HIGH SCHOOL PRESENTS FIDDLER ON THE ROOF MARCH 12-15

The award-winning Morristown High School Theatre Department is proud to announce this year's spring musical production of Fiddler on the Roof, with four performances from March 12 to 15.

MHS Theatre has chosen another all-time great musical to follow up last year's smash-hit production of Les Misérables (winner of the 2025 BergenPAC High School Musical award for Outstanding Overall Musical). Once the longest-running musical in Broadway history, Fiddler on the Roof is a beloved classic packed with comedy, pathos, great characters, and classic songs, including "Tradition," "Matchmaker, Matchmaker," "If I Were a Rich Man," "To Life," "Miracle of Miracles," "Sunrise, Sunset," and many more.

Based on Sholem Aleichem's Tevye stories, Fiddler on the Roof tells the story of a Jewish family in the Pale of Settlement in Western Russia around the turn of the twentieth century, but its themes are universal and somehow seem to become more relevant with each passing year. The show is about the tensions between tradition and progress, isolation and assimilation, acceptance and persecution, and, most overtly, between parents' love for their children and their need to let them go, to allow them to grow up and live their own lives and make their own decisions.

As faculty director Stephanie Rubin says, "At its core, Fiddler showcases the delicate balance between the stability of tradition and inevitable change that comes as time passes, offering a deeply human look at how we hold onto our identity in a shifting world."

Even if you've seen Fiddler on the Roof before, it will be worth checking out Morristown High School's production. In addition to the BergenPAC award for Outstanding Overall Musical, last year's production of Les Mis netted awards for MHS's pit orchestra (the Paper Mill Playhouse Rising Star Award for Outstanding Orchestra), faculty music director David Gallagher (the BergenPAC High School Musical award for Best Musical Direction), and the student cast as a whole (BergenPAC's Best Ensemble award). Leading this year's Fiddler cast as Tevye, in his final MHS production, is senior Jackson Miller, who won BergenPAC's award for Best Actor in a Male-Identified Supporting Role for playing Javert in Les Mis last year.

MHS Theatre will present four live performances of Fiddler on the Roof on the Morristown High School stage, including three evening shows and one matinee: Thursday, March 12 at 7:00 p.m.; Friday, March 13 at 7:00 p.m.; Saturday, March 14 at 7:00 p.m.; and Sunday, March 15 at 2:00 p.m.



AN UNFORGETTABLE NIGHT OF MUSIC TO TRANSFORM YOUNG LIVES

On March 21, Pegasus: The Orchestra will perform with the Chatham High School Chamber Choir in a dazzling benefit concert for the TheraYouth Foundation at the Dorothy Center for Performing Arts at Drew University. Led by accomplished conductor and pianist, Karén Hakobyan, the vibrant program includes Haydn's "Fire" Symphony and a rousing version of Gershwin's Rhapsody in Blue, both composed exclusively for this ensemble. GRAMMY-nominated cellist Sergey Antonov - hailed by The Washington Post as "destined for cello superstardom" - will bring his soaring tone and formidable technique to Saint-Saëns' Cello Concerto No.1. All proceeds support pediatric medical therapy for disadvantaged youth. Normally this ensemble performs in New York City theaters so tickets are a steal at \$41-\$61 and can be purchased at therayouth.org.

TherAYOUTH CELEBRATES THREE YEARS OF TRANSFORMING CHILDREN'S LIVES

In just three years, the TheraYouth Foundation has become a beacon of hope for families across New Jersey struggling to secure essential therapy services for their children.

Physical therapist Dr. Irina Marcoff, DPT, founded TheraYouth to address a troubling reality: too many children with treatable conditions were being left behind. Long waitlists for public Early Intervention and school-based services; a shortage of pediatric providers accepting Medicaid; and the high cost of private therapy (often exceeding \$125 per session); placed critical care out of reach for hundreds of families.

"Early therapy can change the entire trajectory of a child's life," says Dr. Marcoff. "But for many families, access is the greatest barrier."

At its Elizabeth, NJ clinic, TheraYouth provides affordable physical, occupational, and speech therapy to disadvantaged children, more than 90% of whom rely on Medicaid. Since its inception, over 113 patients have "graduated" from therapy by achieving critical

developmental milestones.

The impact of timely intervention is undeniable. One young patient, unable to crawl or walk due to congenitally weak neck muscles, faced the risk of permanent disability due to delays in care. After just four months of physical therapy at TheraYouth, he graduated from treatment, able to walk normally, transforming his future.

Unfortunately, demand continues to outpace resources with more than 400 children on TheraYouth's waitlist for services. The foundation operates entirely through donations, community partnerships, and fundraisers.





