GRACE GIVING - A COMMUNITY THANKSGIVING

The Summit "Community" Center lived up to its name, with the entire building transformed into a true community gathering. The gym held a buffet line filled with traditional holiday fare, turkey and gravy, stuffing and potatoes, it was all there. BMS/Sodexo made the turkey, gravy, and stuffing, The Overlook Hospital kitchens, Pizza Vita, and Brandywine contributed all the sides: cranberry sauce, green beans, potatoes, pasta, and corn bread. The centerpieces were beautiful fruit baskets, donated by Atlantic Health. The placemats, created by Summit elementary school students, set the stage with warm colors, festive scenes, sweet jokes, and detailed fall themes.

Performance artists brought their craft to entertain, from lively musicians offering sing-along renditions of classic favorites to authentic dancers from Peru performing, all emceed by the Valerio family.

In the next room, volunteers played with kids in the open gym, while down the hall, kids colored Thanksgiving pictures, but karaoke was the name of the game.

Summit's Department of Community Programs and Oakes have been partners with GRACE since 2021, when the decision was made to host a Thanksgiving event inclusive of the entire Summit community.

More than 50 volunteers did everything from greeting guests, setting up chafing dishes, serving, and washing dishes. Volunteers even showed up early to warm the food at the Oakes Center kitchen, shuttling it over to the Community Center which required a coordinated effort of volunteer teams.

Vanilla? Chocolate? Sprinkles? Guests could grab an ice cream from the Danny's Soft Serve ice cream truck parked out front. For those who preferred to stay warm in their seats and watch the entertainment, volunteers took orders and delivered ice cream cones to them. GRACE ensures events are accessible to people of all abilities, so meal deliveries and the City's senior bus provided door-to-door transportation from senior housing.

And it was the meal that kept on giving. On the way out, guests were invited to take boxed-up leftovers home and even grab a pie or fruit basket.

As with any good Thanksgiving dinner, more was made than could be consumed. In this case, leftovers were packaged up and delivered to three different area veterans groups.

GRACE engages with community leaders and partner organizations to better understand and respond to local needs. From planning to execution, special thanks go out to the Summit Department of Community Programs and Oakes for continuing this tradition in partnership with GRACE.

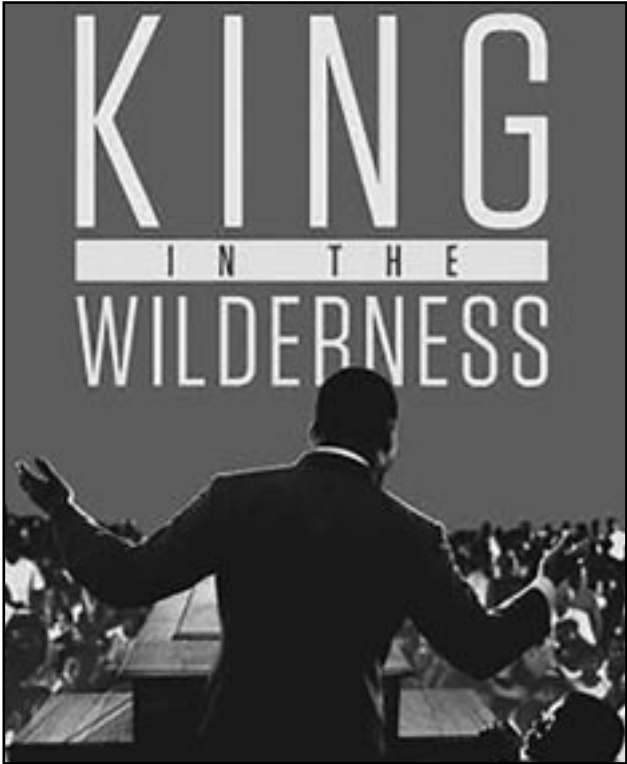

In honor of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s life and legacy, the Summit College Club will co-host a screening and discussion of the documentary "King in the Wilderness." This event will take place on Sunday, January 18, 2026, from 1:30 to 4:30 p.m. at the New Providence Memorial Library.

The documentary focuses on the last two years of Dr. King's life, highlighting key events such as his work with the Chicago Freedom Movement, anti-Vietnam War protests, the "I've Been to the Mountaintop" speech, and ending with his assassination and funeral. The moving film features interviews with several of Dr. King's friends and colleagues, who share their recollections of his actions and beliefs.

