Regular business was suspended at Clark Township’s 2026 Reorganization meeting to recognize Laurie Sheldon, a long-time member of the Clark Volunteer Emergency Squad (CVES). Laurie was recognized at the National Conference of Emergency Medical Services receiving the 2025 Department of Health – Office of Emergency Medical Services Lifetime Achievement Award. In honor of this achievement, Mayor Angel Albanese announced a Proclamation to formally recognize Laurie’s contribution to the community.

Ms. Sheldon has been with CVES for over forty years and has held many positions including president, captain, EMS Council delegate, and trustee as well as serving on numerous committees. She is currently the EMS professor at Union College of New Jersey, training over a thousand emergency medical technicians. As helping her students forge their futures, many of her students have also served on the squad. Laurie received a BA in Business from Rutgers making her well equipped to facilitate the squad in its practical and business operations.

Professor Sheldon is a life-long resident of Clark. She is

married to Danny Sheldon, former Clark Fire Department Chief and owner of Sheldon Electric. Both have pursued careers in the healthcare industry with Daniel becoming a Physician Assistant at St. Barnabas Hospital and Katie a pharmacist with Hackensack.

Laurie’s passion for serving is truly extraordinary. She is the CVES liaison to the Clark Township Council and the Office of Emergency Management. ALJ HIGH SCHOOL NAMED TO ADVANCED PLACEMENT SCHOOL HONOR ROLL

Clark Public Schools
College Board announced that Arthur L. Johnson High School has been named to the 2025 Advanced Placement® Program (AP®) School Honor Roll, earning bronze distinction. ALJ has been recognized for student success in the Advanced Placement program while broadening participation.

Schools can earn this recognition annually based on criteria that reflect a commitment to increasing college-going culture, providing opportunities for students to earn college credit, and maximizing college readiness.

ALJ had 49% of seniors who took at least one AP Exam during high school, 27% of seniors scoring a 3 or higher on at least one AP Exam, and 7% of seniors who took five or more AP Exams! The 7% actually earned the school a silver recognition in that category.

ALJ offers more than 20 AP Courses. Students enrolled in AP courses engage in higher-level discussions, solve problems collaboratively, and learn to effectively communicate their thoughts in writing. AP courses also serve to help students acquire the skills and habits needed to be successful in college, including critical time management skills.

According to Superintendent Edward Grande, “ALJ’s inclusion on this most impressive listing is a testimony to the successful efforts of our students, staff, and administration coupled with

the strong partnerships with our Crusader families. Go Crusaders!”

“AP gives students opportunity to engage with college-level work, earn college credit and placement, and build professional career skills they can use no matter what path they choose after high school,” said Trevor Packer, head of the AP program. “Congratulations to this year’s AP School Honor Roll recipients for proving it’s possible to expand participation in these rigorous courses and still drive strong performance.”

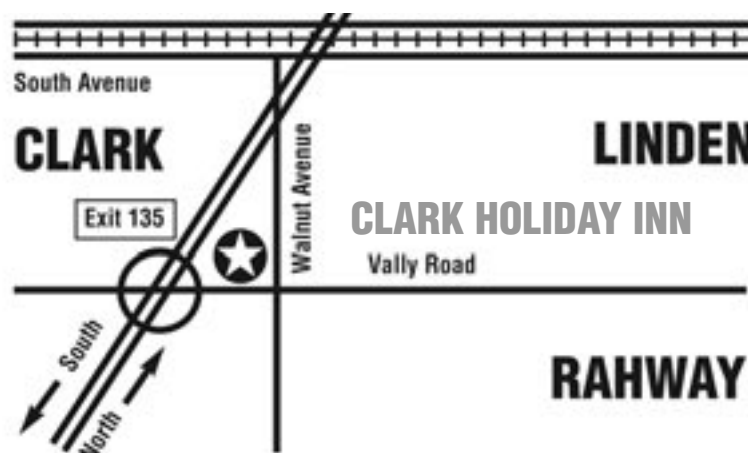

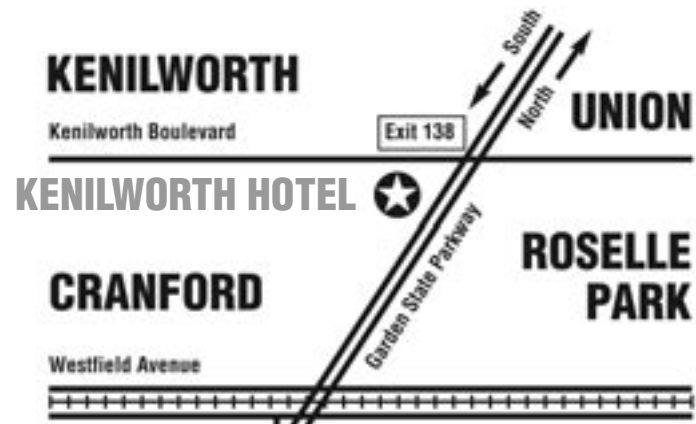

SHARP-SHINNED HAWK RELEASED BACK TO WILD

This feisty Sharp-shinned Hawk was admitted on 12/22 after being found in a yard in Warren following a window strike. On intake, the hawk had bloody nares and mouth, consistent with head trauma often seen after collisions. The nares are a bird’s nostrils, located near the base of the beak, and bleeding there often points to head or facial trauma from collisions.

