## STUDENTS HONOR THE LEGACY OF DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING JR.

### Rahway Public Schools

Students at The Rahway Academy recently celebrated the life of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. through a unique lens, exploring the deep connections between the American Civil Rights Movement and Hispanic labor and civil rights leaders like Dolores Huerta.

The lesson integrated Spanish language and cultural history, encouraging students to use vocabulary such as "igualdad" (equality) and "justicia" (justice) to discuss the shared values that drove these historic movements. By drawing parallels between Dr. King's vision and the work of Hispanic activists, the activity highlighted the universal fight for human dignity.

"Our goal was to show students that the pursuit of justice is a shared journey," said Mrs. Morales. "Watching them connect Dr. King's message of the 'Beloved Community' with their own Spanish vocabulary really brought these concepts to life in a way they can feel and practice every day."

The celebration featured several interactive highlights:

**"Winter Wonderland" Kind Word Battle:** Students kicked off the lesson by writing "palabras amables" (kind words) on paper and engaging in a friendly "snowball battle." Afterward, students gathered their "snowballs" and practiced reading the kind words to their peers in Spanish.

**The "Pledge to Love":** Inspired by Dr. King's vision, students made a personal commitment to "BE LOVE." Each student signed a class pledge board, symbolizing their dedication to honoring the humanity of every individual and choosing unity over division.

**Interactive Commitment:** The entire class joined together to recite the phrase, "Yo prometo difundir amor y bondad" (I pledge to spread love and kindness), reinforcing their shared responsibility to improve their community.

The Rahway Academy is proud to foster an environment where history, language, and character education meet. These activities are part of an ongoing effort to ensure students see themselves as active participants in building a more inclusive and kind world.

## 'PASSIONATE' CMA ARTIST GEORGE BECKER PERFORMS HOMETOWN CONCERT

Country Music Association artist George Becker is returning to his home town for a special concert. Becker has been a musician for more than 40 years, as a solo artist and with several rock and crossover country bands. His concert, with full band, will take place on March 14, 8 p.m. at Butch Kowal's Tavern on St. George Avenue in Rahway.

"The stage and theater were brought to life," said the In Focus Visions Music and Arts Magazine about a prior performance in Newton, NJ, "by the music of the passionate, energetic and proudly American George Becker and his band... (His) songs were not lamenting country ballads but passionate country rock anthems..." Some of his releases include "Whisky Nights Mustang Ride" and "Just Like My Daddy Did." Several songs are informed by his growing up in Rahway and are reflected in lyrics of such songs as "Memories of Red, White and Blue". His videos are featured on Facebook, Instagram, and YouTube as well as his website [officialgeorgebecker.com](http://officialgeorgebecker.com).

"It's my first time in almost 20 years to my hometown and Butch Kowal's Tavern, a place that was a staple for me in my early career," says Becker, who is a graduate of Roselle Catholic. His high school yearbook photo notes that he "hoped to be a musician" after graduation. "Dreams do come true," notes Maurice Moran, one of his RC teachers.







# THE FIRST BATTLE OF SPANKTOWN, JANUARY 5, 1777 A CHRONOLOGY (PART 3) NOVEMBER 1776 – JANUARY 15, 1777

The time of celebration after the signing of the Declaration of Independence was short-lived. The British fleet entered New York harbor on July 12 and immediately took command of New York City. In late August, the Continental Army, led by General George Washington, was routed at the Battle of Long Island and forced to evacuate into New Jersey. The entire Jersey colony was soon in panic mode and many American patriots fled from their homes leaving them open to British occupation.

The situation was dire. After his defeat on Long Island Washington and his army began a desperate 100 mile retreat across New Jersey on November 12, 1776 with plans to reach the safety of the rebel stronghold in Pennsylvania. The beleaguered army trudged along what is today St. Georges Avenue and passed through Rahway/Spanktown on a bitter cold 30th of November. Local legend has it that the general, as he hurried through the village, was handed some food and beverage by the owner of the Terrill Tavern. But the redcoats were on Washington's heels and were taking control of towns as they pushed south. Before the day was over they had advanced as far as Elizabethtown with some troops moving into Rahway/Spanktown with orders to commandeer rebel barns for their accommodations.