Following the film's screening, Ms. Maureen Grant of the Summit College Club will moderate a question-and-answer discussion with the audience.

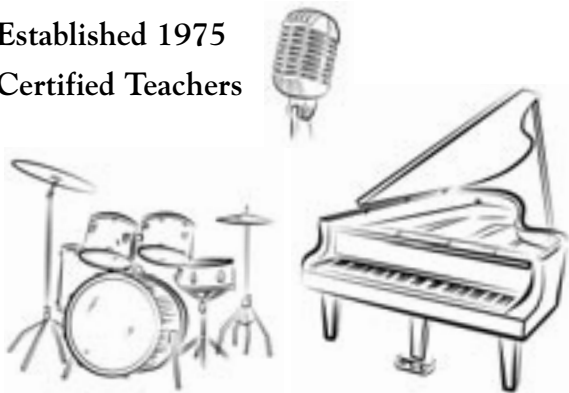

PHOENIX RYDZEWSKI EARNS BOY SCOUT EAGLE RANK

Summit Boy Scouts Troop 67 is celebrating a significant achievement as Phoenix Rydzewski has earned the rank of Eagle Scout, the highest honor in Scouting. A dedicated member of BSA Troop 67, Phoenix reached this milestone through years of service, leadership, and commitment — culminating in a community project that will benefit local families for years to come.

For his Eagle Scout service project, Phoenix partnered with Amanda Block and Apollo Hrehorovich of GRACE, a local nonprofit focused on combating food insecurity. Together, they led an initiative to refloor the Cornog Field House, transforming the facility to better support GRACE’s food-distribution operations. The renovation enhances storage capacity and directly supports GRACE’s mission to provide nutritious meals and resources to more than 700 food-insecure families in the community.

The project required extensive planning, fundraising, and collaboration. Phoenix organized volunteer teams, coordinated supplies, and oversaw construction to ensure the work was completed safely and efficiently. His leadership not only produced a more functional storage space but also strengthened community partnerships and raised awareness about local hunger-relief efforts.

“Phoenix’s project is a perfect example of how young people can make a tangible difference,” said Scoutmaster Robert Rydzewski of Troop 67.

“His initiative and hard work will have a lasting impact on GRACE’s ability to serve families in need.”

Earning the Eagle Scout rank is a rare and notable accomplishment, achieved by only a small percentage of Scouts nationwide. Phoenix’s commitment to service and community

improvement reflects the core values of Scouting and sets a strong example for others.

The community extends its congratulations to Eagle Scout Phoenix Rydzewski for this outstanding achievement and for his meaningful contributions to strengthening local support for families in need.

