DAR LAUNCHES AMERICA 250 CELEBRATION



America's semiquincentennial year has arrived and the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) kicked off the celebration by honoring their patriot ancestors at the Somerset County Park Commission's Festival of Trees.

"Celebrating America 250 by Honoring Our Patriot Ancestors" was the theme of the tree hosted by Elizabeth Snyder-Continental Chapter DAR at the Environmental Education Center in Basking Ridge during December. The 8-ft. tall tree was decorated with red, white and blue lights and the profiles of the Revolutionary War ancestors of DAR chapter members.

"We hope that our tree helped to raise awareness of the individuals who established our nation," said Regent Nancy Stoll. "Our members are descended from patriots in nine states who served in a variety of ways. We need to remember the sacrifices that they all made for our freedom."

Featured on the tree were mini profiles of 50 patriot ancestors and their service. They included a captain of the

Lexington Alarm in Massachusetts, a river boat pilot, people who donated money or supplies, a brigadier general of the light dragoons, a spy, a president of the provincial Congress, and farmers who joined their local militia.

To join the DAR, women need to document their descent from a man or woman who aided the cause of American independence. Some prospective members have mapped out their family tree, but others know only that they have an ancestor who served in the Revolution. In that case, the DAR will assist them with research and the application process.

The DAR is a non-profit, non-political women's service organization dedicated to promoting patriotism, preserving American history, and securing America's future through better education. There are currently 190,000 members in 3,000 chapters in the U.S. and several nations abroad.

PREVENTING VEHICLE THEFTS AND RESIDENTIAL BURGLARIES

Green Brook Police Department

Vehicle thefts and residential burglaries are not unique to our township, as they are happening throughout the entire State of New Jersey. These incidents are crimes of opportunity. To help you protect your family and neighbors, we provide below some simple actions that you can take right away.

Most Importantly, Report Suspicious Activity Immediately. If you see a suspicious person or vehicle, contact the Police Department without delay at (732) 968-1188 or dial 911 in the event of an emergency. Even if you think it might not be significant, it is better to report it to the police rather than just posting it on social media or a community page.

- Below are additional actions that all residents can take to protect one another:
- Make your home look occupied and difficult to break in by illuminating your home. Beginning at sunset, leave both interior and exterior lights on whether your home is occupied or not.
- Secure your vehicle. Always remove key fobs and garage door openers from your vehicle. Lock the car doors. If possible, park your vehicle in the garage overnight.
- Activate your alarms. Always set your home and vehicle alarms.

- Do not leave vehicles running and unattended.
- Never leave a running vehicle unattended.
- Never leave valuable items, such as purses and wallets, inside the vehicle and visible from the outside.
- Protect valuables. Do not keep large amount of cash at home. Secure jewelry or other valuables.
- Check your security cameras. Test and confirm that your security cameras are functional and properly positioned to monitor key areas.
- Lock all doors and windows in your home, and keep garage doors closed and locked.
- Install deadbolts on exterior doors. Place a secondary locking device on sliding glass doors, such as a door stop lock or a bar in the sliding track.
- Remove all packages delivered to your home as soon as possible. Activate electronic delivery notifications so you know when packages arrive.
- Remove garbage and recycling cans from the street soon after pickup.
- Remove mail from your mailbox daily.
- Keep Your Cell Phone Nearby. Have your phone within reach, so you can quickly contact the police if needed.
- Spread Awareness. Share this information with friends, family, and neighbors.

SHANNON PISANI NAMED 2025-2026 EDUCATOR OF THE YEAR

Somerset County Vocational & Technical High School (SCVTHS) is pleased to announce that Science instructor Shannon Pisani is the school's 2025-2026 Educator of the Year. Mrs. Pisani graduated from Rider University with a Bachelor of Science in Biology and a minor in Marine Science. She had always been interested in teaching, and, in fact, had applied to college as an Education major before she realized she loved

science and switched her degree track. However, upon graduating college she soon discovered that she did not want a career as a lab technician.

After a friend suggested that she look into a career in education, Mrs. Pisani decided to follow the alternate route pathway to becoming a teacher. She has been an educator for twelve years, and is currently in her eleventh year at SCVTHS, teaching classes in Earth & Space Science and Workplace Readiness, as well as a Principles of Anatomy class geared specifically to students enrolled in the Cosmetology program. She also serves on the school's Social Emotional Learning committee and is an advisor to the Red Cross Club, the Peer Mentor program, and the Student Council. As a member of the SCVTHS Green Team, she was instrumental in securing a Bronze Certification from Sustainable Jersey for Schools, which recognizes achievement in the development of environmental best practices and learning opportunities.

A number of students and fellow staff members nominated Mrs. Pisani for the Educator of the Year award. Student nominations cited her kindness, patience, and energy, as well as her ability to relate to her students and to explain course material in an easy to understand manner. They also appreciate her obvious desire to see her students succeed. Her peers echoed these sentiments, while also praising her leadership, innovation, and willingness to collaborate with

staff as she builds a "culture of respect, inclusion, and success that extends far beyond her classroom."

Maria Johnson, SCVTHS Director of Special Services, praised Mrs. Pisani for her contributions to the school community. "Shannon is a remarkable teacher whose passion for the Biological and Earth & Space sciences is always on display in the classroom," she said. "As she begins each class with an 'Earth Update,' she supports students' curiosity and critical thinking skills and engages them in relevant science content. Shannon is a kind, respected educator who views science not just as a science, but as a tool for understanding the world."

