POLICE REUNITE OWNER WITH DOG MISSING FOR 2 YEARS

The Clark Police Department is pleased to share a heartwarming story of teamwork and compassion by its personnel.

On March 4, 2026, a citizen contacted Clark Police to report a lost dog roaming near the Clark Commons. Patrolman Nick Kurus responded, took custody of the dog, and transported her to Clark Police Headquarters. Once there, officers used a microchip reader and were able to identify a pet recovery service connected to the dog.

Patrolman Kurus contacted the service and was able to obtain the name and phone number of the dog's last recorded owner.

When reached by phone, the owners from Glenn Heights, Texas were shocked to receive the call. They explained that the dog had gone missing nearly two years ago in Texas. The owners immediately made plans to fly to New Jersey but would not arrive until March 7.

Rather than sending the dog to a shelter, members of the Clark Police Department cared for her at police headquarters for the next three days. During that time, Clark Police personnel bathed the dog, fed her, provided treats, walked her regularly, and supplied blankets and toys to keep her comfortable. Many of the supplies were purchased by department members out of their own pockets. Despite continuing their regular police duties, personnel made sure the dog was well cared for.

Police Director Patrick Grady stated, "As a dog lover, along with many other dog lovers in the department, we were not going to make that puppy wait in a shelter or pound. I want to commend all the officers and staff who went above and beyond to care for this dog while still performing their duties. Koko was living her best life in the dispatch room over the last three days, and hopefully it will get even better now that she has been reunited with her family."

On Saturday, the owners arrived at Police Headquarters and were happily reunited with their dog. Koko was seen "running right to her mommy." The couple expressed deep gratitude for the care and compassion shown by the Clark Police Department.

42ND ANNUAL QUILT SHOW - APRIL 11

Harvest Quilters of Central NJ will present their 42nd annual Quilt Show on Saturday, April 11, 2026. Sharing the Quilts 42 will be held at the Willow Grove Presbyterian Church, 1961 Raritan Road, Scotch Plains, NJ from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Admission is \$8 for adults and \$3 for children under twelve.

At 10:30 a.m., Katherine Evans will present "My Journey - Stitching Together an International Community of Quilters." Evans' talk will cover her years living in Brazil, Costa Rica and Mexico from 2007 to 2025. She'll highlight her outreach to local women who together developed sewing and design skills creating one-of-a-kind group quilts, many of which will be on display.

Wendy Sheridan of Rahway will be recognized as 2026's Featured Quilter.

Sheridan is an award-winning multidisciplinary artist whose work spans fiber, watercolor, ink, and acrylics. With a lifetime of experience in fabric and fiber arts, she has created quilts, housewares, and costumes, serving as costume mistress for the Union County Academy for the Performing Arts from 2008-2012.

Her fiber art installation "What We Did This Summer," in collaboration with Lauren Reidy, has been on display at the New Jersey Transit Rahway station in the fall/winter of 2025-2026. "I love bold color, an explosion of color shows up in all my art forms," said Sheridan, a retired electrical engineer and technical writer.

Local charities will benefit from drawings for a traditional queen-sized quilt with a modern flair, gift cards and craft themed gift baskets.

In addition to viewing a full array of modern, traditional, art and wall-hanging quilts, attendees can participate in viewer's choice awards, kid's crafting table and vendor sales area.

A tearoom offering lunch, snacks, homemade baked goods, and beverages will benefit Willow Grove Church programs.



NJ FESTIVAL ORCHESTRA TO PERFORM ONE THOUSAND AND ONE NIGHTS

The New Jersey Festival Orchestra brings its season to a close with One Thousand and One Nights, an evening shaped by storytelling, imagination, and the vivid orchestral palette of two beloved works. Performances will take place on Saturday, May 30, at 7:00 pm at The Presbyterian Church in Westfield, and Sunday, May 31, at 2:30 pm at the Sieminski Theater in Basking Ridge.

The program pairs the elegance of Joaquín

Rodrigo with the sweeping narrative of Nikolai Rimsky-Korsakov, inviting audiences into a world where music and myth intertwine. At its center is internationally acclaimed Slovak guitarist Karol Samuelčík, whose appearance is presented in collaboration with the Slovak American Cultural Center.

Samuelčík takes the stage in Rodrigo's *Fantasia para un gentilhombre*, a work that draws from Spanish baroque dances and unfolds

with graceful lyricism and rhythmic vitality. The guitar's voice, at once intimate and radiant, moves fluidly between courtly refinement and expressive brilliance.

A seasoned international performer, Samuelčík has appeared across Europe, Asia, and the Americas, with engagements at venues including London's Purcell Room and Shenzhen Concert Hall. A prizewinner of numerous competitions and a professor at the Academy of Music and Performing Arts in Bratislava, he is equally recognized for his scholarship, including a landmark publication on guitar technique in 2022.