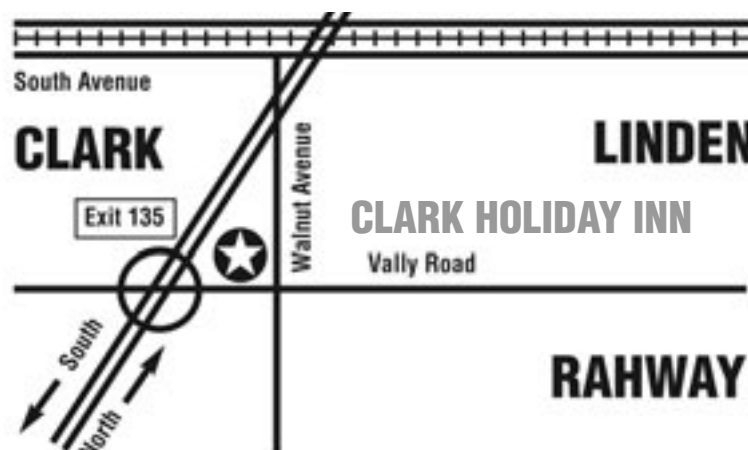

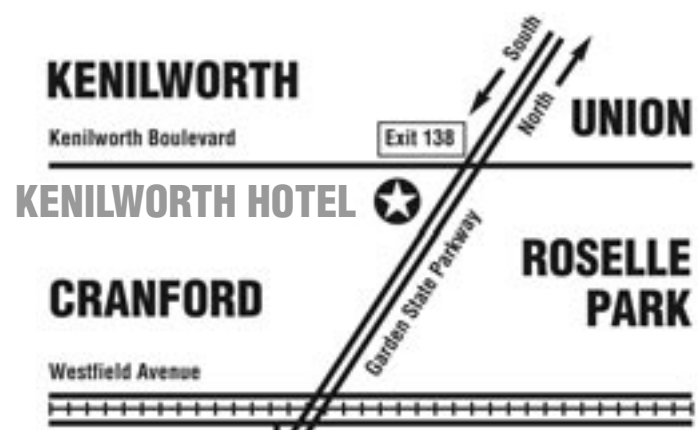

JANUARY SPEAKERS PROGRAM FOR THE SUMMIT AREA OLD GUARD

The Summit Area Old Guard is a social, educational, and recreational organization that serves men of retirement age. We meet Tuesdays, 9:30 a.m., at the New Providence Presbyterian Church located at 1307 Springfield Ave – we encourage visitation, and all are welcome. Our motto is “Come for the Programs. Stay for the Friends.” The organization was founded in 1930. Our website address is summitoldguard.org.

In January, we will have four speakers:

TUESDAY, JANUARY 6TH: RICHARD LANDER

Shares a deep, personal connection to the Civil War as the great-grandson of John R. Lander, a Union soldier. John emigrated from Germany and enlisted with an Illinois regiment at the remarkably early age of fourteen, serving for the entire duration of the war. This military service instilled a generational interest: members of the Lander family have continuously studied the Civil War and maintained membership in the Sons of the Union Veterans of the Civil War (SUVCW). In his presentation, Richard will detail the complex tapestry of events that led to the conflict, covering the cultural, political, economic, and military factors at play. Attendees are encouraged to note the striking parallels between these historical forces and current events.

TUESDAY, JANUARY 13TH: DR. DEAN EPPLER

Though the Apollo Program was a revolutionary 20th-century achievement, many of its difficulties and successes have faded into

historical obscurity. Dr. Dean Eppler, a retired NASA scientist with over 35 years in human spaceflight, possesses the breadth of experience to bring the mission into focus. His background includes Apollo Program history, advanced space suit engineering, ISS facility development, and training/selecting astronauts (1990, 1996, and 1998 selections). Dr. Eppler will identify the key areas of the mission's success and discuss Apollo's enduring contributions to human spaceflight.

TUESDAY, JANUARY 20TH: HOWARD MEYER

A long-time leader in New Jersey volunteer EMS. He is the past president of the EMS Council of New Jersey, the country's largest volunteer squad association, and served as its volunteer legislative director for over 20 years. Since 1971, he has served in leadership roles, including president and chief, across all types of New Jersey environments—rural, suburban, and urban. Howard will detail the history and

evolution of the volunteer EMS system, highlighting its critical importance to the state. His talk will cover key events and the major challenges volunteer squads face moving forward.

TUESDAY, JANUARY 27TH: BOB GULA

The Forgotten Victory Trail explores one of America's most overlooked Revolutionary chapters in the brutal campaigns of 1780 in NJ, when burning towns, secret networks, and fierce local resistance helped turn the tide of the war. The Battles of Springfield and Connecticut Farms in June 1780 were critical in the defense of New Jersey (and Washington's forces in Morristown) and in the weakening of the British Forces ahead of the Battle of Yorktown. Our speaker will be Bob Gula, Education Officer –West Fields Chapter of Sons of the American Revolution Patriotic Instructor, Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War Member and General Society of Mayflower Descendants.

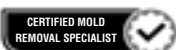

STATE CANCELS LEGAL NOTICE MANDATE

We rarely ever hear about the government reducing taxes but it happened this year when New Jersey Governor Phil Murphy eliminated the mandate that legal notices must be printed in a newspaper.

The antiquated mandate is decades old and the cost for the advertising was paid for by public funds from municipalities, counties, school districts, and independent authorities. It was a lucrative business for the publications and more recently the majority of their revenue. Without the mandate the fear in the newspaper industry was that the publications relying on the legal advertising income will not survive.

In some cases the majority of content in the newspaper had been the legal ads. In question was the criteria for the mandate, i.e., were the publications meeting the required numbers of paid subscriptions, and circulation.

The idea of doing away with the mandate, though practical, was considered political poison. No lawmaker wanted to be deemed responsible as the cause for newspapers' closures and people losing their jobs. During the Governor Christi administration the Star Ledger warned that doing away with the mandates would cause 250 weekly newspapers to close.

What brought about the change is a successful lawsuit filed by the County of Warren which named the Star Ledger and Daily Record as defendants. The suit may have been the last straw in the Ledger's decision to stop printing the newspaper in January of 2025.

Local governments will now be required to publish their legal notices on their websites.