When she is not at SCVTHS, Mrs. Pisani, a Hillsborough native, enjoys boating and travelling with her husband. She also coaches girls aged 8-12 in gymnastics as part of a Jersey Optional Gymnastics Association (JOGA) competitive program.

"I have been fortunate to find a career that gives me an opportunity to combine my passions for science and education," said Mrs. Pisani. "I am thankful to my family and the school community for supporting me and honoring me for doing a job I love."

Richard J. (Dick) Connolly Jr, 82, of Green Brook, NJ passed away on December 18, 2025 in New Brunswick, NJ.

Dick's life was celebrated at the Dunellen Fire Department on January 3, 2026.

Dick was born in Plainfield to Richard J. Connolly Sr and Dorothea Weiner Connolly on February 7, 1943. He attended St. John's Grammar School in Dunellen and St Benedict's Prep in Newark before graduating from Dunellen High School in 1961.

He married his high school sweetheart, Katherine (Kathy) Flynn Connolly, on September 12, 1964 in Dunellen.

In his 30 year career with Bell Telephone (Verizon) Dick worked his way from Lineman to Manager.

During his early years he enjoyed playing keyboards and guitar with his band, The Bunche, at local venues and at the Jersey Shore. At the same time, he was very involved in his


community.

VETERANS AND FAMILIES HONORED FOR SERVICE AND SACRIFICE

Somerset County Vocational and Technical High School

Students in Edward Graf's Social Studies classes at Somerset County Vocational and Technical High School (SCVTHS) recently spent a day acknowledging and honoring veterans and Gold Star families. The event, held at a local VFW Post, featured speeches, food, and an opportunity for students to spend time talking to service members and their families, who provided a glimpse of history as seen by those who experienced it first-hand.

This marks the thirteenth year that SCVTHS students have organized the Veterans Day commemoration. The event lasted most of the

day, with 140 students arriving early in the morning, before sunrise, to decorate the hall and prepare for the arrival of their guests.

The focus of the day was honoring those who paid the ultimate price while members of the military. Seven Gold Star families watched as students unfurled large banners honoring their relatives who died while serving our country. In addition, roughly 30 Armed Services veterans were honored at the event.

Following the ceremony, students served a hot lunch to their guests, and then joined them to eat and talk. After lunch, students and veterans broke up into small groups to discuss service, patriotism, and honor.

"Our students promote what we like to call an 'attitude of gratitude,'" said Mr. Graf. "This event shows how much our school and our community appreciates the service and sacrifice of these veterans and families."



SHARP-SHINNED HAWK RELEASED BACK TO WILD

This feisty Sharp-shinned Hawk was admitted on 12/22 after being found in a yard in Warren following a window strike. On intake, the hawk had bloody nares and mouth, consistent with head trauma often seen after collisions. The nares are a bird's nostrils, located near the base of the beak, and bleeding there often points to head or facial trauma from collisions.



With supportive care and time to heal, this "Sharpie" as we call them, made great progress and was moved to an outside flight cage on 12/28/25. After proving strong, steady flight and good awareness, the hawk was successfully released back to the wild on 1/2/2026.

Sharp-shinned Hawks are incredibly fast and agile forest hunters, built to weave through dense trees while chasing small birds. That same speed and focus, however, can make them especially vulnerable to window strikes when reflective glass looks like open sky or habitat.

Remember, small changes matter, adding window decals is a simple way to help protect avian wildlife.

ABOUT THE RAPTOR TRUST

The Raptor Trust is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization located at 1390 White Bridge Rd., Millington, NJ. They provide free care and assistance to injured, sick, or orphaned wild birds. 

Pegasus: The Orchestra will perform at Drew University on Saturday, March 21 at 4:00 PM for the TheraYouth Foundation's Third Annual Concert fundraiser. Held at the Dorothy Young Center for the Arts, the concert will unite world-class professional musicians with local student performers to raise critical funds for TheraYouth's mission to provide needed physical, occupational, and speech therapy services to disadvantaged children who cannot otherwise access care.

Pegasus: The Orchestra pairs artistic excellence with social impact. Pianist, conductor and composer Karén Hakobyan founded the group in 2017 as a nonprofit dedicated to supporting exceptional musical talent, and to bringing world-class performances to underserved communities. True to its namesake, the ensemble empowers its musicians to soar artistically. Pegasus functions as a collective of artist leaders, resulting in performances that run the range of vibrant, driven orchestral performances alternating with intimate and chamber-like expression. The New York Concert Review calls Pegasus "a truly first-rate ensemble" and a "can't miss" group, urging audiences to "get your tickets right away before they sell out."

As a composer-arranger, Director Hakobyan frequently crafts orchestral works to showcase

the unique musicality of the ensemble's artists, as in this concert which Hakobyan specifically wrote for this performance.

The Chatham High School Chamber Choir, directed by Kenneth Bryson, will perform the Interlude. This ensemble has performed at venues including the White House, the National Anthem at Citi Field to open a Mets game, the Empire State Building, and the Cathedral of St. John the Divine, and appreciated for their musical excellence.

The proceeds from this concert will support the TheraYouth Foundation, whose mission is to ensure that children are never denied critical physical, occupational, or speech therapy simply because their families cannot afford it. TheraYouth serves disadvantaged youth with treatable conditions, helping them gain strength, communication, and independence. Funded entirely through donations and fundraisers, every dollar raised supports life-changing therapy sessions for children who might otherwise go without the care they need to thrive.

"Every child deserves the chance to reach their full potential," said TheraYouth founder, Dr. Irina Marcoff, DPT. "This concert not only raises vital funds but brings the community together around the belief that early, high-quality therapy can change the course of a child's life."
