ORCHESTRA PRESENTS ONE THOUSAND AND ONE NIGHTS CONCERT

The New Jersey Festival Orchestra closes its season with One Thousand and One Nights, an evening inspired by the legendary Arabian tales that gave rise to Rimsky-Korsakov's beloved orchestral masterpiece Scheherazade. Presented in collaboration with the Slovak-American Cultural Center (S-ACC), the program blends storytelling, international artistry, and symphonic color in performances on Saturday, May 30 at 7:00 pm at The Presbyterian Church in Westfield and Sunday, May 31 at 2:30 pm at the Sieminski Theater in Basking Ridge.

At the center of the program is Scheherazade, Rimsky-Korsakov's vivid musical interpretation of the timeless stories told by Scheherazade night after night to save her life. Sweeping melodies, shimmering orchestration, and dramatic contrasts immerse audiences in a world of myth and imagination, bringing the spirit of the legendary tales vividly to life.

"It is music that represents the rolling sea, the drama of adventure, and the allure of exotic romance," says NJFO Music Director David Wroe, describing the work as "an irresistible musical combination" that transports listeners into the world of One Thousand and One Nights.

The evening also features internationally acclaimed Slovak guitarist Karol Samuelčík performing Joaquín Rodrigo's *Fantasia para un gentilhombre*. Presented through NJFO's collaboration with the Slovak-American Cultural Center, Samuelčík brings warmth and virtuosity to Rodrigo's celebrated work inspired

by 17th-century Spanish music and dance traditions.

"The Slovak-American Cultural Center is thrilled to partner—again—with the NJFO to introduce world-renowned guitarist Karol Samuelčík to American audiences," writes S-ACC Board Member and longtime NJFO

supporter Tanya Pulver. "Performing Joaquín Rodrigo's celebrated *Fantasia para un gentilhombre*, Samuelčík promises to enchant listeners, pairing the concerto's historic elegance with his signature vibrant energy and technical brilliance."

"What I love about the piece is its elegance, colour, and contrast," Samuelčík says. "The guitar creates a dialogue with the orchestra."

Together, these works create an evening shaped by imagination and storytelling, where music becomes the narrator and the orchestra brings centuries-old legends to life.

MOUNT VERNON SCHOOL RESTORATION COMPLETED

County of Morris

Restoration of the historic Mount Vernon School, also known as the Red Brick Schoolhouse Museum in Chatham Township, has been completed following several years of preservation work supported by more than \$305,000 through the Morris County Historic Preservation Trust Fund.

Morris County Commissioner Director Stephen Shaw recently visited the circa 1860 landmark to present a Morris County Historic Preservation plaque to Chatham Township Mayor Jen Rowland and the Chatham Township Historical Society in recognition of the successful restoration project. The visit followed Morris County's annual Pathways of History weekend on May 2 and 3, when the museum welcomed visitors from across the region.

"Preserving our history is always a priority in Morris County, and this year it carries even greater significance as we celebrate America's 250th anniversary," said Director Shaw. "The Mount Vernon School is a wonderful example of the historic places we are proud to protect for future generations."

Originally constructed around 1860, the building later received a vestibule addition around 1900 and a rear addition in 1958. It served as a local school and Sunday school until 1928 before later housing community organizations and Chatham Township Hall. The building was eventually repurposed as a local history museum.

Since 2019, \$305,450 in Morris County historic preservation grants have supported a National Register nomination, a preservation plan, construction documents and extensive exterior restoration work.

The 2022 and 2023 grants supported repairs to deteriorated brick and mortar, reconstruction of the northwest vestibule corner, restoration of stone window lintels and sills, and installation of interior storm windows to help preserve the building.

"We're so grateful for all the support and all the funding. The Red Brick Schoolhouse is a beloved

site in town -- not only because it holds so much history for us and our residents -- but it is the destination for field trips for our students. This is a field trip that they remember and they continue to come back with their grandparents and parents," said Mayor Rowland.

"Morris County has been with us since the beginning of the process. From the preservation plan and National Register nomination to the construction documents and restoration work, we could not have completed this project without the county's support," said Martha Wells, president

of the Chatham Township Historical Society.

Since 2003, the Board of County Commissioners have approved more than \$56 million in Morris County Historic Preservation Trust Fund grants to help preserve and restore 136 historic sites across the county.

As part of the county's commemoration of America's 250th anniversary, the Chatham Township Historical Society (CTHS) also featured the RevolutionNJ "Revolutionary Lives" exhibit during Pathways of History weekend.

Explaining New Jersey's Many, Many Municipalities

Madison's Lincoln Portrait

At nine feet tall, this impressive portrait of the sixteenth president has been praised by those who knew him as more lifelike than any other.

Exhibited at the US Capitol, the 1876 Centennial Exposition in Philadelphia, and the Union League Club in New York, among other

important places, this portrait eventually found a home in the Hartley Dodge Memorial in Madison, NJ. Mallory will share her first-hand account of researching this painting and the stories she uncovered as she leads the audience through this painting's fascinating provenance.

This portrait is currently on loan to the Smithsonian's National Portrait Gallery.

This lecture will be given by Mallory Mortillaro. Mallory is an art historian and educator. She has a decade of teaching experience and has worked on various art research projects for museums and organizations in the New York metropolitan area. Her discoveries in the art world have garnered her international attention. She studied at Drew University. Mallory resides in New Jersey with her husband and daughter.

