### NJ Sharing Network

This past Mother's Day carried extraordinary meaning for the Prestinari family of Clark, as they celebrate a powerful gift that goes far beyond flowers or cards.

On November 5, Kathleen "Kathy" Prestinari underwent a successful kidney transplant, with her daughter, Kaitlyn Prestinari, serving as her living kidney donor. The Tuesday before Mother's Day marked the six-month milestone since the surgery. In the quiet moments since the transplant, it's the simple things that mean the most for the Prestinari family — sharing meals together and enjoying time that once felt uncertain.

"This Mother's Day definitely feels a lot different," said Kathy. "It's about life, family, and second chances. I get to celebrate because of my daughter."

Kathy, a dedicated nurse who has spent her life caring for others, suddenly found herself on the other side of care in 2024. As her kidney disease progressed, her health declined, bringing physical and emotional challenges for the entire family. Despite exploring multiple donor options, none were viable—an all-too-common reality for patients who can spend years waiting for a match.

Witnessing her mother's health decline, Kaitlyn felt compelled to act.

"My mom is the backbone of my family," said Kaitlyn. "Seeing her like that, I knew I needed to step up—for her, for my dad, and for my three siblings. We need her with us for as long as possible."

Since the transplant, the Prestinari family has experienced a renewed sense of gratitude and closeness. What began as a frightening and uncertain journey has become one defined by resilience, generosity, and hope.

"For a parent, there are no words to fully express what it feels like to receive a gift like this from your child," said Kathy. "As a mother, you spend your life protecting them. To see Kaitlyn step forward with such strength and love—it's overwhelming in the most beautiful

way. She gave me more time, more memories, and more moments with my family. That is everything."

Reflecting on her experience, Kaitlyn hopes their story inspires others to support the lifesaving mission of NJ Sharing Network.

"There are so many people out there waiting for an organ transplant and hoping for a second chance," said Kaitlyn. "Becoming an organ donor means giving someone that chance—a chance to live, to love, and to share more time with the people who matter most."

This Mother's Day, the Prestinari family is sharing their story to raise awareness about the urgent need for both living donors and registered organ and tissue donors. The community has already rallied around the family throughout their journey. In November, Kaitlyn's employer, Robert Half, hosted a fundraiser and raised more than \$4,000 for the Sharing Network Foundation.

According to the United Network for Organ Sharing (UNOS) and NJ Sharing Network, more than 100,000 Americans — including nearly 4,000 New Jerseyans — are currently waiting for a lifesaving organ transplant. To learn more about living kidney donation and deceased organ and tissue donation,

## ELKS WELCOME VETERANS TO THEIR NEW HOMES

### Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks

Formerly homeless veterans who are transitioning from temporary housing... A veteran who was in a nursing home for six years... A disabled veteran escaping domestic violence... In addition to honorably serving our country, they all have something else in common. Each is moving into a new apartment with little more than a few personal belongings.

This is when the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks steps up to help - turning empty rooms into a home.

Recently, members of the NJ State Elks East Central District, with lodges in Stirling, Summit, Springfield, Mountainside, Union, Cranford, and Rahway, have delivered four Veteran Welcome Home Kits, transforming bare apartments into comfortable living spaces. Each kit includes a full-sized bed, couch, end tables, coffee table, dining table and chairs, dresser, nightstands, microwave oven, toaster, coffee maker, lamps, towels, cleaning supplies, kitchenware, and more. Within two hours, the furniture is assembled, the kitchen cabinets are filled, and the apartment is fully set up and ready for its new resident to move in.

Each Veteran Welcome Home Kit costs approximately \$1,800 and is purchased through fundraising events, donations, and grants from the Elks National Foundation. They are given to the veteran free of charge.

Nationwide, an estimated 40,000 veterans experience homelessness on any given night. In partnership with the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, the Elks National Veterans Service Commission has pledged to help end veteran homelessness by ensuring veterans have access to safe, stable housing.

Here in New Jersey, dozens of Veteran Welcome Home Kits have been delivered since the beginning of the year. And year round, Elks volunteers provide direct services to more than 1,000 veterans at VA facilities across the state and continue to connect with veterans and active military members in their local communities, offering assistance wherever it is needed.

# PICKLEBALL IS BOOMING...SO ARE PICKLEBALL INJURIES!

## How to stay in the game and off the sideline

A few decades ago, it was running.

Then came boot camps, HIIT classes, and CrossFit.

Now? Pickleball courts are popping up everywhere, including right here in Cranford, Clark, and Westfield, and I couldn't be happier about it. Anything that gets people moving is a good thing.