Washington knew he had to cover his rear and stayed in correspondence with Brig. General William Maxwell, the officer in charge of much of the area that today encompasses Morris, Essex, and Union Counties. During December, he wrote several letters to Maxwell urging him on and stressing the importance of maintaining morale. Washington implored, "I authorize you in the strongest terms to invite the Militia to join this part of the Army in the common defense of their rights, Liberty, and property." He directed Maxwell to, "Go immediately and take upon you the command, not only of the regiments noted above, but of the Militia also, and therewith to give all the protection you can to the Country, and distress to the enemy by harassing of them in their quarters and cutting of their convoys. Keep up the Spirits of the Militia and keep the Militia together. (sic)"

As fate would have it, when things look bleakest, events occur that change the course of history. Washington's masterful surprise attack victory at Trenton on the morning of December 26, 1776 and his follow-up success at Princeton in early January, 1777 saved his army and inspired them to fight another day. With his two victories, Washington could sense the tide of affairs swing his way and saw the opportunity to continue his offensive. Immediately after the Princeton battle, the general wrote Maxwell ordering him to gather as many men as possible and chase the British out of Central Jersey. "Sir: I am about to enter the Jerseys with a considerable force, immediately for the purpose of attempting a recovery of that country from the enemy. I must request that you will collect all the

force in your power together and annoy and distress them by every means which Prudence can suggest. If a successful opposition is not made to the enemy in the Jerseys, that their country will not remain long free from the ravages of war."

Maxwell began his campaign by employing his rejuvenated forces to drive the British troops down from the Short Hills, through Newark, Springfield, and Elizabethtown, eventually fighting them at Rahway/Spanktown.

On Sunday, January 5, Maxwell and a body of Jersey militia drove one regiment of British Highlanders and a regiment of German Hessians

as far south as the village of Rahway/Spanktown. When the retreating forces reached the village bridge they were reinforced by troops from Woodbridge and turned to make a stand. On this day, Maxwell was not to be denied a victory. The battle raged for two hours and then the enemy made a hasty retreat south on the Woodbridge Road all the way back to Amboy. It was reported that sounds of heavy firing were heard from miles away. The two-hour battle was fought near what is today the Union County Park off St. Georges Avenue.

The accuracy of what actually occurred at the battle on January 5 is difficult to ascertain as rebel and loyalist accounts greatly differ. A rebel newspaper out of Philadelphia reported that the British lost over 300 men (soldiers who retreated or were taken prisoner were probably included in this number along with killed and wounded) while the American losses were three killed and twelve wounded. The newspaper reported that Continental troops made prisoners of 50 Hessians and 40 Highlanders and seized a supply schooner filled with baggage and blankets. They also secured one thousand bushels of salt the British had hidden in barns.

A loyalist paper printed in New York reported that the British troop casualties included one killed and three slightly wounded while the rebels suffered nine soldiers killed. The report added that it was the rebels who fled upon seeing the British reinforcements coming from Woodbridge.

Within two days, American forces recaptured Elizabethtown bringing a modicum of relief to the area. British troops and loyalists, however, remained to the south and east so there was no certainty that hostilities would not renew. By February, the sounds of battle would be heard again.



## SPRING BEGINS & AMERICAN ROBINS ARRIVE

This year the Spring Equinox occurs on March 20, at 10:46 a.m. Celebrated since the beginning of human civilization, it's at that exact minute the sun is over the equator and both the north and southern hemispheres have equal amount of daylight, approximately 12 hours. This event marks the beginning of spring here in the north and autumn in the south.

Around that time the American Robin, one of North America's most familiar and widespread songbirds arrives in our area after overwintering in warmer climates, often considered harbingers of spring.

