PRESENTATION ON KRAMER MANOR - FEB. 24TH

Historical Society of Scotch Plains and Fanwood

“Kramer Manor” is the captivating history of a Black Community located right here in Fanwood and Scotch Plains. It proudly marked its centennial in 1924 and, less than a year later, it celebrated another historic designation— inclusion in the New Jersey Black Heritage Trail. Kramer Manor, a neighborhood comprising approximately one hundred households, has a rich history. For most of its 100+ years it stood as an all-Black enclave, but today it has transformed into a thriving and desirable multicultural community of single-family homes and green spaces.

The Historical Society of Scotch Plains and Fanwood is honored to have Jill Jackson-Jones, a respected member of our community, share her insights and educate us about Kramer Manor at our upcoming February 24th evening meeting. Jill, who grew up in the Kramer Manor neighborhood in the 1970’s and 1980’s, now resides in her childhood home. Her dedication to preserving the history of Kramer Manor is evident in her roll as a member of the Social Justice Matters (SJM) organization. Alongside Pamela Brooks, another SJM member, Jill spearheaded the process of tracing the history of Kramer Manor. Their efforts culminated in the successful application for Kramer Manor’s

inclusion in the Black Heritage Trail. Beyond her remarkable contributions to SJM, Jill and her husband Felton Jones, own a Southern Catering service on E. 2nd Street, Scotch Plains.

The Historical Society of Scotch Plains and Fanwood cordially invites you to join us for this timely meeting on Tuesday evening February 24th, starting at 7:30 p.m. Prepare to be amazed by this remarkable history of this neighborhood of 51 acres. In 1924, it was purchased by a New York City-based real estate firm, Kramer Realities, Inc. The owners, brothers Harry and Hyman Kramer of Russian-Jewish heritage, actively marketed it as a destination for black families.

Join us as we delve into the obstacles faced and overcome by these pioneering buyers. Bring your family, friends and neighbors to this enriching meeting and embark on a. Journey through the captivating story and legacy of Kramer Manor. The meeting is free and open to all, and it is held at the historic Shady Rest Country Club, another significant landmark on the Black Heritage Trail. Located at 820 Jerusalem Road (at the corner of Plainfield Avenue) in Scotch Plains, the club offers a historic setting for refreshments and fellowship after the presentation.

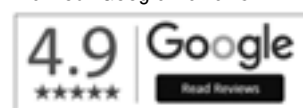

UNICO MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM DEADLINE MARCH 1

Scotch Plains-Fanwood UNICO
The Scotch Plains-Fanwood chapter of UNICO will once again be holding its annual Memorial Scholarship Program. All Scotch Plains and Fanwood high school seniors of verifiable Italian heritage are eligible to apply for a scholarship to help defray costs of their first year of post-secondary education.


While students must be residents of Scotch Plains or Fanwood, they can attend any high school, even if the school is outside the local area. Students will need to provide a wide range of information regarding their academic performance, Italian heritage verification, extracurricular and community involvement, and so forth. Additionally, parents and/or guardians will supply household income information. Once

applicants submit their information, SP-F UNICO members will review all applications - which will be anonymous to ensure fairness - and select their top choices for scholarship awards. The scholarship awards are as follows:

- Four (4) \$2500 scholarships to students attending four-year higher education institution
- One (1) \$1500 scholarship to a student attending a two-year community college
- One (1) \$1500 scholarship to a student attending a vocational, technical, or trade school program

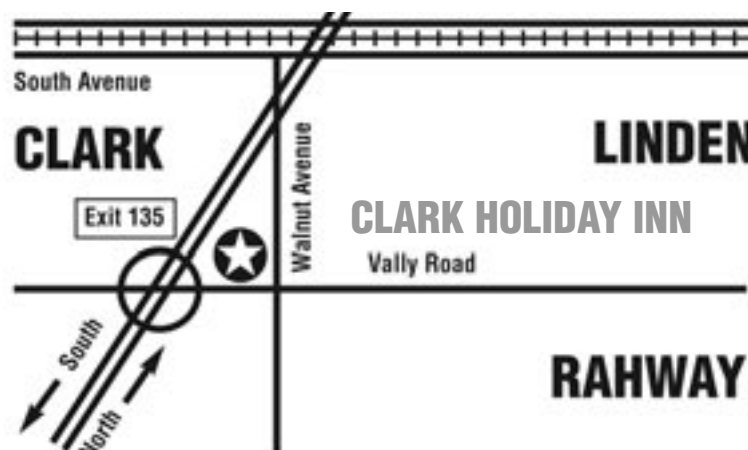

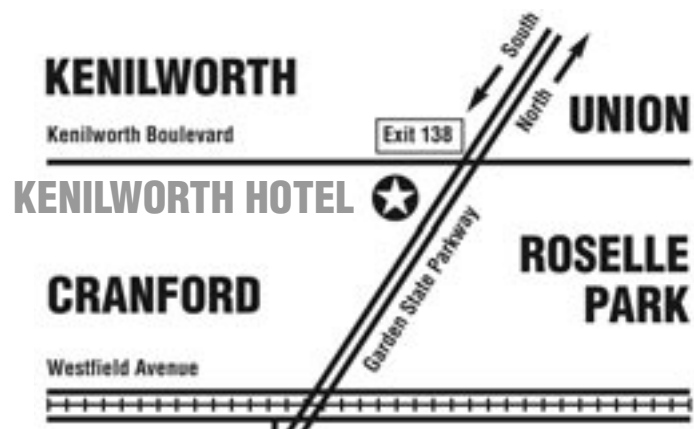

BLACK HISTORY PROGRAM - FEB 16TH

College Club of Fanwood-Scotch Plains

Dr. Larry Hogan and Mr. Kevin Kane will present the program "Before You Can Say Jackie Robinson: Black Baseball in America in the Era of the Color Line at Mira Vie 295 South Avenue in Fanwood on February 16th at 7:30 p.m. This event is free and open to the public, and refreshments will be provided.

