## FIRST ANNUAL YOUTH DAY OF SERVICE - APRIL 26

The Grove Project will host its First Annual Youth Day of Service on Sunday, April 26, 2026, bringing together children, teens, and adults from across the community for a town-wide morning of meaningful volunteerism in honor of National Youth Service Day.

This inaugural event - the first of its kind in the area - is expected to engage 500 volunteers, generating donations and service projects that will impact nearly 2,000 local individuals and families in need. The Day of Service is co-created by The Grove Project founders, Katie Hearn and Tricia Jessen, and their High School Leadership Council, a selected group of students committed to deepening their service and civic engagement through a year-long leadership program. The event serves as the Council's signature initiative, reflecting months of collaboration, nonprofit partnership-building, and project development.

### PARTICIPANTS WILL TAKE PART IN FOUR DISTINCT SERVICE INITIATIVES SUPPORTING:

- **Food Insecurity - Benefiting Nourish.NJ**  
Volunteers will pack up to 400 nutrient-dense, shelf-stable meal kits using a recipe developed by the High School Leadership Council. The meals will go directly to families served by Nourish.NJ in Morristown and Dover.
- **Homelessness - Benefiting Help4All**  
Youth volunteers will assemble "gap bags" for individuals experiencing homelessness - particularly "rough sleepers" living unsheltered. These kits will include essential snacks and toiletry items such as deodorant, body wipes.

### • Grief Support - Benefiting Good Grief

Volunteers will assemble up to 400 meaningful craft kits to be used at Good Grief's annual 5K event, helping families honor loved ones who have passed away.

### • Animal Welfare

#### - Benefiting The Seeing Eye and St. Hubert's

Participants will create dog toys and assemble essential supply kits to support volunteer puppy raisers for The Seeing Eye. The project will also include an interactive awareness component to help participants better understand the experience of visual impairment.

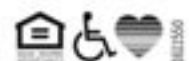

# NJ FESTIVAL ORCHESTRA TO PERFORM ONE THOUSAND AND ONE NIGHTS

The New Jersey Festival Orchestra brings its season to a close with One Thousand and One Nights, an evening shaped by storytelling, imagination, and the vivid orchestral palette of two beloved works. Performances will take place on Saturday, May 30, at 7:00 pm at The Presbyterian Church in Westfield, and Sunday, May 31, at 2:30 pm at the Sieminski Theater in Basking Ridge.

The program pairs the elegance of Joaquín

Rodrigo with the sweeping narrative of Nikolai Rimsky-Korsakov, inviting audiences into a world where music and myth intertwine. At its center is internationally acclaimed Slovak guitarist Karol Samuelčík, whose appearance is presented in collaboration with the Slovak American Cultural Center.

Samuelčík takes the stage in Rodrigo's *Fantasia para un gentilhombre*, a work that draws from Spanish baroque dances and unfolds

with graceful lyricism and rhythmic vitality. The guitar's voice, at once intimate and radiant, moves fluidly between courtly refinement and expressive brilliance.

A seasoned international performer, Samuelčík has appeared across Europe, Asia, and the Americas, with engagements at venues including London's Purcell Room and Shenzhen Concert Hall. A prizewinner of numerous competitions and a professor at the Academy of Music and Performing Arts in Bratislava, he is equally recognized for his scholarship, including a landmark publication on guitar technique in 2022.

The program culminates in Rimsky-Korsakov's *Scheherazade*, a work long associated with the fantastical tales of *One Thousand and One Nights*. Though the composer ultimately removed explicit programmatic titles, the music retains its narrative spirit; waves swell and recede, melodies shimmer and twist, and the orchestra becomes a storyteller in its own right. Echoes of distant voyages, whispered secrets, and unfolding drama emerge through richly layered textures and luminous orchestration.

Together, these works form a fitting close to the season: a journey that moves from the refined intimacy of the guitar to the expansive storytelling power of the full orchestra.

Repair Cafe returns to Madison 4/25/2026! Get your valued items back in working order and out of the landfill. Volunteer repair experts will be helping you to fix your household items for free at Grace Church in Madison (4 Madison Ave.), from 11 a.m. until 3 p.m. All types of items can be brought in: lamps, bicycles, clothing and other fabric items, phones and computers, small appliances, wooden things, watches needing batteries, jewelry, toys, knives in need of sharpening, and many other kinds of repairs. As a bonus, you will get to meet your neighbors from Madison and surrounding towns!

The Repair Cafe is central to Rotary International's focus on protecting the environment, and furthers our club's mission of partnering with other organizations to keep Madison one of the "Best Places to Live in New Jersey." This event is also an important part of Grace's outreach program.