Found in forests, fields, parks, and backyards across North America including Mexico, Canada, and Alaska, the robin is also the official bird of three states: Connecticut, Michigan, and Wisconsin.

Early colonial settlers named the American Robin for its resemblance to the familiar but unrelated European Robin, which is smaller but sports an orange breast and upright posture. The American Robin belongs to the thrush family.

Records show that some birds have traveled up to 3,000 miles, from Iowa to Alaska, during their spring migration.

On average, American Robins live for two years in the wild. Ornithologist May Thatcher Cooke maintained detailed records of banded robins in the early 1900s and noted that some individuals live as long as 6-9 years.

Though known for being worm eaters, robins have varied diets. American Robins mostly eat fruits in the fall and winter, and include more insects and worms in their spring and summer diets.

Robins are not particularly common in natural habitats, such as grasslands and forests, but are especially abundant near human dwellings, primarily during the nesting season.

Robins love the short, manicured lawns that are so prevalent in urban and suburban areas. Here they forage on a favorite food, earthworms. A short run across the turf and then a brief wait and when a worm is detected there is a quick pounce and capture.

The plentiful worm harvest in lawns provides not just a sumptuous meal for the adult robins, but the necessary high protein diet for their nestlings.

Robins, like many migrating birds don't maintain pair bonds and take on new mates each spring. At the breeding grounds, male robins put on strutting courtship displays for females. At dawn, they belt their melodious tunes, shake their wings, fluff their tail feathers, and puff their white-striped throats to entice female robins. Many people are familiar with their cheer up, cheer up, cheerily caroling.

Female robins pick nesting sites and build cup shaped nests tucked away in thickets or unexposed tree branches, but sometimes they

nest on the ground or atop outdoor light fixtures too. The birds use pieces of straw, twigs, and dry leaves to build cup-shaped nests, and add moss, mud, and sometimes feathers to mend and line the interiors.

Robins can raise up to three broods in one breeding season, each time laying 3-5 sky-blue eggs that take roughly 14 days to hatch.

Nestlings are born naked and helpless, opening their eyes around 5 days after hatching.

Both parents are involved in feeding, delivering up to 100 to 150 meals a day, consisting mostly of worms, insects, and berries for about 14 or 16 days until they fledge. Baby robins grow rapidly, eating their weight in food daily.

Parents are highly protective, often chirping loudly and swooping at potential threats. Parents keep the nest clean, with the female often removing fecal sacs.

The young are cared for by parents for up to four weeks after leaving the nest.

It is normal for young robins to leave the nest before they can fly, known as fledglings. They often look abandoned on the ground but are usually still being fed by parents.

Just because you do not see a parent, it does not mean the nest is abandoned. Parents may be foraging or nearby.

Over 75-80% of young robins do not survive until November, and many nests are lost to natural causes.

Robin populations as a whole, monitored across North America for the last 40 years, have slowly increased. Estimated robin population is between 310 million to 370 million birds.

Robin nests are often a target of parasitic Brown-headed Cowbirds but Robins are extremely efficient at recognizing and removing these unwanted eggs from their nests before they hatch.

Lead, leftover from the days of leaded gasoline and paint, contaminates suburban soil, and often adheres to the slimy skin of worms. Lead has been detected in both and older and young robins.

A more recent problem for robins is West Nile

virus, spread by mosquitoes, a disease that can kill birds. Testing shows many Robins have contracted the virus and survived.

American Robins may abandon their young or eggs due to perceived danger, such as predators, cats, snakes or Bluejays scouting the nest, or high-stress such as frequent human disturbance. Other reasons include the death of one parent, severe weather conditions, or the nest being infested with parasites. Often, abandonment happens if the nest is no longer considered safe. Younger birds are more prone to abandoning nests due to inexperience.

If one of the parents is killed, the remaining parent may not be able to raise the brood alone and will abandon them.

I am always delighted to see my first Robin in the spring.