Dr. Larry Hogan is a Professor of History Emeritus from Union County College, where he taught African American History for 37 years. He is the author of several works on this topic, including 'The Forgotten History of African-American Baseball'. Dr. Hogan was the Executive Director of the documentary Before You Can Say Jackie Robinson: Black Baseball in American in the Era of the Color Line. The current program, which features exhibits, has been shown throughout the country. According to John Thorn, official historian for MLB, "Historian Larry Hogan basks in baseball's shadowed fields. He is

a national treasure."

Although black professional baseball began in the 1880s and ended shortly after Hall of Fame player Jackie Robinson entered the game, there is little public awareness of this important history. Dr. Logan's program affirms the importance of this history, and its great players, while explaining the historical context and barriers faced by these heroes. Selections from the documentary Dr. Hogan directed will be played, and Mr. Kevin Kane will also present his poem "Breaking the Line with the Mudville Nine." Mr. Kane is a writer, musician, and playwright. His Negro League poetic response to poem "Casey at the Bat" has been performed at the National Baseball Hall of Fame.

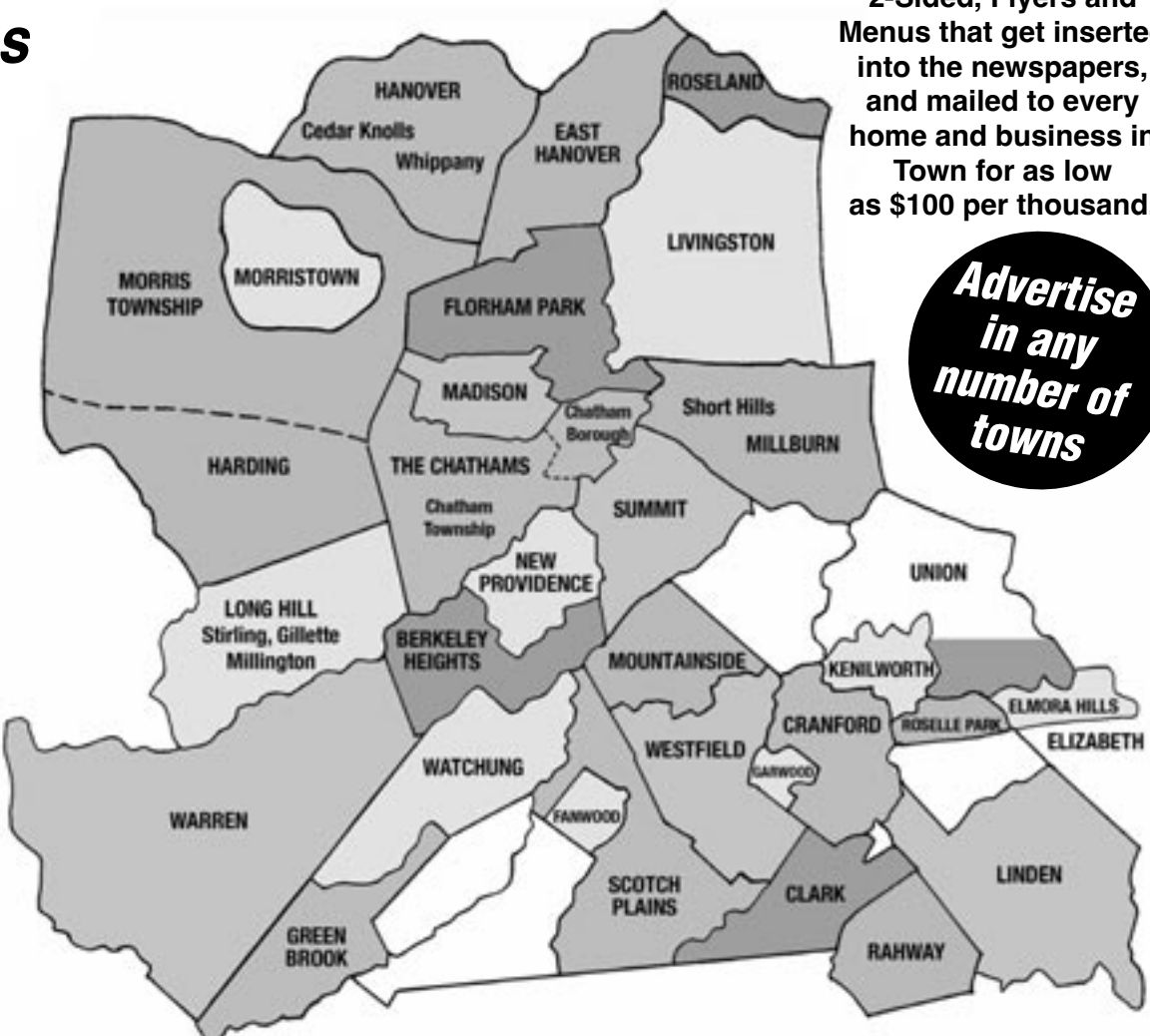
