FORMER GOVERNOR AND RESIDENT RICHARD CODEY PASSES

Borough of Roseland

The Borough of Roseland, NJ offers its sincere condolences to the family of former Governor, long-time State Senator, and Roseland resident Richard Codey. In his honor, the Roseland flag was lowered to half-staff at all Borough buildings.

"Governor Codey held many titles in his lifetime, Governor, Senator, Assemblyman, Coach, Husband, Father & Grandfather but the one title that was paramount to success in every role he served in was advocate. Governor Codey tirelessly advocated for those who could not advocate for themselves, his greatest accomplishment and a true measure of a public servant," said Roseland Mayor James R. Spango. "His resolve to fight for what he felt was right and just regardless of any outside influence or pressure is a trait that embodies his spirit and passion to serve our communities. For a man that found levity in any situation to bring people together, it wouldn't be a true tribute to Governor Codey without referencing his one-liners, they were classic.

"I was proud to serve him as his Mayor, but privileged to be his friend. Thoughts and prayers to Mary Jo, Christopher, Kevin & Danielle, Brooke, Patrick & Paige from Dawn and I, may you have a lifetime filled with memories of all the great times you shared. Our entire Borough will remember Governor Codey for his half a century of public service in the State Legislature and for being our State Senator for many years. Our thoughts and prayers are with the entire Codey family at this time."

Governor Richard Codey grew up in Orange but moved to Roseland later in life. He was elected to the General Assembly in 1973 at just 27 years old and after a decade of service, he was elected to the State Senate, where he was continually re-elected and served until his retirement in 2023.

Governor Codey was an advocate for mental health issues and among his accomplishments were a statewide ban on indoor smoking, the creation of an inspector general position, creating policy for steroid testing in school sports, and banning junk food and soda from school lunches. In 2012, Codey and his wife founded The Codey Fund for Mental Health, which aims to "ensure that compassionate, quality mental healthcare is accessible to everyone and that the stigma associated with mental illness is overcome through public awareness and education."

Governor Codey will lie in state at the New Jersey Statehouse on Thursday, January 22, with a wake being held at St. John's in Orange on Friday, January 23 and a funeral mass at the Cathedral Basilica of the Sacred Heart in Newark on Saturday, January 24.

DOG & CAT LICENSE RENEWALS - DEADLINE IS FEB 27

Dog & Cat Licenses are up for renewal for the year 2026. The renewal must be received no later than February 27, 2026.

A basic license fee for neutered/spayed dogs is \$10.00 and is \$13.00 if the dog is not neutered or spayed. The fee for a cat license is \$8.00. Please be advised that an additional \$5.00 late fee is

charged on top of the base fee if payment and all applicable paperwork is not received by the end of February.

Before submitting payment and paperwork, please check to ensure your dog/cat's rabies vaccination expiration date is compliant. A Dog/Cat License cannot be issued unless the rabies vaccination is effective through October 31, 2026 OR you include a vaccination exemption letter from your veterinarian.

Along with check payment, license renewal form, and current rabies information, please include a stamped, self-addressed envelope inside, so all licenses can be mailed back. Payments should be made payable to Borough of

Roseland and must be received by the end of February to avoid a late fee. All documentation and payments can be mailed to 140 Eagle Rock Ave, Roseland, NJ, placed in the gray metal drop box located in the front of Borough Hall at 140 Eagle Rock Avenue, or brought to the Finance Office in Borough Hall on Floor 1A during regular business hours.

If you no longer own your dog or cat or they have since passed away and they should be removed from our system, please notify us immediately by calling 973-403-6038.

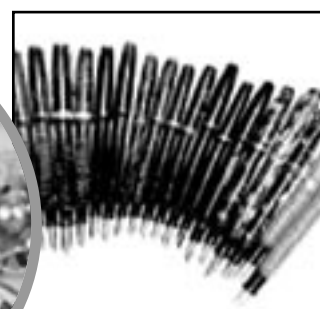

Pegasus: The Orchestra will perform at Drew University on Saturday, March 21 at 4:00 PM for the TheraYouth Foundation’s Third Annual Concert fundraiser. Held at the Dorothy Young Center for the Arts, the concert will unite world-class professional musicians with local student performers to raise critical funds for TheraYouth’s mission to provide needed physical, occupational, and speech therapy services to disadvantaged children who cannot otherwise access care.

Pegasus: The Orchestra pairs artistic excellence with social impact. Pianist, conductor and composer Karén Hakobyan founded the group in 2017 as a nonprofit dedicated to supporting exceptional musical talent, and to bringing world-class performances to underserved communities. True to its namesake, the ensemble empowers its musicians to soar artistically. Pegasus functions as a collective of artist leaders, resulting in performances that run the range of vibrant, driven orchestral performances alternating with intimate and chamber-like expression. The New York Concert Review calls Pegasus “a truly first-rate ensemble” and a “can’t miss” group, urging audiences to “get your tickets right away before they sell out.”

As a composer-arranger, Director Hakobyan frequently crafts orchestral works to showcase

the unique musicality of the ensemble’s artists, as in this concert which Hakobyan specifically wrote for this performance.

The Chatham High School Chamber Choir, directed by Kenneth Bryson, will perform the Interlude. This ensemble has performed at venues including the White House, the National Anthem at Citi Field to open a Mets game, the Empire State Building, and the Cathedral of St. John the Divine, and appreciated for their musical excellence.

The proceeds from this concert will support the TheraYouth Foundation, whose mission is to ensure that children are never denied critical physical, occupational, or speech therapy simply because their families cannot afford it. TheraYouth serves disadvantaged youth with treatable conditions, helping them gain strength, communication, and independence. Funded entirely through donations and fundraisers, every dollar raised supports life-changing therapy sessions for children who might otherwise go without the care they need to thrive.

“Every child deserves the chance to reach their full potential,” said TheraYouth founder, Dr. Irina Marcoff, DPT. “This concert not only raises vital funds but brings the community together around the belief that early, high-quality therapy can change the course of a child’s life.”
