Elmora School No. 12 recently hosted an AVID Showcase welcoming over 35 educators from across New Jersey, including representatives from EPS schools, to observe the school’s schoolwide implementation of the AVID system.

The event began with a warm welcome from student ambassadors, who escorted guests to the Music Room for a meet-and-greet session. Presenters included Cianna Debills, AVID Northeastern Implementation Strategist; Aimee Saluccio, EPS AVID Coordinator and College and Career Readiness Advisor; Principal Melissa Kulick; Vice Principal Marisa Meirinho; AVID Coordinator Jennifer DeFilippis; and School Guidance Counselor Kristina Pedulla. The team delivered a comprehensive presentation highlighting School 12’s AVID journey, which began in 2013, and emphasized the development of a strong college-going culture.

Following the presentation, the School 12 chorus performed the school song, “Through the Halls of Elmora,” under the direction of chorus teacher Ms. Sara Edreira-Fidalgo. Guests also experienced student performances as part of the Women’s History Month Living Museum, showcasing students’ research, creativity, and presentation skills, which embed all aspects of WCOR strategies.

Student ambassadors then guided visitors through classrooms from kindergarten through eighth grade. Guests observed teachers and students actively engaged in AVID’s WICOR strategies (Writing, Inquiry, Collaboration, Organization, and Reading). Classroom highlights included



philosophical chairs, Socratic seminars, collaborative study groups, and team-building activities, all demonstrating high levels of student engagement and critical thinking.

Visitors expressed admiration for the students’ focus, effective note-taking strategies, and their ability to clearly articulate their thinking during discussions such as philosophical chairs and Socratic seminars.

Elmora School no. 12 takes pride in ensuring all of their students receive an excellent education that is preparing them for high school, college and career readiness.

CAMINO DE ST. JOSEPH WINDS ITS WAY TO ELIZABETH

St. Joseph Social Service Center proudly hosted its inaugural Camino de St. Joseph on Saturday, April 18, 2026, drawing over 160 participants from across Union County and beyond in a powerful show of unity, faith, and support for our neighbors.

Held on the 40th anniversary of the soup kitchen program, the event offered participants a meaningful opportunity to walk in solidarity while raising awareness of the Center's mission. St. Joseph Social Service Center brings people and communities together to serve our neighbors by providing food, health programs, and support services with love, dignity, and compassion.

The day began with a 9 a.m. Mass at the Parish Community of St. Helen in Westfield, NJ, where participants gathered in reflection and fellowship before embarking on the journey. St. Helen's parishioners cooked and served the first soup kitchen meals on April 19, 1986. A meal has been served every Saturday since then.

Following Mass, attendees walked 3 miles to St. John the Apostle Church in Linden, where 4 generations of the Ruggieri family have coordinated the soup kitchen ministry.

After a brief rest, the group walked 3 miles to Warinanco Park in Roselle, and then 3 miles to St. Joseph's in Elizabeth. Additional participants joined at St. John's and Warinanco Park.

Volunteers from the many parishes that help with the soup kitchen and sandwich programs warmly welcomed the walkers and offered

snacks, water, rest and hospitality. The event concluded with a community lunch at St. Joseph's and a celebration of accomplishment and shared purpose among all who participated.

Police from Westfield, Clark, Linden, Roselle, Elizabeth, and the County of Union ensured the safety of participants along the route. Motorcycle and support police from the cities of Linden and Elizabeth provided a secure and well-coordinated escort throughout the day.

The success of the Camino de St. Joseph was made possible through the Camino planning committee. Chaired by Brendan Maher of Westfield, the committee included volunteers from many church partners, along with St. Joseph's staff. Volunteers from the following helped with planning and throughout the day: Holy Trinity and St. Helen's (Westfield), St. John's (Linden), Holy Spirit (Union), St. Agnes (Clark), Church of the Assumption (Roselle Park), St. Michael's (Cranford), Church of the Little Flower (Berkeley Heights), and Immaculate Conception (Elizabeth). County Commissioner Chairman Joseph Bodek joined the opening mass, and Commissioners Lourdes Leon and Joseph Bodek presented a resolution at the lunch.

"This event reflects the strength and compassion of our community," said Bernadette Murphy, Executive Director of St. Joseph's. "Together, we walked not only in faith, but in solidarity with those we serve every day. We are

grateful to all who prayed, walked, volunteered, and donated food and funds."

The West Fields Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution (SAR) dedicated the first chapter Liberty Tree in a ceremony held on Earth Day, April 22, 2026, at Liberty Hall.

In attendance were the NJSSAR Color Guard, along with City of Elizabeth Mayor J. Christian Bollwage, Union Township Mayor Patricia Guerra-Frazier, and Liberty Hall personal Executive Director Rachel Goldberg, Curator of Archives Kayla Doyle, and Director of Grounds Megan Couch.

Liberty Hall is Governor William Livingston's house in Union. He was the first Governor of New Jersey. The chapter has been in contact with many towns to plant Liberty Trees for the 250th birthday of America. The original Liberty Tree was in Boston, MA. The Sons of Liberty would meet under it, when the British found out, they cut the Liberty Tree down.