But as someone who has been in the fitness industry for over two decades, I'm also seeing the other side of the story—and so are physical therapists across the country.

A lot of adults are getting hurt. Not because the activity is dangerous, but because their bodies simply weren't prepared for what they were asking them to do.

Tight hips. Weak muscles. Poor balance. Limited mobility. Loss of power and quickness. Stiff joints and aching backs. Sound familiar?

### THE REAL PROBLEM

Here's what most people don't realize: being fit isn't just about being active. It's about being prepared for activities.

There's a gap, sometimes a significant one, between what we ask our bodies to do and what they're actually capable of handling. And as we get older, that gap tends to widen.

Not because aging is a death sentence for fitness and recreation, but because most of us aren't doing the specific work required to maintain the strength, mobility, and balance our bodies need to participate in them.

The research backs this up. According to the American College of Sports Medicine, adults begin losing muscle mass at a rate of 3–5% per decade after age 30, a process called sarcopenia. Without deliberate, structured strength training, that loss accelerates. And with it goes metabolism, stability, bone density, and the ability to do the things we love.

"Just doing aerobic exercise is not adequate," says Dr. Robert Schreiber of Harvard Medical School. "Unless you are doing strength training, you will become weaker and less functional."

That's not meant to scare you. It's meant to inform you.

### IT'S NOT JUST ABOUT THE PAIN

Let me tell you what I hear most from people who have been sidelined by an injury. Yes, they talk about the pain. The aching shoulder, the pulled hamstring, the bad knee. But what really gets to them? Missing their people.

Pickleball, in particular, has become as much a social phenomenon as a fitness one. The courts are buzzing with groups of friends who show up several times a week, not just for the game, but for the laughs, the competition, the coffee after, the sense of community.

When you're injured, you don't just lose the sport. You lose all of that. And nobody wants to be the one sitting on the sideline watching their friends play while they nurse a knee or a rotator cuff. That's FOMO with a side of physical therapy bills.

The same is true for golfers who can't finish 18 holes because their back gives out on the back nine. For tennis players who have to sit out a season with tennis elbow. For cyclists whose tight hips and weak glutes turn a weekend ride into a painful ordeal. For hikers who cut trips short because their knees can't handle the downhill.

In every case, the injury didn't just cost them the activity. It cost them the experience, the friendships, and the sense of vitality and connection that comes with being active alongside people you enjoy.

The good news? Most of these injuries are preventable. But you have to be proactive.

### WHAT YOUR BODY ACTUALLY NEEDS

If you want to stay active, feel strong, and avoid the injuries that sideline so many people in their 40s, 50s, and beyond, here's what to focus on:

**Strength.** Muscle is your body's armor. It protects your joints, supports your bones, and keeps your metabolism running efficiently. Two to three strength training sessions per week can make a dramatic difference, whether you're swinging a golf club, returning a tennis serve, or reaching for a pickleball overhead.

**Mobility and flexibility.** Tight hips and stiff joints don't just cause pain; they change the way you move, putting stress on areas that weren't designed to handle it. The rotation required in golf and tennis, the lateral movement in pickleball, and the hip flexion in cycling, all of them demand a body that can actually move freely.



**Balance and agility.** Falls are one of the leading causes of injury in adults over 50. Balance training isn't just for the elderly; it's for anyone who wants to stay quick, coordinated, and confident on their feet. On a pickleball court. On a hiking trail. On a bike.

**Power and quickness.** These are the first things to go as we age, and the least talked about. Power training, the ability to move fast, even in small doses, helps your body react faster, change direction more safely, and perform better in the sports and activities you love.

**Joint-friendly conditioning.** Not all cardio is created equal. High-impact exercise has its place, but smart conditioning means choosing methods that strengthen your heart without beating up your body, especially if you're already logging miles on the court, course, or trail.

### THE SOCIAL SIDE OF STAYING FIT

Here's something the fitness industry doesn't talk about enough (but we do): community is one of the most powerful motivators there is.

We see it every day at Active Life Fitness. Members who show up not just because they want to get stronger, but because they genuinely enjoy being there. They encourage each other, celebrate each other's wins, and hold each other accountable in the best possible way.

