BEST LAKE PARK NOW RIVER-FRIENDLY CERTIFIED

The Borough of Watchung is proud to share that through their Environmental Commission's dedicated efforts, Watchung has recently achieved another environmentally friendly certification. The Borough of Watchung's Best Lake Park is now River-Friendly certified by New Jersey River-Friendly.

New Jersey River-Friendly's certification program promotes volunteer action to bring clean water and healthy environments to communities, businesses, schools, and residents across the state. The program revolves around four main components: Water Quality Management, Water Conservation, Wildlife Habitat Enhancement, and Education & Outreach.

To become River-Friendly certified, the Commission and community volunteers have worked on the Best Lake Riparian Buffer Project since 2022. They have planted and

maintained over 200 native trees and shrubs along a 300-foot stretch of stream east of Best Lake. The buffer project filters stormwater runoff entering the stream and reduces erosion along the stream's bank. The stream buffer also helps provide a needed level of flood control by absorbing excess water during storm events. In addition, the buffer also serves to enhance habitat for wildlife and pollinators. The trees and shrubs provide shade for the stream, which keeps water temperatures low enough to support a healthy fish population. There are also educational signs in Best Lake Park providing details on the riparian project.

TWO CONCERTS: HOLIDAY TENORS & BROADWAY THROUGH THE AGES



New Jersey Festival Orchestra ushers in the holiday season with two major December performances that showcase the full breadth of the orchestra's artistic range.

RESCUE SQUAD HONORS LIFE OF VERA STINE AND CELEBRATES THEIR 75TH ANNIVERSARY AT TREE OF LIGHTS EVENT

This year, we are celebrating the Watchung Rescue Squad's 75 years of service to our community. Since its establishment in 1950, the Watchung Rescue Squad has operated as a fully volunteer organization providing life-saving emergency response to the residents of our town. Our volunteers have dedicated countless hours to training, taking calls, and administrative duties to keep our squad going strong for our neighbors. Join us in celebrating our milestone of 75 years in service, we will continue to work our hardest to provide for many more years to come!

Members of the Watchung Rescue Squad will remember the life of Vera Stine and celebrate the 75th Anniversary of the Watchung Rescue Squads establishment.

Vera Stine was born on March 24th, 1940 and raised in Linden, NJ. After marrying her husband, Rowland, she moved to North Plainfield where she tried to join the town's rescue squad. She was denied, as "women are not allowed to drive on the Rescue Squad at night because it was too dangerous." Undeterred, Stine joined the Watchung Rescue Squad in December 1967 as a full member, serving on the Wednesday night crew and various committees. She rose through the ranks as crew chief, sergeant, lieutenant, and became the Watchung Rescue Squad's first female captain in 1977. She served the Watchung Rescue Squad for 32 years, from 1967-1999. She also shared her knowledge of emergency

medicine as an EMT instructor at Union County College in the 1980s. Her commitment to service extended to the Watchung Cub Scouts, where for 15 years, she played an instrumental role in shaping young lives long after her sons were adults. The Borough of Watchung celebrates her long standing service and dedication to the community on her birthday, March 24th, proclaimed as Vera Stine Day.

FARE-FREE SHUTTLE TO LYONS VA MED CENTER

Somerset County

Veterans traveling to the Lyons VA Medical Center in Bernards Township from the Lyons Train Station will be able to catch a fare-free ride thanks to a cooperative partnership between Somerset County, the Lyons VA Medical Center, NJ TRANSIT, and the New Jersey Department of Military and Veterans Affairs (DMAVA).

The new Veterans Lyons Shuttle began operations on November 7, 2025 and will run 5 days a week, Monday through Friday, from 8:30 a.m. through 4:30 p.m. The shuttle will run from the Lyons Train Station to the Lyons VA Medical Center and back, in a loop, approximately 8 times daily, supporting and coordinating with the preexisting Morris & Essex Line rail schedule.

“We are pleased to support this shuttle connection, which will make it easier for veterans to access the care they need at the Lyons VA Medical Center,” said NJ Transit President & CEO Kris Kolluri. “This partnership helps us close another gap in first- and last-mile service that will directly improve the travel experience for those who depend on public transit for their healthcare needs.”

In addition to Veterans, employees from the

Lyons VA Medical Center as well as friends and family will be able to use the shuttle for greater ease of travel.

