## ROTARY GRANT TO CASA HELPS CHILDREN IN FOSTER CARE

### Morristown Rotary Club

The Morristown Rotary Club has awarded a \$7,501 grant to Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Morris and Sussex Counties to establish an essential in-house postage program, ensuring seamless communication for children in foster care.

The grant addresses a critical funding gap following the cessation of postage services previously provided by the Morris County Court system, a courtesy CASA had received for 38 years in exchange for its free volunteer advocacy work.

### PHYSICAL MAILINGS REMAIN ESSENTIAL FOR:

- Submitting official court documents.
- Communicating with families who lack reliable technology access.
- Sending certified correspondence where physical proof of delivery is required.
- Distributing the Annual Report and other critical supporter communications.

This grant will fully cover the first year of the new In-House Postage Program.

According to Lisa Firkser, Executive Director of CASA, "Everyone at CASA of Morris and Sussex Counties is breathing a sigh of relief with this wonderful grant award of \$7,501.46 to allow our organization to establish an In-House Postage Program. A special thank you to Deb Petrucci for personally delivering the check to the CASA office."

"The Morristown Rotary Club recognizes that the work CASA performs is absolutely vital to the welfare of children in our community who are facing the trauma of foster care," said Aaron Oliver, President of Morristown Rotary. "By funding this postage program, we are making sure that CASA's dedicated volunteers can continue to send necessary court documents, communicate with families, and conduct certified mailings without diverting funds away from their core mission of child advocacy."

### ADVOCACY FOR EVERY CHILD

CASA of Morris and Sussex Counties serves 100% of children in foster care within both counties. They rely on 124 trained volunteer advocates who currently serve 156 children annually.

Founded in 1987, CASA of Morris and Sussex Counties has trained over 1,750 volunteers who have provided advocacy for more than 7,650 children.

ROBOTIC PETS BRING COMFORT TO SENIORS

County of Morris

Morris County recently distributed robotic companion pets to seniors living in county-supported housing as part of the “Joy for All” Companion Pet Program, sponsored by the Morris County Office on Aging, Disabilities and Community Programming and expanded this year to include the Morris County Housing Authority.

The Office on Aging partnered with the Housing Authority in 2025 to broaden the program’s reach to seniors residing in senior housing. As part of the expansion, the Housing Authority received 36 robotic companion pets, 26 of which have already been distributed to residents age 60 and older.

The companion pet program was launched in 2024 to help reduce social isolation, loneliness and cognitive decline among older adults by providing the comfort and companionship of a pet without the responsibilities associated with caring for a live animal. In its first year, the program distributed 110 robotic companion pets to eligible residents and facilities throughout Morris County and partnered with the Morris County Sheriff’s Office Project Lifesaver program.

The robotic cats and dogs are designed to respond to motion and touch, offering realistic behaviors such as purring, rolling over, barking and wagging their tails.

“The companion pets have been the focus of

rigorous, peer-reviewed studies demonstrating their effectiveness in reducing loneliness and social isolation,” said Christine Hellyer, director of the Office on Aging, Disabilities and Community Programming. “Recipients often name their pets and keep them as long as they wish, forming meaningful emotional connections.”

The program is funded through the Aging American Rescue Plan. To qualify, recipients must be at least 60 years old, homebound, and either socially isolated or living with dementia or a similar cognitive condition.

# THE ORCHESTRA TO SOAR BENEFIT CONCERT FOR THERAYOUTH

At Dorothy Young Center for the Arts, Drew University, Madison, NJ • Saturday, March 21, 2026 • 4:00 PM

Pegasus: The Orchestra will perform at Drew University on Saturday, March 21 at 4:00 PM for the TheraYouth Foundation's Third Annual Concert fundraiser. Held at the Dorothy Young Center for the Arts, the concert will unite world-class professional musicians with local student performers to raise critical funds for TheraYouth's mission to provide needed physical, occupational, and speech therapy services to disadvantaged children who cannot otherwise access care.

Pegasus: The Orchestra pairs artistic excellence with social impact. Pianist, conductor and composer Karén Hakobyan founded the group in 2017 as a nonprofit dedicated to supporting exceptional musical talent, and to bringing world-class performances to underserved communities. True to its namesake, the ensemble empowers its musicians to soar artistically. Pegasus functions as a collective of artist leaders, resulting in performances that run the range of vibrant, driven orchestral performances alternating with intimate and chamber-like expression. The New York Concert Review calls Pegasus "a truly first-rate ensemble" and a "can't miss" group, urging audiences to "get your tickets right away before they sell out."

As a composer-arranger, Director Hakobyan frequently crafts orchestral works to showcase the unique musicality of the ensemble's artists, as in this concert which Hakobyan specifically

wrote for this performance. The concert opens with the urgency of Haydn's Symphony No. 59 ("Fire"), followed by the delicate, Three Armenian Miniatures by Komitas. Acclaimed Grammy-nominated cellist Sergey Antonov follows with Saint-Saëns' Cello Concerto No. 1, where the audience can truly appreciate his masterful playing in the intimate chamber orchestra setting. Pegasus's program continues with the soulful elegance of Rachmaninoff's Vocalise before concluding with Gershwin's Rhapsody in Blue, capturing the spirit of American jazz in an exuberant finale.