It's the same reason pickleball has exploded. People aren't just showing up for the sport. They're showing up for each other. 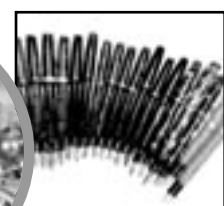

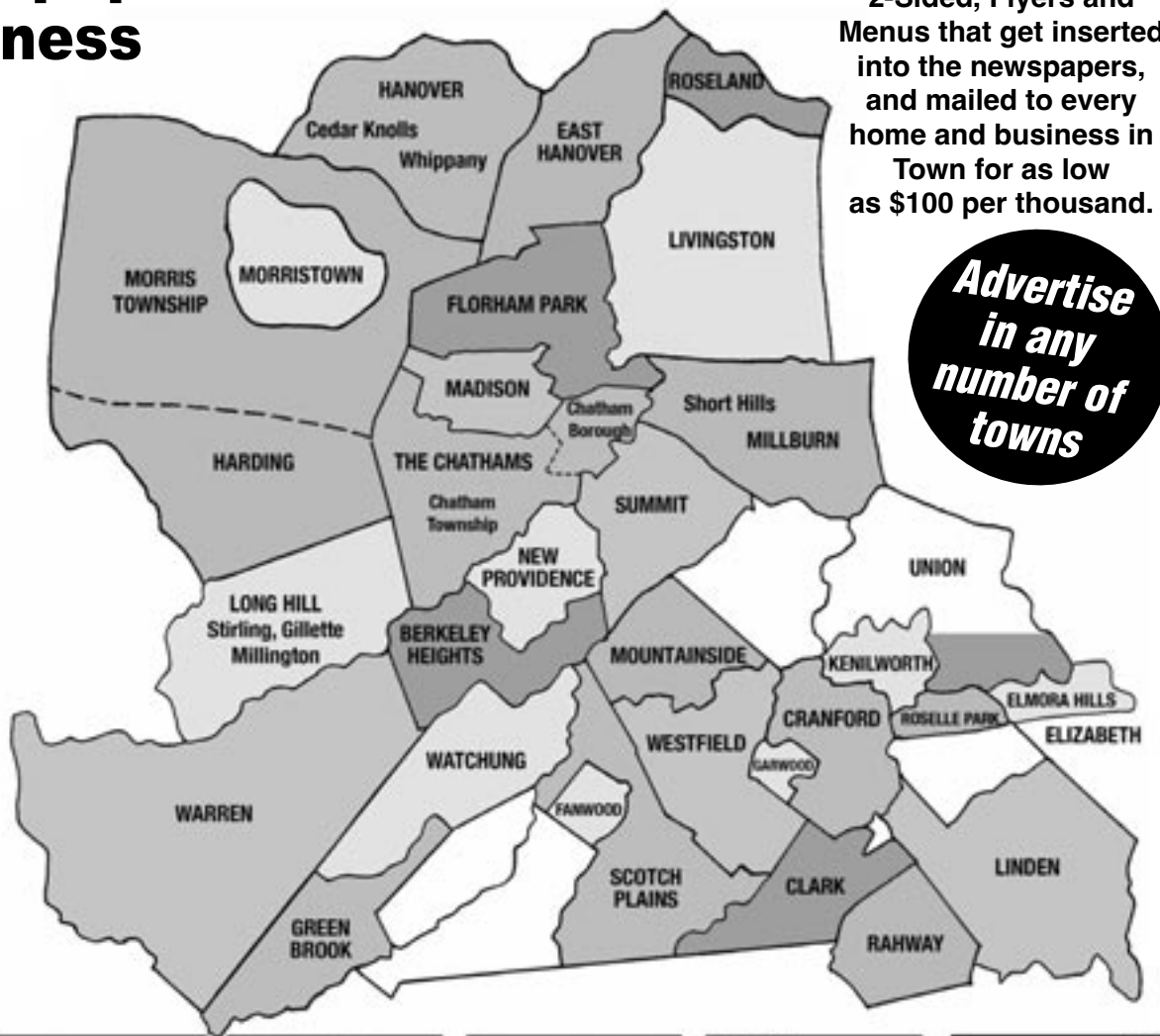

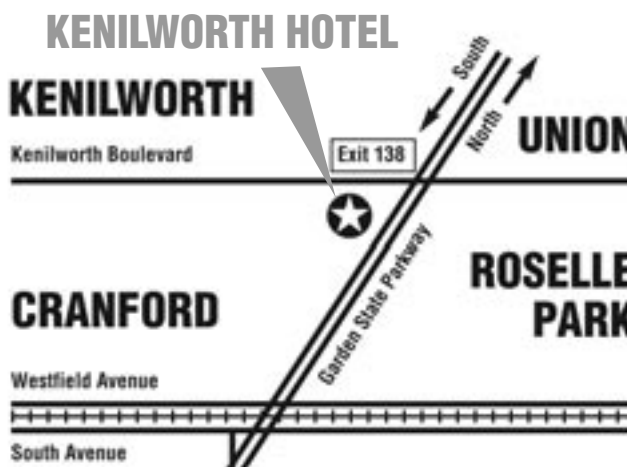
