GRATITUDE FOR CENTER FOR COPING WITH LOSS VOLS

At Imagine, A Center for Coping with Loss, their volunteers are the heart of their program, and they always welcome opportunities to bring members of this community together. Recently, some of Imagine's volunteers enjoyed delicious food and time for connection at a Volunteer Potluck Dinner held at Imagine's Mountainside Center. The theme of the night was Seasons of Gratitude as Imagine staff shared appreciation for the extraordinary grace and commitment of this incredible group of volunteers.

Imagine's volunteers serve in many capacities, some welcoming families as they arrive on a Night of Support for their free grief support groups, and others helping with clean up support after Imagine's families go home. The majority of Imagine's volunteers serve as facilitators, creating safe spaces for conversation and connection in Imagine's support groups for kids, teens, young adults and caregivers who are grieving the loss of someone close to them.

Imagine's volunteer facilitators first attend 3 days of training where they gain companioning skills used in Imagine's groups as facilitators walk alongside those on their grief journey. Imagine staff are currently planning two adult facilitator training classes to address the rising need for more Nights of Support at Imagine's centers in Mountainside and Newark.

The first training will be held March 13-15, and the second option will be offered May 1-3. Each training is scheduled

for a Friday through Monday from 9 am - 5 pm each day and they ask that those attending participate in all three days of the training. No previous experience is needed, just a readiness to listen, a heart inclined to serve and a willingness to be with children and adults in grief without trying to fix, solve or give advice. The facilitator training will equip you with skills that will help you facilitate discussions and create opportunities for connection and support.

If you would like to help ensure that no child or family needs to wait for free grief support when they need it, please consider joining one of Imagine's upcoming trainings. You can visit their website at imagineenj.org to complete their interest form. We hope you'll consider joining this incredible team of volunteers and helping to ensure that no one grieves alone.

Imagine, A Center for Coping with Loss is a 501c3 that offers training and education on loss and grief to the community and free year-round grief support groups for children ages 3-18 and young adults 19-30 who are coping with a loss due to death. Concurrently, support groups are available for the parents and caregivers of the children in the groups and offered in English and Spanish. Imagine has centers in Newark and Mountainside and offers virtual groups as well. AFTERNOON TEA “REMEMBER THE LADIES OF THE REVOLUTION”

Kenilworth Historical Society

Participants in the Kenilworth Historical Society’s “Remember the Ladies of the Revolution” Afternoon Tea on Sat., May 2, will learn about the role of women during America’s Revolutionary War, particularly the heroic actions of various brave female patriots, through an enlightening presentation by historian Rose Munley of Washington Crossing State Park, Titusville, N.J.

The Afternoon Tea will take place at the Kenilworth Veterans Center (Kennedy Room), 33 South 21 Street, starting at 12:30 p.m. In addition to the featured program, the event will include a gift auction, 50/50 raffle, door prizes and more. Assorted teas, tea sandwiches, and desserts will be served. Admission is \$30. Advance reservations are required (by April 15 recommended), as seating is limited. For reservations/tickets, please call 908-709-0434.

Proceeds from the Afternoon Tea will benefit the Kenilworth Historical Society’s Oswald J. Nitschke House (c. 1880) “living history” museum and cultural arts center by helping defray operating expenses, including the cost of an elevator that makes all levels of the site (“living history” museum, exhibition center and cultural arts center) fully accessible to everyone.

Washington Crossing State Park is a 3,575-acre New Jersey state park that is part of Washington’s Crossing, a U.S. National Historic Landmark

area. It is located in the Washington Crossing and Titusville sections of Hopewell Township in Mercer County, north of Trenton along the Delaware River. The Washington Crossing Visitor Center Museum focuses on the American Revolution and the military campaign known as the “Ten Crucial Days” from Dec. 25, 1776 through Jan. 3, 1777, when George Washington and the Continental Army crossed the Delaware River and fought at the Battle of Trenton, the Battle of the Assunpink Creek and the Battle of Princeton.

The May 2 “Remember the Ladies of the Revolution” Afternoon Tea is among many community events being planned by the Kenilworth Historical Society as well as the Kenilworth AmRev250 Committee, which comprises a cross section of residents organized by the Borough of Kenilworth in partnership with the Kenilworth Historical Society, to commemorate America’s 250th anniversary year.

Upcoming AmRev250 events include a May 16 Bicycle Parade, a Historical Walking Tour led by historian Walter Boright (tentative date May 30), a June 6 Juneteenth Celebration and program featuring “a Visit with Madam C.J. Walker” at the Oswald J. Nitschke House, a Grand Fireworks Display (tentative date June 28), a Sept. 25 Cornhole Tournament, an Oct. 23 “Sock Hop/Doo-Wop” -- and many more. 42ND ANNUAL QUILT SHOW - APRIL 11

Harvest Quilters of Central NJ will present their 42nd annual Quilt Show on Saturday, April 11, 2026. Sharing the Quilts 42 will be held at the Willow Grove Presbyterian Church, 1961 Raritan Road, Scotch Plains, NJ from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Admission is \$8 for adults and \$3 for children under twelve.

