BROWNIE TROOP UNVEILS NEW ORIENTEERING COURSE

Long Hill Twp Girl Scouts

Long Hill Township Girl Scout Brownie Troop 98635 celebrated months of learning, teamwork, and outdoor exploration during a ribbon-cutting ceremony on May 5 unveiling a newly created orienteering course at Kantor Park.

Attendees at the ceremony included Councilwoman Fettes; Lisa Scanlon, Director of Long Hill Township Parks & Recreation; Bill Caldarola, Assistant Director of Long Hill Township Parks & Recreation; representatives from Girl Scouts of Northern New Jersey; Albie Ashbrook, Director of Long Hill Township Library; Jen Garsh, Troop Co-Leader; Kathyana Gomez, Troop Co-Leader; and the 13 Girl Scout members of Troop 98635 who include Margalit Chiodo, Hannah Rizzo, Anna Luna Gomez, Fiona Force, Brynn Dookwah, Julia Conlon, Julianna Carlo, Mikaela Seely, Catrina White, Elisa Steege, Gabriella Sessanta, Aisling Mahoney, and Scarlett Ronaldson.

The course was created as part of the troop's Outdoor Brownie Journey project. Participants use a map and compass to locate 15 markers placed throughout the park. The course takes approximately 30 minutes to complete and is designed to encourage families to get outside, learn new skills, and experience the park in a new way. In addition to being educational, the course promotes confidence, problem-solving, and a love of the outdoors.

Two special contributions helped make the project

possible. The course signage was designed by troop parent Megan Bailey, who donated her time and talent to the project. In addition, the structure holding the signage was originally built by Long Hill Township Boy Scouts. Brownie Troop 98635 restored and repurposed the structure to serve as the foundation for the new orienteering course.

Printing for the signage was fully funded by the troop using proceeds earned through the Girl Scout Cookie Program and Fall Product Sales. In the spirit of giving back, the troop chose to reinvest those earnings into a project benefiting the local community.

The Long Hill Township Library partnered with the troop to make the course accessible to all community members. The troop assembled orienteering kits — including a compass and instructions — that are available for checkout through the library. The library's close proximity to the course makes participation convenient and accessible for families and residents.

Troop 98635 expressed gratitude to the Township of Long Hill, the Parks & Recreation Department, the Long Hill Township Library, and Girl Scouts of Northern New Jersey for their support of the project.

The troop hopes the same joy and sense of accomplishment they experienced while creating the course will be shared by all who explore this new outdoor activity at Kantor Park.

TRANSACTION CONFERENCE HAS STIRLING ROOTS

Frank Reilly of Stirling was the founder and chairman of the NJ Transportation Conference for 40 years and co-chairman for 10 years. He was honored at their keynote luncheon on April 15 where he gave an ad-libbed and heartfelt 20-minute talk to the 1,419 attendees about the turbulent early years and how it has developed. It brought many to tears twice, and four times to roaring laughter. He confessed for the first time that his many trail blazing accomplishments were performed without having a college degree, just with street smarts! He was also featured in a 20-minute YouTube video at the conference.

The first conference was held in 1976. It had 30 attendees, and 3 tables for exhibits, of which Frank had two. Each year his wife, Debbie, and some volunteers, did the promotion via US Mail until recent years when it became computerized. This year they had 1,432 attendees coming from 34 states, 6 Canadian provinces, South Korea, and the United Kingdom. The expo hall at Harrah's in Atlantic City housed 130 exhibitors and 12 buses! During the first year there were only 5 sessions during the one-day event, this year there were 110 sessions over three days each with a moderator and three presenters.

Frank was truly proud of the success of the event, which is now the largest state transportation conference in America. Although

Frank retired in 2004 as the Executive Director of the Morris County Dept. of Transportation Management, he still remains very active with the NJ TransAction Conference and loves every minute of it.

SHE WAS A 48-YEAR-OLD MOM FROM BERKELEY HEIGHTS... TERRIFIED TO WEAR A LITTLE BLACK DRESS AT HER DAUGHTER'S WEDDING - UNTIL THIS HAPPENED

When guests gathered for a recent summer wedding in town, expectations were clear: a beautiful bride, proud parents, heartfelt speeches, and a lively dance floor.

What no one expected was that one of the most talked-about moments of the night would involve the bride's mother.

As Helen, 48, walked down the aisle in a fitted dress with a tastefully exposed back, heads turned. Conversations paused. By the time the reception was underway, it was clear this mother of the bride had made an impression few would forget.

ELKS WELCOME VETERANS TO THEIR NEW HOMES

Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks

Formerly homeless veterans who are transitioning from temporary housing... A veteran who was in a nursing home for six years... A disabled veteran escaping domestic violence... In addition to honorably serving our country, they all have something else in common. Each is moving into a new apartment with little more than a few personal belongings.

This is when the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks steps up to help - turning empty rooms into a home.

Recently, members of the NJ State Elks East Central District, with lodges in Stirling, Summit, Springfield, Mountainside, Union, Cranford, and Rahway, have delivered four Veteran Welcome Home Kits, transforming bare apartments into comfortable living spaces. Each kit includes a full-sized bed, couch, end tables, coffee table, dining table and chairs, dresser, nightstands, microwave oven, toaster, coffee maker, lamps, towels, cleaning supplies, kitchenware, and more. Within two hours, the furniture is assembled, the kitchen cabinets are filled, and the apartment is fully set

up and ready for its new resident to move in.

Each Veteran Welcome Home Kit costs approximately \$1,800 and is purchased through fundraising events, donations, and grants from the Elks National Foundation. They are given to the veteran free of charge.

Nationwide, an estimated 40,000 veterans experience homelessness on any given night. In partnership with the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, the Elks National Veterans Service Commission has pledged to help end veteran homelessness by ensuring veterans have access to safe, stable housing.

Here in New Jersey, dozens of Veteran Welcome Home Kits have been delivered since the beginning of the year. And year round, Elks volunteers provide direct services to more than 1,000 veterans at VA facilities across the state and continue to connect with veterans and active military members in their local communities, offering assistance wherever it is needed.
