## 2026 STUDENT VISIONARIES OF THE YEAR CAMPAIGN

### Westfield Public Schools

Westfield High School is proud to announce that students Aidan Murphy and Alex Davlouros have been accepted as candidates in the Blood Cancer United (formerly The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society) 2026 Student Visionaries of the Year (SVOY) campaign.

This prestigious national program recognizes exceptional student leaders who demonstrate a strong commitment to community service, leadership, and the fight to end blood cancers. Through this seven-week challenge, student teams across the country raise funds and awareness to support the Blood Cancer United mission: to find a cure for leukemia, lymphoma, Hodgkin's disease, and myeloma, and to improve the quality of life for patients and their families.

When asked what it means to be selected as candidates, Aiden shared, "It really means a lot because we can support the fight against cancer, and it's a big honor." Alex added, "It's a big honor. I have an uncle who battled non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, so it means a lot to be able to have an impact on someone's life."

The North Jersey campaign will kick off on January 14, 2026, and culminate at the Grand Finale Celebration on March 7, 2026. Since its inception in 2014, the SVOY program has made a remarkable impact, fueling advances in blood cancer research, patient aid, and community outreach. Last year alone, 61 high school students across northern New Jersey raised more than \$2.5 million in support of this life-saving mission.

Aidan and Alex were selected based on their academic achievements, extracurricular involvement, community service, and leadership potential. Their selection from a highly competitive pool of applicants is a testament to their dedication, compassion, and outstanding discipline.

Representing Westfield High School, Aidan and Alex will run for the Student Visionary of the Year title in honor of a North Jersey pediatric blood cancer survivor who has shown extraordinary courage and resilience throughout their battle.

Pegasus: The Orchestra will perform at Drew University on Saturday, March 21 at 4:00 PM for the TheraYouth Foundation's Third Annual Concert fundraiser. Held at the Dorothy Young Center for the Arts, the concert will unite world-class professional musicians with local student performers to raise critical funds for TheraYouth's mission to provide needed physical, occupational, and speech therapy services to disadvantaged children who cannot otherwise access care.

Pegasus: The Orchestra pairs artistic excellence with social impact. Pianist, conductor and composer Karén Hakobyan founded the group in 2017 as a nonprofit dedicated to supporting exceptional musical talent, and to bringing world-class performances to underserved communities. True to its namesake, the ensemble empowers its musicians to soar artistically. Pegasus functions as a collective of artist leaders, resulting in performances that run the range of vibrant, driven orchestral performances alternating with intimate and chamber-like expression. The New York Concert Review calls Pegasus "a truly first-rate ensemble" and a "can't miss" group, urging audiences to "get your tickets right away before they sell out."

As a composer-arranger, Director Hakobyan frequently crafts orchestral works to showcase

the unique musicality of the ensemble's artists, as in this concert which Hakobyan specifically wrote for this performance.

The Chatham High School Chamber Choir, directed by Kenneth Bryson, will perform the Interlude. This ensemble has performed at venues including the White House, the National Anthem at Citi Field to open a Mets game, the Empire State Building, and the Cathedral of St. John the Divine, and appreciated for their musical excellence.

The proceeds from this concert will support the TheraYouth Foundation, whose mission is to ensure that children are never denied critical physical, occupational, or speech therapy simply because their families cannot afford it. TheraYouth serves disadvantaged youth with treatable conditions, helping them gain strength, communication, and independence. Funded entirely through donations and fundraisers, every dollar raised supports life-changing therapy sessions for children who might otherwise go without the care they need to thrive.

"Every child deserves the chance to reach their full potential," said TheraYouth founder, Dr. Irina Marcoff, DPT. "This concert not only raises vital funds but brings the community together around the belief that early, high-quality therapy can change the course of a child's life."

## SHARP-SHINNED HAWK RELEASED BACK TO WILD

This feisty Sharp-shinned Hawk was admitted on 12/22 after being found in a yard in Warren following a window strike. On intake, the hawk had bloody nares and mouth, consistent with head trauma often seen after collisions. The nares are a bird's nostrils, located near the base of the beak, and bleeding there often points to head or facial trauma from collisions.

With supportive care and time to heal, this "Sharpie" as we call them, made great progress and was moved to an outside flight cage on 12/28/25. After proving strong, steady flight and good awareness, the hawk was successfully released back to the wild on 1/2/2026.

Sharp-shinned Hawks are incredibly fast and agile forest hunters, built to weave through dense trees while chasing small birds. That same speed and focus, however, can make them especially vulnerable to window strikes when reflective glass looks like open sky or habitat.

Remember, small changes matter, adding window decals is a simple way to help protect avian wildlife.