At 10:30 a.m., Katherine Evans will present "My Journey - Stitching Together an International Community of Quilters." Evans' talk will cover her years living in Brazil, Costa Rica and Mexico from 2007 to 2025. She'll highlight her outreach to local women who together developed sewing and design skills creating one-of-a-kind group quilts, many of which will be on display.

Wendy Sheridan of Rahway will be recognized as 2026's Featured Quilter.

Sheridan is an award-winning multidisciplinary artist whose work spans fiber, watercolor, ink, and acrylics. With a lifetime of experience in fabric and fiber arts, she has created quilts, housewares, and costumes, serving as costume mistress for the Union County Academy for the Performing Arts from 2008-2012.

Her fiber art installation "What We Did This Summer," in collaboration with Lauren Reidy, has been on display at the New Jersey Transit Rahway station in the fall/winter of 2025-2026. "I love bold color, an explosion of color shows up in all my art forms," said Sheridan, a retired electrical engineer and technical writer.

Local charities will benefit from drawings for a traditional queen-sized quilt with a modern flair, gift cards and craft themed gift baskets.

In addition to viewing a full array of modern, traditional, art and wall-hanging quilts, attendees can participate in viewer's choice awards, kid's crafting table and vendor sales area.

A tearoom offering lunch, snacks, homemade baked goods, and beverages will benefit Willow Grove Church programs.

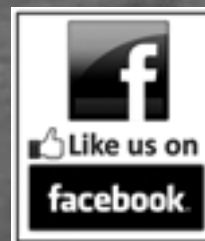

WHAT, WHERE, AND WHEN IN OLD KENILWORTH

KENILWORTH'S UPSALA COLLEGE - REMNANTS AND MEMORIES – PART 3

Upsala Part 2 detailed college buildings and facilities located directly on its 14-acre campus at the top of N. 21st St. There was one exception – the tennis court located across the street at and behind 525 Oak St.

Upsala also made use of off-campus locations about the town. One was structure was the President's Residence that today would be at 315 N. 21st St. Another was Crescendo Hall, a building that stood at 125 N. 20th St. For sports, mostly baseball, the college used empty land on the north side of Monroe Ave. to the east and west of N 22nd St. – opposite the playground of the St. Theresa School. It was named Viking Field. For football, Upsala used fields in the Black Brook Park ballfield area when that land was level with the surrounding grounds along Lafayette Ave. at about N. 19th St., about the location of the Black Brook Park parking lot.

Records suggest that Upsala acquired Crescendo Hall in 1906 or earlier. A three-story building it had a large front porch. It had no indoor plumbing or electricity until the 1920s. Until then, students used kerosene lamps and carried water pitchers to their rooms for drinking and washing. It was to serve as the women's dormitory, but at times some male students roomed there due to a shortage of on-campus dorm space. Crescendo Hall accommodated special guests visiting the campus. It eventually became an all-women's residence. The house mother was Augustina Gustafson whose husband, William, worked as an Upsala janitor.

In a 2009 interview Michael Wojcio (1912-2010) shared his Viking Field and Crescendo Hall memories. Most of his childhood and all his adult years he lived at 115 N. 21st St., next door to Crescendo Hall and just around the corner from Viking Field. For Halloween Mike said of the dorm, "That's where we would go around and the students would give us a dime – a nickel – a quarter. We had a good time. That was a good place to make a few dollars."

Mike enjoyed baseball games. He said, "Me and my friends went to Viking Field. Upsala teams played against high school teams from Cranford and Roselle. Sometimes teams from other colleges showed up." He added, "After the college moved away it was a popular softball field. Lots of fellas had a good time flying model, glider airplanes there."

Lars Herman Beck, the first local Upsala president, rented quarters for himself and family on N. 20th St. He soon purchased a home at what today would be 315 N. 21st St. Research suggests it was no later than 1900. When he retired, the col-

lege purchased his home as the "President's Residence" without charge to future presidents. By 1923 a different house was at the site owned by a future mayor – William Lister – and his wife Adele. In a 1967 interview, former Mayor Lister advised that Upsala presidents used to live in a house that previously stood at the site. Lister's former house was sold in 2021, demolished, and a new home erected in 2024.

The next article in this series will identify some places where students and staff lived off the campus and where physical remnants of Upsala College remain today.