Whether you are an expert repairer with your own tools, or someone who wants to help out on logistics and organization, we would love to have you! There is no age requirement. 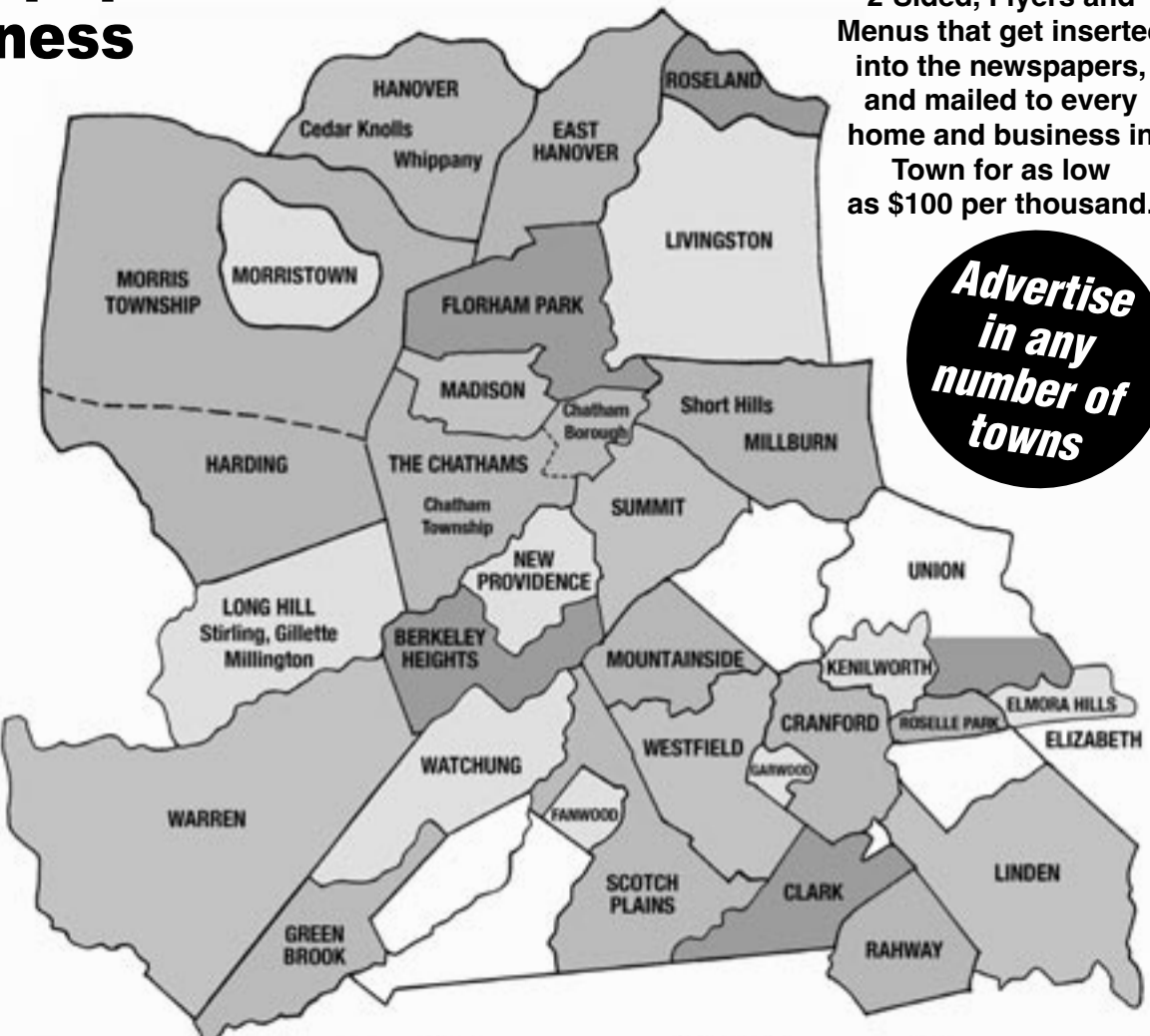

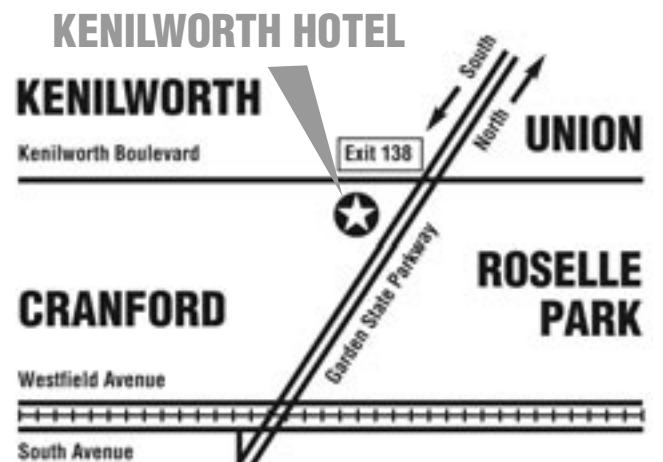
