on Dec. 11, the speaker will turn to the end of World War II and the

liberation of the concentration camps, which curator, and currently the manager of the marked a turning point, but not an end for Holocaust survivors. In the years that followed, many remained in displaced persons (DP) camps, navigating the challenges of uncertainty while beginning to rebuild their lives. Dr. West will share survivors' testimonies from this complex postwar period through the lens of material culture and will include objects that accompanied individuals on their journeys--items that continued to be material witnesses to resilience, identity, and renewal in their postwar lives and offer powerful insights into how people chose to carry memory and reclaim agency in the aftermath of the Holocaust.

Besides teaching at Drew University, the speaker is also a consulting historian, museum Holocaust Remembrance Center at Temple Sinai in Summit. Her recent exhibit documents the stories of child survivors of the Holocaust who now reside in New Jersey. Dr. West is dedicated to advancing public understanding of the Holocaust, far-right extremism, and its implications for contemporary society.

NCJW confronts today's most urgent social and economic challenges facing women, children and families. Powered by the Jewish imperative to ensure dignity for all, we impact policy, advocate for justice, and support the community. Together our voices make a meaningful difference in the world.

The Club supports the preservation of Twin Maples, education, the arts and humanitarian efforts. For over thirty-years the Club has awarded annual scholarships to deserving young, local women. 





SUMMIT COMES TOGETHER TO FEED FAMILIES IN NEED

A little girl sat squished in the shopping cart among boxes of pasta, cans of fruit, and packages of dried beans, while her brother shopped in the aisle, asking his mom what was next on the grocery list.

"Pasta, fruit, beans," she said as they went. But this was not about filling their own pantry. They were packing a "Bag of Hope" for families in Summit who could not afford groceries right now.

Their mom, Angela Seavy, Assistant Director of Special Services for Summit Public Schools, was taking part too. The schools had asked families to help, and like hundreds of others, she and her children showed up ready to do their part.

For parents, it was a chance to show their kids what community service really looks like. Sure, writing a check is still important, because GRACE, the local nonprofit that provides food and essentials to Summit families in need, relies on donations to keep the program running. But in this case, kids could also see it, touch it, and be part of it. Helping your neighbors wasn't just an idea—it was something you could actually do, aisle by aisle, bag by bag.

All over Summit, families were doing the same thing. Simple shopping trips turned into lessons in generosity and empathy. Some parents said their children asked questions about why families might need help, and it opened up conversations about kindness, responsibility, and the impact of their actions.

Even before families went out to shop and pack bags, GRACE was feeling the strain. By the third week of October, the nonprofit noticed an uptick in families needing help. Many households that rely on SNAP benefits had already run out of funds for the month and worried their November benefits would not arrive.

The monthly in-kind donations and USDA allocations arrived on October 29, and GRACE found the shelf-stable and frozen goods were far less than usual. Protein sources were also greatly affected. Meat and egg prices had jumped, making it harder to stretch our donations. Filling the gap with outside purchases would have cost at least

\$30,000, well beyond the nonprofit's budget.

When the county announced there was no emergency SNAP distribution and not enough staff to run one, GRACE knew it was time to call on its community.

"Our friends and partner organizations always say to just ask when we need help," said Amanda Block, Founder of GRACE. "A call to the JLS Community VP solidified the idea."

The Junior League of Summit acted as the anchor donor organization, committing the first pledges for donated grocery bags. After the JLS made their commitment, Block reached out to local churches and community groups to respond to growing need. The Summit Public Schools also answered the call, delivering 288 bags prior to the NJ Teachers Convention. Soon, additional grocery bags were pledged from Brandywine, Central Presbyterian Church, Calvary Church, the Firefighters Mutual Benevolent Association, Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, St. John's, and the Summit Democrats.

Most of the remaining bags arrived on Sunday, November 9, with the Summit Fire Department helping to receive and store hundreds of them. Calvary Church expanded its pledge from 300 bags to 1,000 and staged a bagging event where 200 volunteers worked side by side, turning pledges into real grocery bags.

At Calvary Church, volunteers started arriving early. By the time bagging began, people were lined up like they were waiting for a big event, ready to help. Kids joined in too, coloring notes and writing messages that went into each bag.

"It was amazing! People were lined up like they were waiting for heaven to help us. We had children coloring notes and writing messages that went into each bag," said Cynthia Falco.

More than 1,600 Bags of Hope have now been collected, with a few more arriving each day. These bags contain groceries that help GRACE families feel that they have what they want and need in order to feed their families. Thanks to the generosity of the Summit community, GRACE is now well stocked in shelf-stable goods for all of November and possibly into the first week of

"Each bag might seem simple, but together they make a real difference," said Block. "They give families food, yes. They provide comfort and stability. But even more than that, they show just what can happen when neighbors respond to a need and step in to help. This was a massive, rapid mobilization effort, showing the kind of community spirit that makes Summit a place that people want to call home."