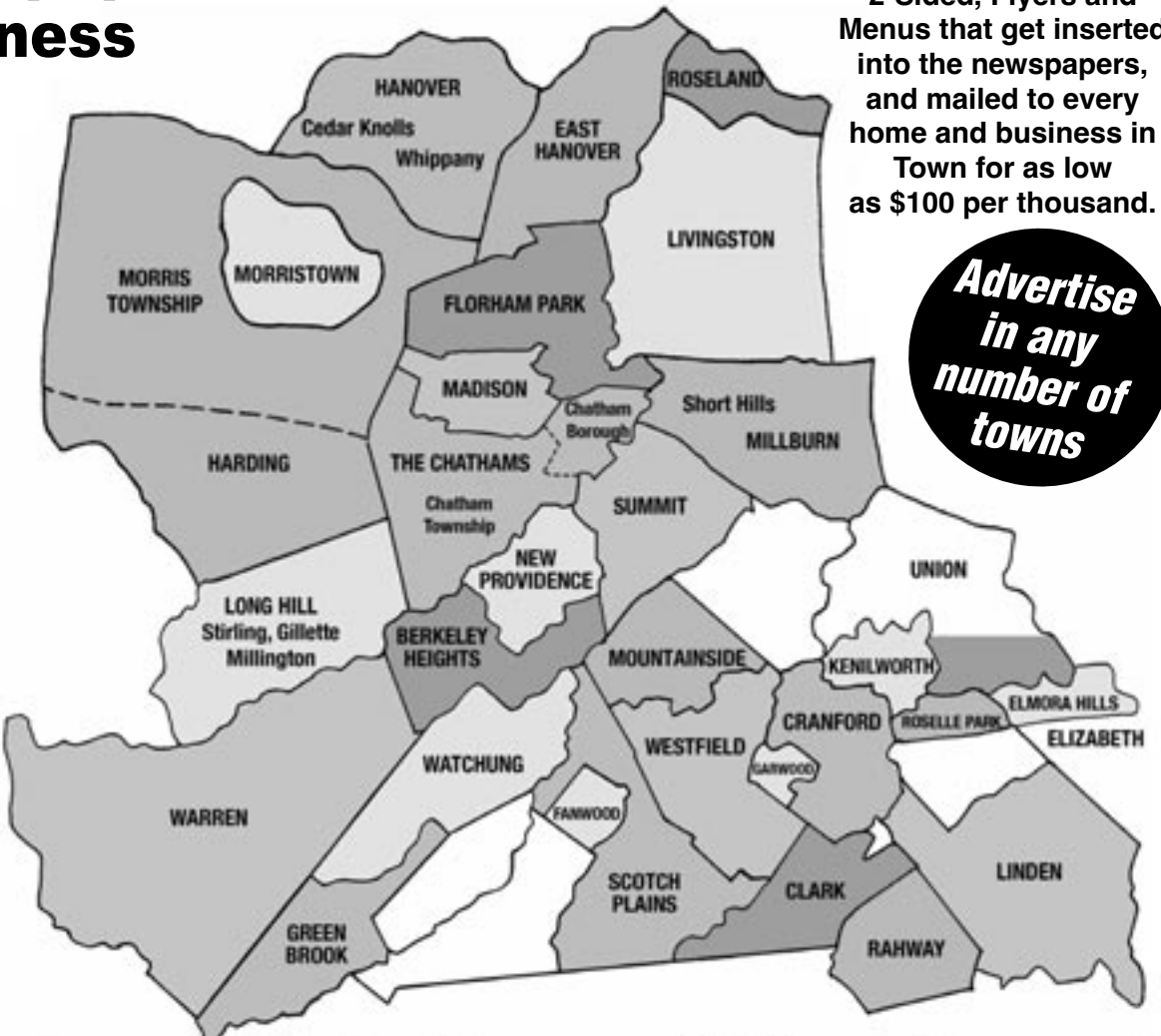

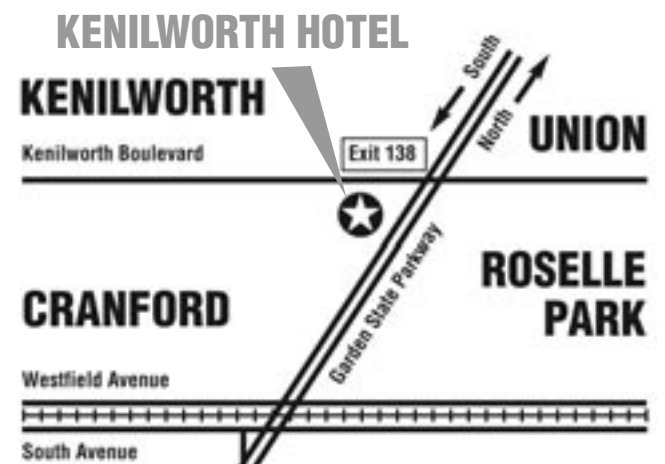