“For too long, New Jersey veterans with disabilities have faced challenges accessing reliable transportation to the Lyons VA Medical Center. That changes with the launch of the Lyons VA Shuttle Service,” said Congressman Tom Kean, Jr. (NJ-07). “This milestone demonstrates what we can achieve when we work together across all levels of government. On the federal level, I am also pleased to build on this progress by introducing legislation to ensure this service remains a sustained, long-term solution. With Veterans Day just around the corner, this launch could not be more timely — it will improve lives, ease burdens, and honor those who have served our nation.”

The ADA accessible shuttle, which was funded under the Casino Revenue Program (SCDRTAP) through the FTA Section 5310 program administered by NJ Transit, will seat 16 passengers and additionally has 2 wheelchair securement locations. Somerset County will operate the shuttle as well as maintain the vehicle for use.

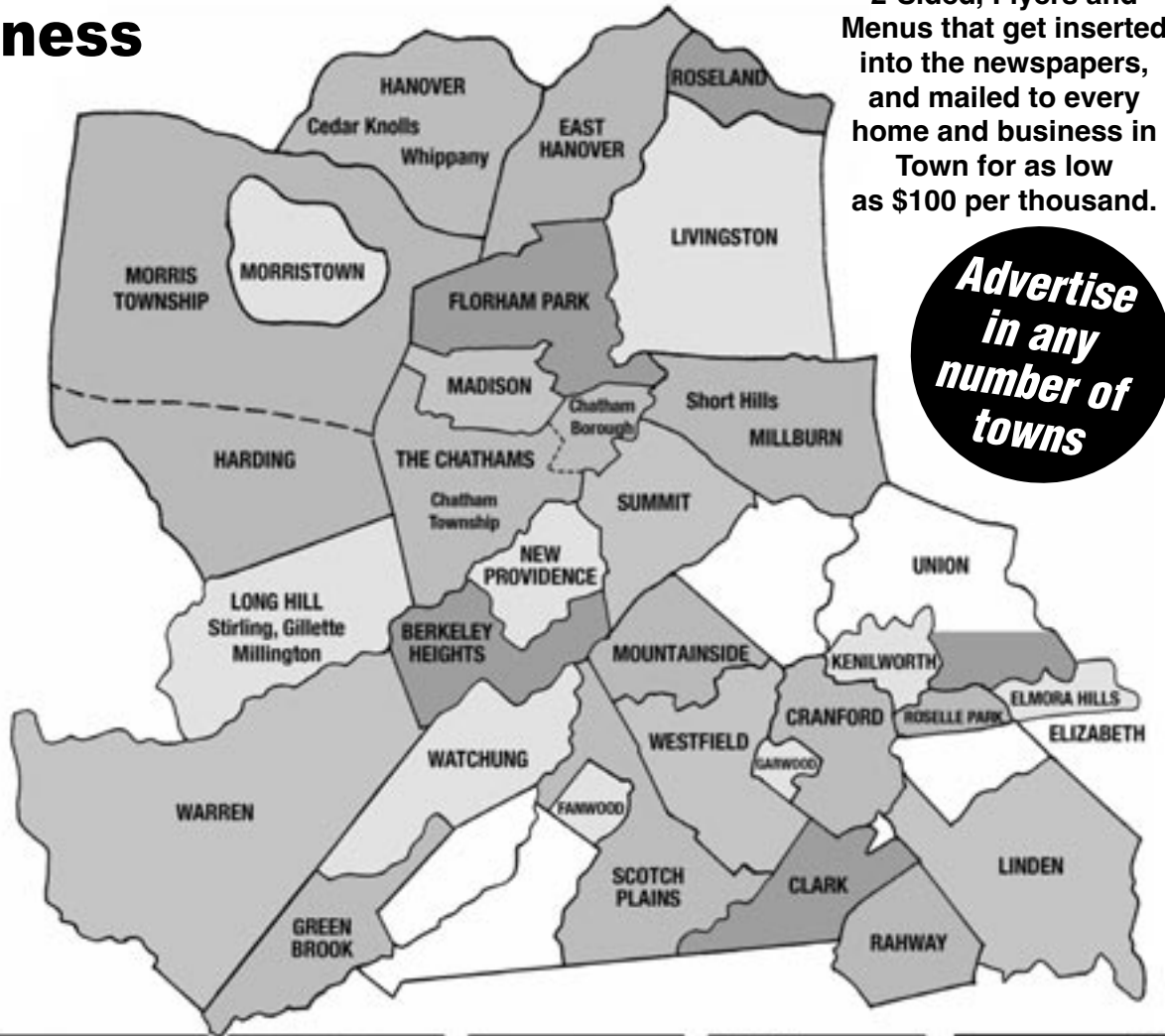