The program culminates in Rimsky-Korsakov's *Scheherazade*, a work long associated with the fantastical tales of *One Thousand and One Nights*. Though the composer ultimately removed explicit programmatic titles, the music retains its narrative spirit; waves swell and recede, melodies shimmer and twist, and the orchestra becomes a storyteller in its own right. Echoes of distant voyages, whispered secrets, and unfolding drama emerge through richly layered textures and luminous orchestration.

Together, these works form a fitting close to the season: a journey that moves from the refined intimacy of the guitar to the expansive storytelling power of the full orchestra.



ASL STUDENTS VISIT GALLAUDET UNIVERSITY

Clark Public Schools

Students from the American Sign Language (ASL) program at Arthur L. Johnson High School recently traveled to Gallaudet University for their annual educational trip. The visit gave students a unique opportunity to experience a campus where American Sign Language and Deaf culture are central to everyday life.

Located in Washington, D.C., Gallaudet University is the world's only university specifically designed to provide higher education for students who are Deaf. Founded in 1864, the university offers undergraduate and graduate programs while also serving as an international hub for Deaf culture, research, and advocacy. On campus, ASL is used for communication, and the environment is designed to support visual learning and accessibility.

During the visit, ALJ students toured the

historic campus, learned about college programs available to Deaf students, and experienced firsthand how communication through sign language shapes daily life. Many students had the chance to interact with Gallaudet students and staff, practice their signing skills, and gain a deeper appreciation for the Deaf community.

One of the highlights of the trip was visiting the well-known Signing Starbucks located right off campus. At this unique Starbucks location, all of the employees are Deaf, and customers are encouraged to communicate using American Sign Language. ALJ students eagerly ordered their drinks in ASL, putting their classroom learning into practice in a real-world setting and experiencing what it is like to communicate in a fully visual language environment.

The trip was organized by ALJ High School ASL teacher Loren Hsu, who leads the school's sign language program. Hsu said the annual

visit helps students connect what they learn in the classroom with real-world experiences.

"Seeing a place where ASL is everywhere really helps students understand that American Sign Language is not just something you study in a class," Hsu said. "It's a living language and a vibrant culture."

For many students, the highlight of the trip was experiencing a fully immersive ASL environment and learning more about the history of Deaf education in the United States. The visit also gave students insight into future academic opportunities and careers related to ASL and interpreting.

The annual trip to Gallaudet University has become a meaningful tradition for the ALJ High School ASL program, allowing students to deepen their understanding of language, culture, and accessibility while building connections with the broader Deaf community.

Studies show that generous people live longer; and that frequent social interaction is important for longevity. Combine them and what do you get? The Flintlocks! On Thursday, February 19, 2026 they celebrated birthdays of two of their members Joe Schott at 104, and George Van Dyke, 90. Another member who is 95 was too shy. Generosity, social interaction, staying active, and doing some good in the world, help with longevity.

The Flintlocks are volunteers who get together every week to have fun and provide manpower to support Scouting. They are not associated with firearms. The name comes from an old device which is still useful, implying that they are old guys who are still useful. They maintain 3 scout camps and two scout shops, have built new buildings, repair older ones, and provide volunteer manpower for scouting activities. By keeping the camps in good shape, it enables the youth to have good experiences with outdoor activities.

The Flintlocks celebrated their 38th year anniversary of service this year. They provide approximately 6,000 hours of volunteer skilled labor at the camps and council activities every year. The Flintlocks BSA, Inc. is a 501c3 consisting of 28 retired scouters who support the Patriot's Path Council (PPC) of Scouting America, (formerly Boy Scouts of America). The PPC serves 11,800 scouts in over 300 scouting

units in five counties of northern New Jersey.

The Boy Scouts of America changed their name to Scouting America to reflect the fact that they opened membership to all youth in 2019. There are over 176,000 females in the program, and 8,000 young women have achieved the rank of Eagle Scout to date. The purpose of including girls was to include entire families in the program. The Scouting program focuses on developing good citizens, ethical conduct, learning useful skills and hobbies, exploring careers, and making lifelong friends. The website for the Patriots' Path Council is ppbsa.org.

Cub Scouts consist of all girl Packs or all boy Packs which include children in kindergarten through 5th grade. Scouts consist of all girl Troops or all boy Troops from 5th grade through age 18. Three additional programs are coed, and go from age 14 up to age 21: Sea Scouts – which focus on learning to run ships; Explorers- which focus on specific careers; and Venture Crew - which go on high adventure trips. To find a scout unit near you, go to the website beascout.org.