RESOURCE FAIR OFFERS FREE SUPPORT AND SERVICES TO HOMELESS

County of Morris

The Morris County Department of Human Services joined the Mental Health Association of Essex & Morris Inc. (MHA) and more than 40 community partners on January 28th, to host

Project Homeless Connect at St. Peter's Episcopal Church in Morristown, providing coordinated services and support to individuals experiencing homelessness or at risk of losing their housing.

The annual community resource event, led locally by MHA since 2009, connects residents with housing assistance, behavioral health services, benefits enrollment, food and other critical supports in one central location. Viktorija Spasova, program director of Programs for Assistance in Transition from Homelessness (PATH) at MHA, welcomed attendees and introduced speakers, including the Rev. Canon Robert Picken, pastor of St. Peter's Episcopal Church; MHA CEO Robert "Bob" Davison; Morris County Commissioner Christine Myers; state Sen. Anthony M. Bucco; and a community member with lived experience.

Morris County's Office of Temporary Assistance operated its Navigating Hope mobile outreach unit on site, alongside the Morris County Sheriff's Office Hope One team, offering additional assistance and referrals. MHA coordinated the collection of donations for the event beginning in October 2025, in partnership with St. Peter's Episcopal Church and the county's Human Services Department, including food, clothing, shoes, toiletries and other basic necessities.

"We could not do this work without the

support of Morris County," said Davison. "In my more than 40 years of service, I can say without qualification that Morris County government is the most responsive to the needs of individuals struggling with mental illness, addiction or homelessness. When help is needed, Morris County responds."

The event also marked the kickoff of Morris County's annual federally mandated Point-in-Time (PIT) count, which provides a snapshot of homelessness across the county and helps guide funding and service decisions. The most recent count, conducted in January 2025, identified 618 men, women and children experiencing homelessness in Morris County -- a nine percent decrease from the previous year -- even as homelessness increased eight percent statewide during the same period.

Morris County Human Services staff will continue outreach in the community today to complete the PIT count survey identifying where individuals slept the night of Jan. 27, 2026. Participation in the 2026 count will help county officials and service providers better understand trends and direct resources where they are needed most.



TITAN IS WELCOMED INTO SHERIFF'S OFFICE

Morris County Sheriff's Office

Titan, a five month old Belgian Malinois puppy, joined the Sheriff's Office in December, and is now in training. Titan was surrendered to Mike and Michelle McMahon of Garden State K9 by a client who reported that Titan was too much for the family to manage. Titan was evaluated by Garden State K9 for temperament and workability, and tested for patrol and scent detection work. His evaluation was impressive, and Garden State K9 sought to donate Titan to the Morris County Sheriff's Office to ensure Titan had the proper working environment and the right conditions to thrive.

Titan has been paired with Detective Corporal Marc Adamsky, and began the bonding process and initial training. Training at this age is fun and geared towards building a bold, sociable, and confident puppy. The training will continue until certification is complete in both explosive detection and patrol techniques. Every day the new canine team of Detective Corporal Adamsky and Titan work towards achieving milestones. The drive to succeed is highly based on food and toy reward. Titan will learn obedience, tracking, evidence recovery, on and off leash searches for suspects, the odor of explosives, criminal apprehension and handler protection. It is anticipated that Titan will begin working the road and responding to calls for service when he is approximately two years old.

Certifications to ensure Titan maintains expected performance standards will be completed through evaluations by both the Morris County Sheriff's Office and the United States Police Canine Association. Once certifications and high quality performance have been achieved, Titan is slated to replace Detective Corporal Adamsky's current partner, Canine Tim, who is nearly nine years old. Tim is trained in narcotics detection and patrol techniques and serves alongside Detective Corporal Adamsky with the Sheriff's Emergency Response Team. Canine Tim is a very accomplished canine partner. The Morris County Sheriff's Office operates with seven canine handlers, and twelve

canines trained in multiple disciplines. The Canine Section has responded to 742 calls for service through the month of November. Titan is expected to perform at the same high level of success that Tim has achieved. Everyone at the Sheriff's Office is ready and waiting with excitement and anticipation to see the great things Titan will accomplish.






We hope it sparks a sense of wonder, encourages visits to our historic sites, and strengthens our shared appreciation for the enduring contributions of this region,” said Sarah Neibart, chair of Morris County’s 250th Celebrations.

Many of the illustrations draw inspiration from the beloved work of renowned Morris County artist Lucille Hobbie (1915-2008), whose detailed lithographs and watercolors beautifully captured the area’s historic character. The cover showcases the official Morris County 250th Anniversary logo -- a silhouette of Gen. George

Washington on horseback—symbolizing leadership, perseverance and the county’s enduring connection to the founding of our nation.

The 15-page coloring and activity book features scenes from key Revolutionary-era locations, including the Ford Mansion, Washington’s Headquarters, The Alliance statue, and historic structures, such as the Black Horse Inn and Rockaway Presbyterian Church. Each activity is crafted to spark curiosity, encourage exploration and deepen appreciation for Morris County’s vital contribution to America’s fight for independence.