The Chatham High School Chamber Choir, directed by Kenneth Bryson, will perform the Interlude. This ensemble has performed at venues including the White House, the National Anthem at Citi Field to open a Mets game, the Empire State Building, and the Cathedral of St. John the Divine, and appreciated for their

musical excellence.

The proceeds from this concert will support the TheraYouth Foundation, whose mission is to ensure that children are never denied critical physical, occupational, or speech therapy simply because their families cannot afford it. TheraYouth serves disadvantaged youth with treatable conditions, helping them gain strength, communication, and independence. Funded entirely through donations and fundraisers, every dollar raised supports life-changing therapy sessions for children who might otherwise go without the care they need to thrive.

"Every child deserves the chance to reach their full potential," said TheraYouth founder, Dr. Irina Marcoff, DPT. "This concert not only raises vital funds but brings the community together around the belief that early, high-quality therapy can change the course of a child's life."

## ROTARY GIVES GRANT TO GIRL SCOUTS TO ENHANCE FACILITIES

### DEVELOPING FUTURE LEADERS

Jockey Hollow Camp serves more than 500 girls aged 6-16 during its seven weeks of summer camp, in addition to year-round visitors. The challenge course, which currently features elements like a Burma Rope Bridge, Swinging Log, and a zip line, is a core component of the camp's mission to develop courage, confidence, and character.

The Whale Watch is a perfect addition to the challenge course. It is a powerful tool that moves beyond individual achievement, compelling 1 girls to practice effective communication and collaborative leadership to achieve a common goal. This will be a permanent, transformative feature for campers for many years.

# JASMIN MORIN AND HER SONS, ALEXANDER AND FRANCIS GRADUATE FROM CIVIL AIR PATROL GROUND SEARCH & RESCUE SCHOOL

*Curtiss-Wright Composite Squadron,  
Civil Air Patrol*

During summer break 2025, Livingston resident Jasmin Morin and her sons, Alexander and Francis, graduated from the 2025 New Jersey Ground Search and Rescue (GSAR) School operated by Civil Air Patrol's New Jersey Wing. The Morins, who have resided in Livingston for the past five years, are all members of the local Curtiss-Wright Composite Squadron. They were among the 24 graduates of the summer GSAR School hosted on Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst from August 9 to August 16, 2025.

Cadet Chief Master Sergeant Francis Morin (16) is a junior, while his brother Cadet 2nd Lieutenant Alexander Morin (14) is a freshman. First Lieutenant Jasmin Morin is a 25-year employee of the Federal Reserve System.

A cornerstone of the Civil Air Patrol's emergency services mission, the weeklong GSAR immersion training helped CAP members earn qualifications for Ground Team Member 3, Ground Team Member 2, and Urban Direction Finding. The Morin family and other students completed online prerequisites before attending in-person classroom sessions and field exercises, culminating in a two-day, overnight field training exercise. Emergency services readiness ensures CAP members are ready to support communities in need after a natural disaster or other community emergency.

"GSAR school is where our future ground team specialists take their first big step," said Col. Amy Myzie, commander of the New Jersey Wing. "The training here combines field readiness with real-world mission skills, ensuring our teams are prepared to assist whenever and wherever we're needed."

Over the past four decades, New Jersey Wing GSAR School has become one of Civil Air Patrol's premier emergency services schools, producing mission-qualified graduates who support search and rescue, disaster relief, and homeland security missions.

## A FAMILY COMMITMENT

The Morins have been active members of Curtiss-Wright Composite Squadron (Fairfield, NJ) since 2023. Jasmin Morin serves as the squadron's Cyber Education Officer, where she leads teenage members through national competitions and other activities designed to spark interest and foster career paths in the cybersecurity industry. She is also the Assistant Deputy Commander of Cadets and works closely with the unit's roster of 54 teenage members.

In addition to executing their squadron duty positions, the two Morin brothers recently completed leadership training at New Jersey Wing's Non-Commissioned Officer Cadet Academy and in the Advanced Cadet Squadron at New Jersey Wing's Basic Encampment, a one-week immersion program focused on teamwork, personal growth, cybersecurity, and aerospace. The cadets also attended a one-week Civil Air Patrol Engineering Technology program held at Middle Tennessee State University (Tennessee).

"The Morin family's commitment to the missions of CAP is a great example of the enthusiasm we seek to ignite in all our members," said Lt. Col Carol McCloud, the commander of the Curtiss-Wright Squadron. "A family's relationship with CAP usually begins with a teen's interest in aviation or rocketry, and quite often it blossoms into a family's expression of community service. Parents and teens end up working side by side and independently on the

missions of CAP — to make our communities stronger and safer."

In 2024, New Jersey communities benefited more than \$6.7 million in community service value from CAP New Jersey Wing members (approximately 600 adult members and 954 teen members).

The Civil Air Patrol is the longtime auxiliary of the U.S. Air Force and, as such, is a valued member of its Total Force.