## FEBRUARY SPEAKERS PROGRAM FOR THE SUMMIT AREA OLD GUARD

The Summit Area Old Guard is a social, educational, and recreational organization that serves men of retirement age. We meet Tuesdays, 9:30 a.m., at the New Providence Presbyterian Church located at 1307 Springfield Ave – we encourage visitation, and all are welcome. Our motto is “Come for the Programs. In February, we will have four speakers:

### FEBRUARY 3RD, MATTHEW LIBERA

Professor of Materials Science and Engineering at Stevens Institute of Technology, will tell us how to make a better hip implant. Biomedical implants such as hip and knee prostheses have had a huge impact on human health and have improved the quality of life for millions of patients. However, in addition to their wonderful healing properties, these, and other tissue-contacting biomedical devices (e.g., catheters, tissue-expanders, pacemakers, etc.) can also catalyze infection. Infection rates vary from about 1-5% but can be as high as 50% depending on the nature of the device. Device-associated infection can be a life-changing complication which currently has no cure. Professor Libera will give an overview of tissue-contacting implants using hips as a prime example and then describe the infection problem as well as ongoing efforts to prevent, detect, and cure these infections.

### FEBRUARY 10TH, NANCY ORI

Nancy Ori will discuss ‘Nature as the Inspiration of Art’. Nancy has been an internationally respected photographer for over 35 years and a video producer for Ciba-Geigy and Novartis, and is owner of New Jersey Media Center, LLC in Berkeley Heights, NJ. Nancy studied with Ansel Adams and was a teaching assistant for many years with the Ansel Adams Workshop in California. In 1994 she established the NJ Photography Forum, a group of professional and serious amateur photographers. Nancy will share her personal interpretation of the landscape and architecture, demonstrating how she uses photographs to transform natural and man-made settings. Her images, which reveal a love of light, shadow, and form, become powerful documents that express the land's vulnerability and endurance.





# JASMIN MORIN AND HER SONS, ALEXANDER AND FRANCIS GRADUATE FROM CIVIL AIR PATROL GROUND SEARCH & RESCUE SCHOOL

## Curtiss-Wright Composite Squadron, Civil Air Patrol

During summer break 2025, Livingston resident Jasmin Morin and her sons, Alexander and Francis, graduated from the 2025 New Jersey Ground Search and Rescue (GSAR) School operated by Civil Air Patrol's New Jersey Wing. The Morins, who have resided in Livingston for the past five years, are all members of the local Curtiss-Wright Composite Squadron. They were among the 24 graduates of the summer GSAR School hosted on Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst from August 9 to August 16, 2025.

Cadet Chief Master Sergeant Francis Morin (16) is a junior, while his brother Cadet 2nd Lieutenant Alexander Morin (14) is a freshman. First Lieutenant Jasmin Morin is a 25-year employee of the Federal Reserve System.

A cornerstone of the Civil Air Patrol's emergency services mission, the weeklong GSAR immersion training helped CAP members earn qualifications for Ground Team Member 3, Ground Team Member 2, and Urban Direction Finding. The Morin family and other students completed online prerequisites before attending in-person classroom sessions and field exercises, culminating in a two-day, overnight field training exercise. Emergency services readiness ensures CAP members are ready to support communities in need after a natural disaster or other community emergency.

"GSAR school is where our future ground team specialists take their first big step," said Col. Amy Myzie, commander of the New Jersey Wing. "The training here combines field readiness with real-world mission skills, ensuring our teams are prepared to assist whenever and wherever we're needed."

Over the past four decades, New Jersey Wing GSAR School has become one of Civil Air Patrol's premier emergency services schools, producing mission-qualified graduates who support search and rescue, disaster relief, and homeland security missions.

### A FAMILY COMMITMENT

The Morins have been active members of Curtiss-Wright Composite Squadron (Fairfield, NJ) since 2023. Jasmin Morin serves as the squadron's Cyber Education Officer, where she leads teenage members through national competitions and other activities designed to spark interest and foster career paths in the cybersecurity industry. She is also the Assistant Deputy Commander of Cadets and works closely with the unit's roster of 54 teenage members.

In addition to executing their squadron duty positions, the two Morin brothers recently completed leadership training at New Jersey Wing's Non-Commissioned Officer Cadet Academy and in the Advanced Cadet Squadron at New Jersey Wing's Basic Encampment, a one-week immersion program focused on teamwork, personal growth, cybersecurity, and aerospace. The cadets also attended a one-week Civil Air Patrol Engineering Technology program held at Middle Tennessee State University (Tennessee).

"The Morin family's commitment to the missions of CAP is a great example of the enthusiasm we seek to ignite in all our members," said Lt. Col Carol McCloud, the commander of the Curtiss-Wright Squadron. "A family's relationship with CAP usually begins with a teen's interest in aviation or rocketry, and quite often it blossoms into a family's expression of community service. Parents and teens end up working side by side and independently on the

missions of CAP — to make our communities stronger and safer."

In 2024, New Jersey communities benefited more than \$6.7 million in community service value from CAP New Jersey Wing members (approximately 600 adult members and 954 teen members).

### ABOUT CIVIL AIR PATROL

The Civil Air Patrol is the longtime auxiliary of the U.S. Air Force and, as such, is a valued member of its Total Force. In its auxiliary role, CAP operates a fleet of 560 single-engine aircraft and 1,550 small Unmanned Aircraft Systems. It performs about 90% of continental U.S. inland search and rescue missions as tasked by the Air Force Rescue Coordination Center and is credited by the AFRCC with saving an average of 82 lives annually. CAP's 66,000 members also perform homeland security, disaster relief and drug interdiction missions at the request of federal, state and local agencies.

CAP also plays a leading role in STEM and aerospace education, and its adult members serve as mentors to 32,000 cadets nationwide.