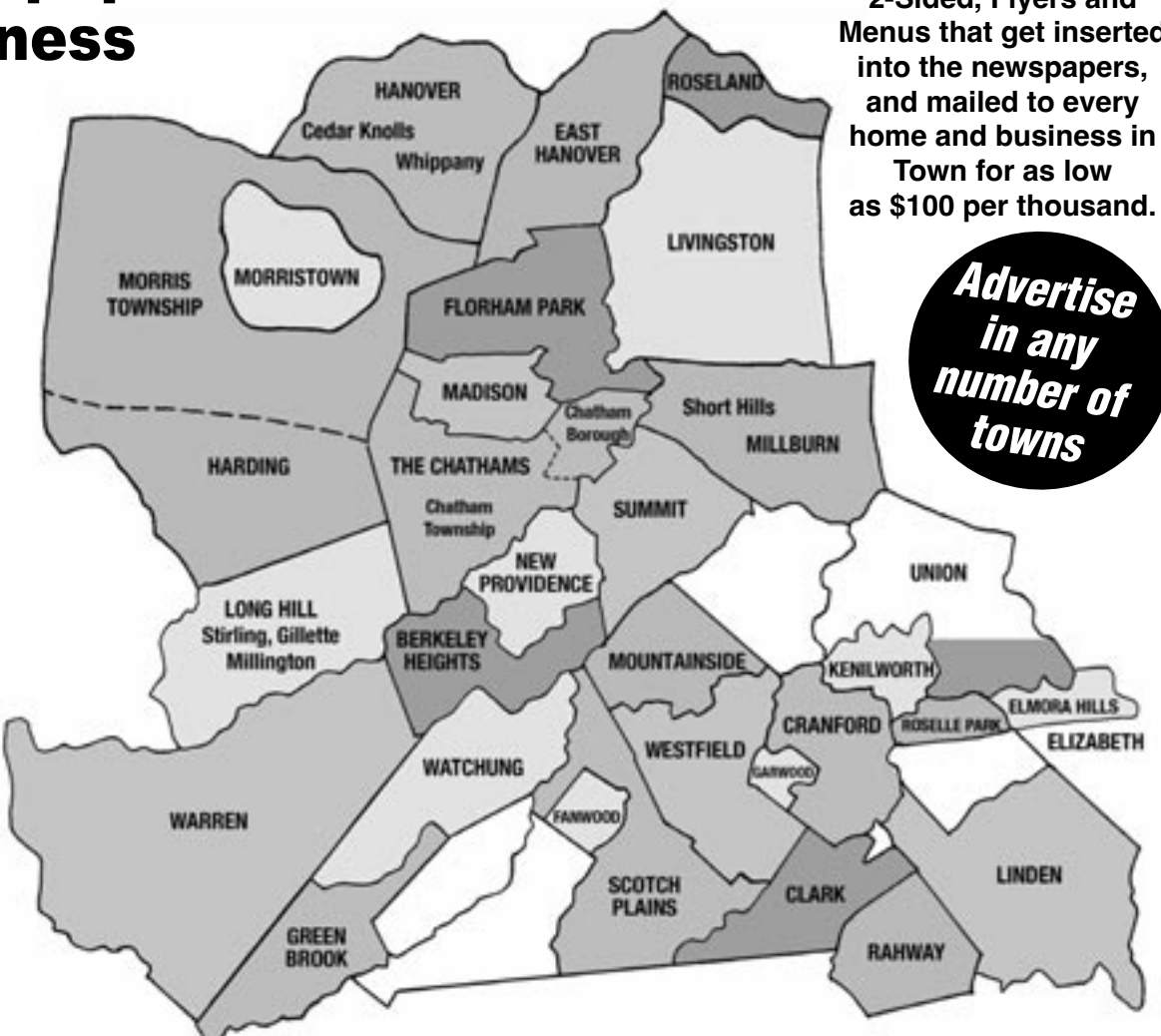

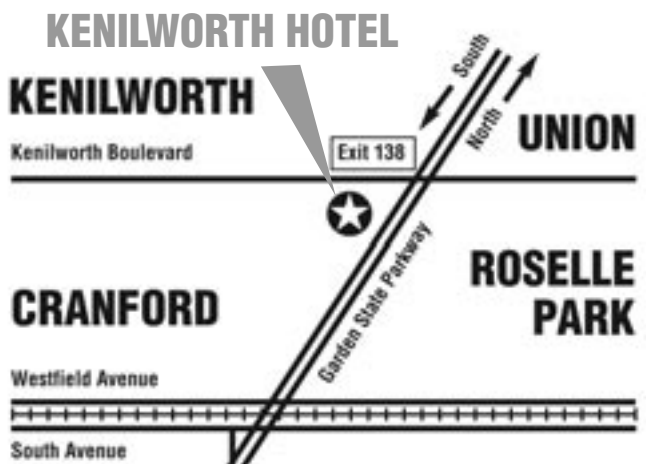
