HISTORY COMES ALIVE: AT WASHINGTON ROCK PARK

This June, the echoes of the American Revolution will return to the heights of the Watchung Mountains. On Saturday, June 6, 2026, Washington Rock Park will host a grand "250th Celebration" inviting the community to step back into 1776 for a day of patriotic festivities, living history, and family fun.

The event, which runs from 11:00 AM to 4:00 PM, marks a quarter-millennium of American independence at one of the most strategic vantage points of the Revolutionary War.

A LEGACY ETCHED IN STONE

Washington Rock is not merely a scenic overlook; it was a vital "eye in the sky" for the Continental Army. In June 1777, General George Washington used this 30-acre site to monitor the movements of British troops under Lord Howe.

From this rocky outcrop, Washington observed the British retreating from New Brunswick toward Perth Amboy. His ability to track enemy maneuvers from this height allowed him to protect his troops and prevent a potential British advance toward Philadelphia, earning the site its place in the annals of military strategy.

THE DAY'S FESTIVITIES

The 250th Celebration promises a sensory journey into the past. Highlights of the schedule include:

- **Living History:** The dedicated Outwater's Militia Brigade will perform drills surrounded by their encampment, complemented by the stirring sounds of the NJ Fifes and Drums.
- **The Commander-in-Chief:** A George Washington impersonator will be on-site to greet "troops" and citizens alike, culminating in a powerful recitation of the Declaration of Independence.
- **Colonial Medicine and Beacon Display:** Learn about the medical practices of the era by Frank Prevete and the signaling systems used during the war.
- **Colonial Youth Activities:** Children and young adults can try their hand at 18th-century life with quill pen writing, stencil making, self-made tin ornaments, and a hands-on colonial games display.

PLAN YOUR VISIT

While the history is old, the amenities are modern. Capital Craft will be stationed at the park, offering a range of food and beverages for purchase throughout the afternoon.

Whether you are a history buff, a family looking for a weekend outing, or a patriot at heart, the June 6 celebration offers a unique opportunity to stand where Washington stood and celebrate 250 years of the American spirit.

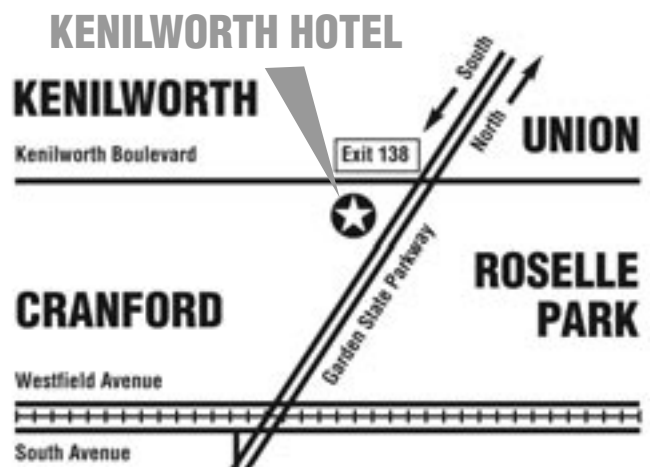

The New Jersey Festival Orchestra closes its season with One Thousand and One Nights, an evening inspired by the legendary Arabian tales that gave rise to Rimsky-Korsakov’s beloved orchestral masterpiece Scheherazade. Presented in collaboration with the Slovak-American Cultural Center (S-ACC), the program blends storytelling, international artistry, and symphonic color in performances on Saturday, May 30 at 7:00 pm at The Presbyterian Church in Westfield and Sunday, May 31 at 2:30 pm at the Sieminski Theater in Basking Ridge.

At the center of the program is Scheherazade, Rimsky-Korsakov’s vivid musical interpretation of the timeless stories told by Scheherazade night after night to save her life. Presented through NJFO’s collaboration with the Slovak-American Cultural Center, Samuelčík brings warmth and virtuosity to Rodrigo’s celebrated work inspired by 17th-century Spanish music and dance traditions.

“The Slovak-American Cultural Center is thrilled to partner—again—with the NJFO to introduce world-renowned guitarist Karol Samuelčík to American audiences,” writes S-ACC Board Member and longtime NJFO supporter Tanya Pulver. “Performing Joaquín Rodrigo’s celebrated *Fantasia para un gentilhombre*, Samuelčík promises to enchant listeners, pairing the concerto’s historic elegance with his signature vibrant energy and technical brilliance.”

“What I love about the piece is its elegance, colour, and contrast,” Samuelčík says. “The guitar creates a dialogue with the orchestra.”

Together, these works create an evening shaped by imagination and storytelling, where music becomes the narrator and the orchestra brings centuries-old legends to life.

C.A.R. PROJECT SUPPORTS EQUINE THERAPY FOR VETS

The Children of the American Revolution (C.A.R.) is the nation's oldest and largest nonpolitical patriotic youth organization. A new C.A.R. state project that will aid veterans has been announced. The goal of "Operation Horse" is to raise \$2,000 during the next year to fund equine-assisted therapy for two N.J. veterans with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD). The therapy is offered through the Man o' War Project of Columbia University Irving Medical Center.

The mission of the Man o' War Project is two-fold. Equine-assisted therapy is used to treat veterans with PTSD while medical staff evaluate the program to develop best practices for administering equine-assisted therapy. This research can have far-reaching benefits for treating veterans and all who suffer with PTSD.

C.A.R. membership is open to girls and boys from birth through age 21 who are descended from a person who aided the cause of independence during the American Revolution.

New Jersey has nine C.A.R. groups known as societies. Activities offered on an age-appropriate basis help members learn about American history, government, community service and more. Members also gain valuable leadership experience conducting meetings and serving as delegates at state and national conferences.