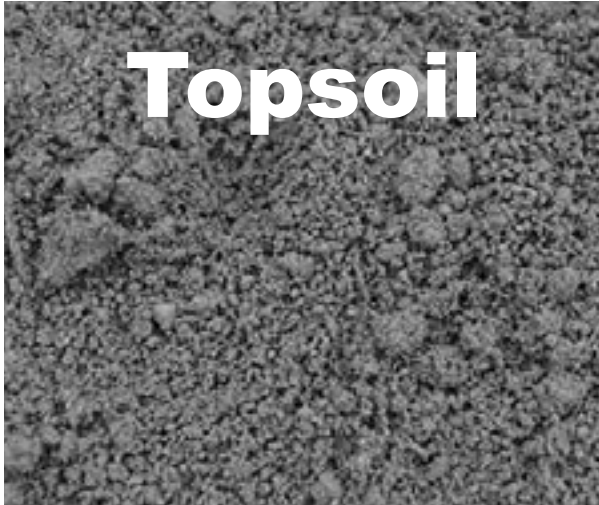

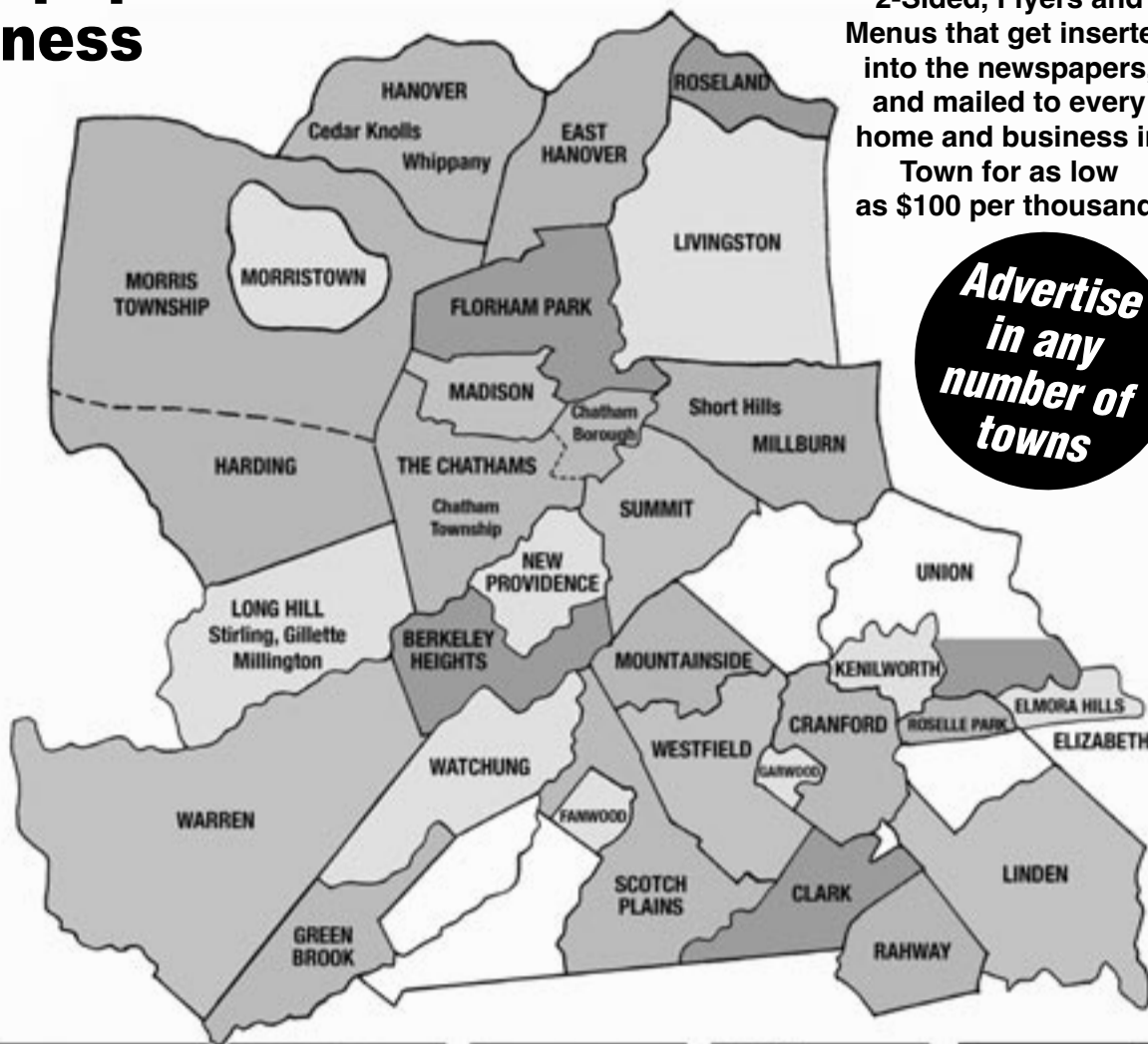

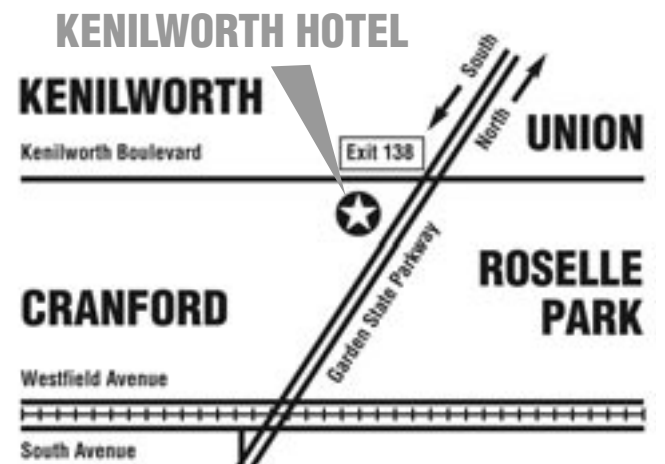