With supportive care and time to heal, this "Sharpie" as we call them, made great progress and was moved to an outside flight cage on 12/28/25. After proving strong, steady flight and good awareness, the hawk was successfully released back to the wild on 1/2/2026.

Sharp-shinned Hawks are incredibly fast and agile forest hunters, built to weave through dense trees while chasing small birds. That same speed

and focus, however, can make them especially vulnerable to window strikes when reflective glass looks like open sky or habitat.

Remember, small changes matter, adding window decals is a simple way to help protect avian wildlife.

ABOUT THE RAPTOR TRUST

The Raptor Trust is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization located at 1390 White Bridge Rd., Millington, NJ. They provide free care and assistance to injured, sick, or orphaned wild birds. They offer educational programs to the public about wild birds, especially birds of prey. They strive to provide a human example for others. RAPTOR TRUST SUMMER SCHOLARS PROGRAM

Each year from mid-May through August, The Raptor Trust receive hundreds of injured, orphaned, or displaced nestling and fledgling songbirds found by citizens. We see this time as a perfect opportunity to provide experience and education to students who wish to learn about wildlife care and rehabilitation.

PURPOSE AND ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

Summer scholars are responsible for assisting staff in maintaining standards of care for injured adult birds, preparing diets and feeding orphaned/displaced young songbirds and waterfowl, and helping with general upkeep of the center. Additionally, students will learn from wildlife professionals, and learn about a variety of wildlife careers.

POSITION DATES: MAY THROUGH AUGUST 2026

Scheduling: Approximately 24-40 hours per week, including some evenings and weekends

Location: The Raptor Trust. 1390 White Bridge Road, Millington, NJ 07946

This is an unpaid, volunteer position. College students committed to this position may meet the criteria for eligibility to apply for our volunteer scholarship. This opportunity can also be modified to meet most schools’ criteria in qualifying for an academic “internship” or experience credit.

OPPORTUNITIES AND LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

- Learn the basics of wildlife rehabilitation
- Hand-feed nestling and fledgling songbirds
- Prepare specially formulated diets for a wide variety of bird species
- Learn how a species’ natural history, including diet, habitat, and social patterns affect its rehabilitation
- Monitor and take notes on patient health and behavior under the direction of our technicians
- Observe various diagnostic procedures including phlebotomy, microscopy, and radiography
- Practice identification of common songbirds, raptors, and waterfowl
- Learn how to be a wildlife professional across a variety of careers and pathways
- Greet and interact with the general public and wildlife agencies while assisting with bird admissions, phone calls, and guest inquiries
- Develop and practice skills in teamwork, communication, time management, critical thinking, and task prioritization
- Attend workshops led by a variety of professionals currently working in the wildlife field
- Learn about the interactions between human activity and wildlife populations
- Become familiar with ethical, moral, and legal considerations regarding avian rehabilitation, rehabilitation of nuisance species, and the use of euthanasia
- Learn the impact of nuisance species on native wildlife

- Observe the treatment of common human-caused issues, such as rodenticide poisoning, lead poisoning, and window strikes.
- Educate the public on safe human-wildlife interactions

The position includes observation of raptors but does not guarantee experience in raptor care or handling.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS & QUALIFICATIONS:

- Must be at least 18 years of age and currently enrolled in a college degree program and in good academic standing, OR a recent graduate.
- Must have access to a reliable means of transportation and be available for evening, weekend, and holiday scheduling.
- Ability to lift and carry at least 25lbs, spend up to 8 hours mostly on their feet, and tolerate outdoor working conditions.
- Ability to follow directions, work well as part of a team, and communicate effectively with the staff and general public.
- Enthusiasm for education, conservation, and the mission, goals, and values of The Raptor Trust
- Self-directed, organized, reliable, and able to manage multiple tasks simultaneously

While students in all areas of study are welcome to apply, preference may be given to students who have completed or are currently enrolled in relevant coursework including Ecology, Biology, and Animal Science related studies.

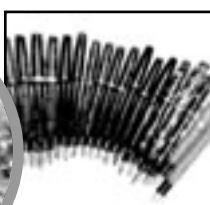