STUDENTS DONATE TO HELP ARMED SERVICES

Somerset County Vocational and Technical High School (SCVTHS) students continued their tradition of supporting members of the Armed Services by sending care packages to bases overseas and helping wounded veterans here at home.

The efforts were spearheaded by SCVTHS students Deeksha Chaganur, Jacob Berman, and Aashritha Kancharlapalli, all members of instructor Ed Graf's History classes.

The three students led a drive to collect a variety of supplies that are hard to come by for many military personnel stationed in different parts of the world, particularly the Middle East. Among the items collected were toothpaste, toothbrushes, foot powder, Q-tips, and bars of soap. Students also gathered snack items such as candy, granola bars, and energy drink mixes. In total, fourteen boxes of goods were collected. These will be shipped overseas to various military units, where they will be unpacked and distributed to service personnel. Also included in the boxes were letters written by students thanking the soldiers for their service and letting them know that people "at

home" are thinking of them.

On the home front, the three students also organized an effort to collect equipment that will help make life easier for wounded veterans.

Deeksha, Jacob, and Aashritha, working in conjunction with the American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars, and The New Jersey Veterans Network, rallied the school and local community and collected 4 wheel chairs, 12 walkers, and other devices. This equipment will help veterans of recent armed conflicts, such as the War on Terror, who incurred spinal injuries as a result of their service. The items will be distributed to military service patients at the Lyons VA Medical Center.

The collections not only help veterans and troops overseas, but also provide lessons for the students. Through interaction with service members, history and current events are brought to life in the classroom. Additionally, students learn the value of helping others, showing appreciation, and supporting those who serve our nation.

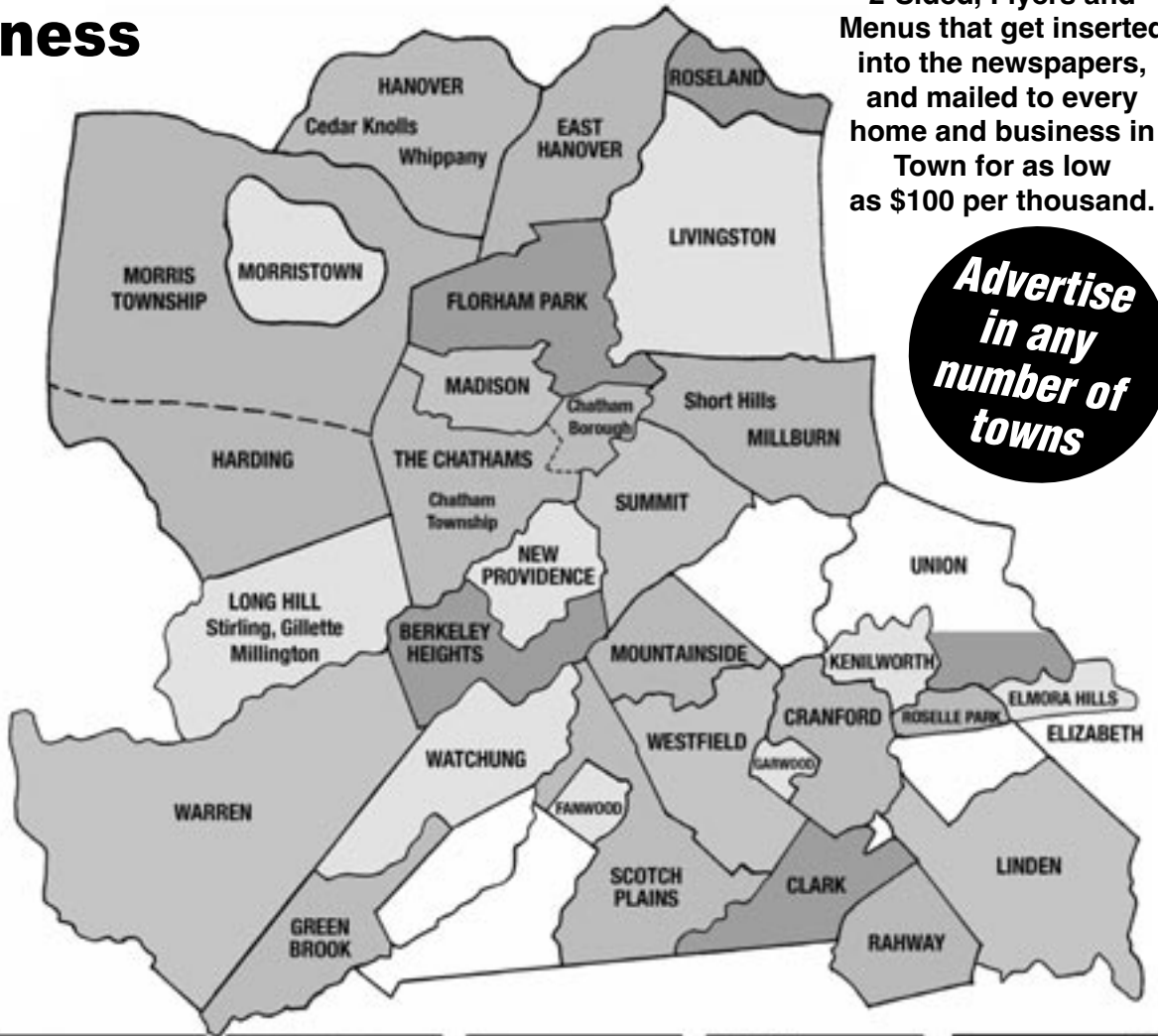
